citizens." Modi also mentioned Manoj Sinha, a native of Ghazipur who is presently Lieutenant Governor of Jammu and Kashmir, in his Ghazipur rally.

Talking about poverty in Purvanchal, Modi said, "Whenever I come to Ghazipur I remember former MP Vishwanath Singh Gahmari. When the government was led by Jawaharlal Nehru, Vishwanath Gahmari told parliament that people in Purvanchal are forced to remove wheat grains from cattle dung to eat due to poverty."

Meanwhile, Union Minister of State for External Affairs V Muraleedharan said in Purna the Indian government had issued advisory to Indian nationals before February 24, asking them to leave Ukraine if it wasn't essential for them to stay on.

Urging the parents not to panic, he said of 20,000 Indians stranded in Ukraine following the Russian invasion, 6,000 have been brought back safely, and the government is making all efforts to ensure safe return of the rest.

The minister, who met the parents of some students who are stuck in Ukraine here, was speaking to the reporters on the sidelines of an event.

"There were around 20,000 students and other citizens who were stranded in Ukraine. Of them, 4,000 were brought back to India before February 24. Additional 2,000 students were brought back to India till Tuesday and efforts are on to evacuate the remaining Indians stuck there," he said.

"Earlier, through an advisory, we had advised the students in Kyiv to leave the city and proceed to the western borders. As per the latest information we are receiving in Kharkiv, from time to time advisories are being issued to the students assessing the seriousness of the ground situation," he added.

Around 1,200 students have already left Kharkiv and reached train stations or are already in transit, the minister said.

"Before February 24, when the conflict situation started in Ukraine, around 4,000 students had already returned to India. Till yesterday, around 9,000 students have either reached India or already crossed the Ukrainian border," he said.

The minister denied allegations that there was a delay in starting the evacuation process.

"I talked to some parents and they told me that their children were not in the position to leave Ukraine before February 24 as the universities and colleges were conducting off-line classes," he said.

The Indian government had issued an advisory before February 24 asking those for whom it was not necessary to stay in Ukraine to leave the country, he said.

"On that basis, around 4,000 people returned to India before February 24," Muraleedharan added.

With the help of Ukraine's neighbouring countries Romania, Poland, Hungary and Slovakia, the students were being evacuated to India, he said.

The Union government has launched 'Operation Ganga' to bring back Indians stranded in Ukraine. Asked about Shiv Sena's allegation that the name 'Ganga' was being used keeping Uttar Pradesh elections in mind, he said, "It is not a political issue. It is a national issue. It is pertaining to the safety of Indian citizens. There should not be any objection to the name." Prime Minister Narendra Modi has spoken with Russian President Vladimir Putin as well as Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelensky. Muraleedharan said. External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar has spoken to the countries which share border with Ukraine, and the foreign secretary has held two rounds of discussions with the Ukrainian and Russian ambassadors in Delhi and requested them to facilitate the evacuation of Indian students, he said.

"I would like to request Indian parents not to panic. The Indian government is committed to bringing all the students and citizens of India back safely," the minister said.

Asked about allegations that Indian students were being harassed by Ukrainians while crossing the borders, he said no such incidents were happening at present, but there might have been such occurrences earlier.

The Indian mission in Kyiv is constantly assessing the situation and issuing advisories to Indian nationals in the country, Muraleedharan said.

Four senior ministers are currently camping in countries adjacent to Ukraine and coordinating Operation Ganga, he said.

### Centre defends PMLA...

any attempt, with the knowledge to launder proceeds of crime, constituted an offence under this law.

The apex court is hearing arguments on a batch of pleas concerning the interpretation of certain provisions of the PMLA.

During the day-long arguments, the law officer also gave the illustration of prosecution of certain bank officials in the Punjab National Bank scam, involving jeweller and designer Nirav Modi and others.

In the Nirav Modi case, certain bank officials were made accused as they were hand-in-glove with the accused in issuing the letters of credit, he said while explaining the schemes of PMLA provisions.

So long as a person knowingly becomes a party or is actually involved in any process or activity connected with proceeds of crime, such person is guilty of money laundering, Mehta told the bench, also comprising Justices Dinesh Maheshwari and C T Ravikumar.

The bench referred to the international efforts, including that of FATF, to tackle the menace of money laundering from proceeds of crime of serious offences and said that it had led the Centre to enact the legislation as per the need of the country.

Money-laundering poses a serious threat not only to the financial systems of countries but also to their integrity and sovereignty. To obviate such threats international community has taken some initiatives. It has been felt that to prevent money-laundering and connected activities comprehensive legislation is urgently needed.

To achieve this objective the Prevention of Money-laundering Bill, 1998 was introduced in Parliament. The Bill was referred to the Standing Committee on Finance, which presented its report on 4th March 1999 to the Lok Sabha. The Central Government broadly accepted the recommendation of the Standing Committee and incorporated them in the said Bill along with some other desired changes, Mehta said in his written submissions.

The law officer said the amendments in the PMLA were enacted by Parliament on December 17, 2012, and came into force on February 15, next year.

He said section 3 of the PMLA, which provides the definition of money laundering offence, has been amended and said if a person directly or indirectly attempts to indulge or knowingly assists or knowingly is a party or is actually involved in any process or activity connected with the proceeds of crime including its concealment, possession, acquisition or use and projecting or claiming it as untainted property shall be guilty of the offence of money laundering.

Even in an act of mere concealment, possession, or use of proceeds of crime or activity connected with the proceeds of crime, per se, is an offence, he added.

If a person conceals the proceeds of crime, keeps it in his possession or uses it, he is guilty of money laundering irrespective of as to whether he is projecting it as untainted or not, Mehta said.

He said the non-demarcation of the offence of money laundering either as cognizable or non-cognizable in the PMLA and authorising the authorities to arrest under section 19 of the Act has a purpose to achieve.

As stated above, the offence of money laundering, by its very nature is different and distinct from the offence mentioned in the Indian Penal Code. The offence of money laundering needs very intricate and complicated layering of money through a maze of dummy companies. Money laundering offences are more often than not taking place within and beyond the territories of India, Mehta said.

For these reasons, the laundering takes place through either Hawala transactions or electronic banking and other advanced technological methods, he said.

Mehta said because of the very nature of the offence of money laundering and the potential of the accused to remove even the traces of offence with a view to frustrate the investigation, the legislature has consciously avoided either provision of registering FIR, supply the FIR to the magistrate and requiring the authorities to obtain a warrant before effecting the arrest.

He said any form of intimation or notice will enable the accused to wipe off the evidence in a matter of literally few minutes.

The arguments in the matter would continue on Thursday.

The Centre had last week told the apex court that 4,850 cases have been taken up for investigation under the PMLA in the last 17 years and proceeds of crime of Rs 98,368 crore were identified and attached under the provision of the law.

The government had told the bench that investigation in these offences was carried out under the PMLA, including 2,883 searches.

The solicitor general had said that out of the Rs 98,368 crore which were identified and attached, proceeds of crime of Rs 55,899 crore have been confirmed by the adjudicating authority.

In addition to this, proceeds of crime of Rs 853.16 crore has already been confiscated

ed to the Central government under the orders of the competent court, the Centre had said.

The dilemma for the applicant now is how to get the information from the 'relevant section', if the officer concerned himself could not get it.

"It is my responsibility to contact so and so section for response", the applicant told STATE TIMES, adding that the entire exercise is to withhold the information for 'obvious reasons'. He apprehended some sort of nexus with the organisation to conceal something which may hurt interests of someone. The only objective is providing a shield to the wrong committed, he added.

their safe evacuation the students are running short of food and drinking water and they were told to cross the border into neighbouring countries on their own, one of the protesters, Rajinder Paul Singh, told reporters.

He said there is snow and they are fearful for the lives of their children who have been in a miserable condition for the past seven days.

Singh urged the government to play a positive role in stopping this war.

Another protester said he talked to his daughter who told him that there are 700 Indian students who have left their medical college this morning and are walking to cross the border.

Our children need prayers from the countrymen for their safety. We have no faith in this government, he said.

He said they are going through a nightmare in view of the ongoing crisis and the helplessness of their children who are caught in the war.

We are seeking the protection of our children from God. They have left their place on foot to reach the nearest Metro station which is about 10 kms from their location, a woman, who is eagerly awaiting the return of her son, said.

She was also highly critical of the government efforts for evacuation of the students and said it is only a propaganda to make people happy. Our children are weeping there and we have been crying here for the past one week.

Yesterday, a student lost his life now the government should get out of slumber and act quickly by having some compassion for the children and their parents, she said, adding the work on the ground speaks rather than the words.

The Divisional Administration Jammu has issued a list of district wise nodal officers and control room helpline numbers in all the 10 districts to provide any assistance to the families whose children are holed up in Ukraine.

The Indian embassy in Ukraine issued a series of advisories earlier last month requesting the people to consider leaving the country after its tensions with Russia increased. India launched the evacuation mission under which the Indians from Hungary, Romania, Poland and Slovakia are being brought back home after they exited Ukraine through its land border crossings.

Amid the Russian offensive against Ukraine, India started the evacuation of around 14,000 of its stranded citizens in the Eastern European country on February 26.

Six flights under India's evacuation mission 'Operation Ganga' have departed for India in the last 24 hours, External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said on Wednesday.

### Online misuse of...

all the registration authorities not to share passwords with any person, periodically change the password and update the credentials in the existing portal/software developed for online registration of birth and death.

It further reads that "it has come to the notice of that some unauthorized persons, by misusing Login ID/Passwords have issued fake birth/death certificates in few cases through online portal/website. Also, few instances have been reported that existing portal/software developed for online registration of birth and death has come under phishing attack", it reads. Fake portals/websites have been designed with the aim to steal and misuse user/login IDs and passwords for the issuance of fake birth and death certificates. Consequently, some criminal cases have been registered by the concerned registration authorities.

The advisory further reads that in view of these facts, any such matter, if reported or otherwise may be taken up with the concerned authority to conduct a proper inquiry and take appropriate action required under the law.

Furthermore, all registrars have been asked to direct the registration authorities to exercise due diligence while accessing the existing portal/software and ensure that they enter the complete and correct Uniform Resource Locator (URL) of the website and portal. It has also stressed for sensitizing the general public at large about the URL of the official website of births & deaths registration through necessary publicity measures. The advisory has been shared with ADGP Jammu Zone and IGP Kashmir by PHQ for necessary action at the desired levels.

### Kansal launches Learning...

The Principal Secretary congratulated the pioneering colleges and lauded the efforts of all the concerned colleges for timely implementation of the online system. The Islamia College of Science & Commerce was specially lauded for taking the lead and mentoring other colleges in this regard.

Rohit Kansal said that LMS intends to improve both, learning and teaching outcomes. All our colleges would obtain NAAC accreditation. They would also progressively offer flexible learning under the Academic Bank of Credits (ABC) system, he added.

He further said that with the new policy, colleges would start providing Bachelor of Skills (B.Voc.) degrees. 3-year degree courses would be transformed into 4-year ones, with option to enter either research or completing it with Honours in the last year; he added. Colleges would also be linked with the National Skill Development Corporation (NSDC) for providing skill courses to its students, he informed.

The Principal Secretary expressed satisfaction with implementation of LMS by the colleges. He assured them financial support and urged them to strive for improving quality of education.
