KYIV: Russian forces have seized a strategic Ukrainian seaport and besieged another as part of efforts to cut the country off from its coastline, even as Moscow said Thursday it was ready for talks to end the fighting that has sent more than 1 million people fleeing over Ukraine's

The Russian military said it had control of Kherson, and local Ukrainian officials confirmed that forces have taken over local government headquarters in the Black Sea port of 280,000, making it the first major city to fall since the invasion began a week ago.

Meanwhile, Russia's foreign minister says that Moscow is ready for talks to end the fighting in Ukraine but will continue to press its effort to destroy Ukraine's military infrastructure.

Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov said that the Russian delegation submitted its demands to Ukrainian negotiators earlier this week and is now waiting for Kyiv's response in talks set for Thursday.

Lavrov said that the West continuously armed Ukraine, trained its troops

ED provisionally attaches properties worth Rs 7.25 Cr

Enforcement Directorate on Thursday said it has "provisionally attached" immovable properties worth Rs 7.25 crore of Ahsan Ahmad Mirza in an ongoing case of alleged money laundering by former office bearers of the Jammu Kashmir Cricket Association (JKCA).

This is the third attachment order in the case.

Jammu and Former Kashmir chief minister Farooq Abdullah's property was provisionally attached in December 2020 and this was challenged in the Jammu and Kashmir High Court.

Abdullah was JKCA president from 2001 to $201\overline{2}$ and the scam being probed by the Central Bureau Investigation (CBI) and the Enforcement Directorate (ED) is about alleged finanmisappropriation between 2004 and 2009.

In a statement, the ED said


