6 signs that indicates you need to increase your zinc intake

Our body requires different kinds of minerals and vitamins in certain amounts to keep the internal function going. Bootlegger arrested, illicit liquor recovered

On search, 40 gm heroin was recovered from their possession. The accused were later identified as Rayees Ahmed Khan, son of Wazir Ahmed Khan, resident of Boniyar Tehsil Baramulla and Shahid Qayoom, son of Abdul Qayoom, resident of Trikanjan Baramulla. Duo was arrested and FIR No. 35/2022 under sections 8/21/22/25/29 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Gangyal.



Major crackdown on bovine smuggling, 203 cattle rescued, 12 smugglers arrested

RAMBAN: In a major crackdown against bovine smuggling, Ramban police on Sunday rescued 203 bovines, arrested 12 smugglers and seized 12 vehicles.

As per details, acting on a specific inputs of transportation of bovine animals, a party from Police Station Batote intercepted eight vehicles (JK02 AA 2410, JK03 D 7802, JK03 G 2564, JK02 AR 9187, JK03 B 3738, JK02 BU 6102, JK14 E 7911 & JK14 E 9073) and found 113 bovines laden in them, which were rescued. The drivers of the vehicles were arrested on spot and vehicles were seized. FIR Nos 46, 47, 48, 49, 50, 51, 52 & 53/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered in Police Station Batote.

In another incident, a party from Police Station Ramban intercepted four trucks (JK05 C 0939, JK02 AV 8887, JK18 A 1012 & JK02 A 1311) and found 90 bovines laden in them, which were rescued. The drivers of vehicles were arrested on spot, vehicles were seized and FIR Nos 95, 96, 97 & 98/2022 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered in Police Station Ramban. The overall rescue operation was carried out by police parties under command of Insp Sandeep Charak SHO Ramban and Insp Sudhir Sadotra SHO Batote, under supervision of Pardeep Singh Sen, DySP Hqrs Ramban with overall supervision of SSP Ramban, Mohita Sharma.

2 vehicles seized for illegal mining
