The officials said the work on the prestigious Zojila project on the Srinagar-Leh highway is about to reach the halfway mark.

Once completed, the Zojila project which consists of tunnels, roads, shafts, and bridges will have Asia's longest bi-directional tunnel.

The project is a unique infrastructure project which will provide year-long connectivity between Srinagar and Ladakh. "It also decreases the travel time between the two regions," the official said.

The officials said Zojila Project is being executed with engineering expertise and advanced New Austrian Tunnelling Method (NATM).

"MEIL has carried the works in sub-zero temperatures, especially at minus 40 degrees, in high altitude and hilly and hard rocky terrain. It is hard to execute all drilling and civil works in that hilly terrains which contain hard rock and heavy seepage," the official added.

MEIL's project in-charge Harpal Singh said, "We are doing the project with dedication, determination and hard work."

The Zojila project consists of a total of 18-km-long tunnels and 17-km-long road, three vertical shafts, four bridges, and other associated structures.

MEIL has deployed a total of 1,268 advanced and high-end technology machinery and equipment for the execution of the project with a 2000-strong workforce.

### Scindia inaugurates Indigo's...

Jitendra Singh, who represents Udhampur Lok Sabha seat in Jammu-Kashmir, praised Scindia for the expansion of civil aviation services in the country and Prime Minister Narendra Modi for Operation Ganga (under which stranded citizens were flown back from war-torn Ukraine).

Speaking on the occasion, Madhya Pradesh water resources minister Tulsiram Silawat said, after Scindia had taken over as civil aviation minister, the number of cities connected to Indore by air had increased from 12 to 23.

Silawat, who said 80 new flights had started from MP on the directives of Scindia, asked the latter to increase the frequency of the Indore-Dubai flight to three times from the current one per week.

He also sought air connectivity of Indore with countries like Singapore and Malaysia in order to promote international tourism.

Indore's B&J MP Shankar Lalwani was also present on the occasion.

The Indore-Jammu flight inaugurated during the day will operate four times a week, a statement from IndiGo said.

The flight will depart from Indore at 10.10 AM and land in Jammu at 12.05 PM on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Saturday, it said. The return flight will depart from Jammu at 12.35 PM and land in Indore at 2.45 PM on the aforementioned four days.

IndiGo representatives here handed over the first boarding pass to Scindia as a token of appreciation and later to a passenger Preeti Sharma, who said she was waiting for such a service for a long time in order to visit Vaishno Devi Temple.

### Four absconders arrested

JAMMU: Police on Monday detained four absconders who were evading arrest since long.

As per details, an information was received at Police Station Nagrota regarding an absconder namely Mohd Sharief, son of Ibrahim, resident of Panchari Tehsil and District Udhampur who was evading arrest since 14 years i.e., 2008 in FIR No 101/2008 registered under section 188 of RPC at Police Station Nagrota. On this, a team from Police Station Nagrota under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar led by SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Pratap Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, arrested the absconder. It is pertinent to mention that a warrant under section 512 CrPC was issued against him and finally the absconder shall be produced in JMJC Excise Court Jammu.

Similarly, information was received at Police Station Domana regarding two absconders namely Bodh Raj, son of Durga Dass, resident of Gho Manhasan Jammu and Mohinder Kumar, son of Jia Lal, resident of Jagti Nagrota who were evading their arrests in FIR No. 218/2000 registered under section 498A 325 of RPC and FIR No. 53/2001 under section 304 A of RPC respectively at Police Station Domana. On this, a team of Police Station Domana under the supervision of SDPO Domana Sunil Singh led by SHO Inspr Mahesh Sharma, after putting in strenuous efforts, arrested both the absconders, who will be produced before the Court for further legal proceedings.

Doda Police also arrested an absconder, who was wanted in a number of criminal cases and was evading arrest since long.

army in 2019 and 2020. These rifles, made in Italy and America, had replaced the ageing Russian Dragunov, the mainstay of Indian soldiers.

First procured in the 1990s, the Dragunovs have slowly fallen behind contemporary sniper rifles which offer improved sights and mounts, increased accuracy, and a strike range of over 1 kilometre.

The Sako TRG-42 sniper rifle is a bolt-action sniper rifle designed and developed by the Finnish gun maker SAKO.

The rifle is designed to fire powerful .338 Lapua Magnum-sized cartridges. Weighing at 6.55 kgs without ammunition, the sniper rifle has an effective range of 1,500 metres, the official said.

"It is considered one of the most accurate and trustworthy weapons worldwide, he said. The Army has sanctioned a team of 10 snipers, selected from the Indian Army's units and regimental centres for the job, the official added.

### Omar thanks Kerala...

Sayed in 1989. Rubaiya Sayeed, daughter of the then Union home minister Mufti Mohammad Sayeed, was kidnapped by JKLF terrorists on December 8, 1989.

Omar Abdullah, a former chief minister of the erstwhile Jammu and Kashmir state and Union minister in the Atal Bihari Vajpayee-led NDA government, tweeted a clip of a recent television interview of Khan, saying, "Kudos to the governor of Kerala."

"Arif Mohd Khan Sb sets the record straight about what happened in December 1989 during the B&J supported VP Singh government. Facts are facts even when they don't support the narrative sought to be created by the B&J and its ecosystem," he said in the tweet.

In the TV interview clip, Khan narrated the incidents of the day when he, along with former prime minister I K Gujral, who was the external affairs minister in the VP Singh government, had visited Abdullah's Gupkar Road residence.

"...to be fair to him (Farooq Abdullah), he was against the demand of the terrorists to release some terrorists who were in jail. I immediately told Mr Farooq Abdullah....I told him, 'Farooq Saheb, I stand by you and I will go to any extent to support you,'" Khan said in the interview.

He added that he was sidelined thereafter as the message from Delhi was to exert pressure to release the terrorists so that Rubaiya Sayeed's release could be secured.

Rubaiya Sayeed was released five days after being abducted with the government releasing five terrorists - Sheikh Abdul Hameed, Ghulam Nabi Butt, Noor Mohammed Kalwal, Mohammed Altaf and Mushtaq Ahmed Zargar.

### J&K adds 19...

recorded the highest number of fresh cases at 10, followed by two each in Jammu, Budgam and Baramulla districts. Thirteen of the 20 districts in the union territory did not report any fresh cases.

There are 146 active COVID-19 cases in Jammu and Kashmir. So far, 4,48,781 people have recovered from the viral disease, the officials said.

Meanwhile, two more Covid patients were cured and discharged in Ladakh that took the overall recoveries to 27,974, officials said.

No fresh Covid case was reported in the Union Territory. The infection tally stands at 28,218, they said. The Union Territory has recorded 228 Covid-related deaths -- 168 in Leh and 60 in Kargil, they said. There was no death reported on Sunday, they said. A total of 370 sample reports in Ladakh were found negative, officials said.

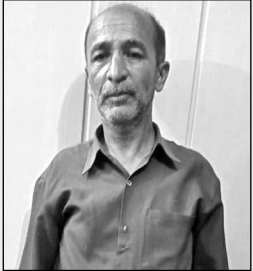
The total number of active cases in Ladakh is 16 and all of them are from Leh district, officials added.

### Ladakh Excise officials seize over 2,100 bottles of liquor smuggled from Chandigarh

The estimated value of seized liquor is approximately Rs 6.5 lakh, an official of Ladakh excise wing told. The excise officers also arrested a person under relevant sections of law, adding that further investigation is going on.
