### Putin warns 3rd...

Russian Foreign Minister Sergey Lavrov on Saturday said Russia was ready for a third round of talks on that and other issues, but he asserted that the Ukrainian side, the most interested side here, it would seem, is constantly making up various pretexts to delay the beginning of another meeting.

Diplomatic efforts continued as U.S. Secretary of State Antony Blinken arrived in Poland to meet with the prime minister and foreign minister, a day after attending a NATO meeting in Brussels in which the alliance pledged to step up support for eastern flank members.

In the wake of Western sanctions, Aeroflot, Russia's flagship state-owned airline, announced that it plans to halt all international flights, except to Belarus, starting Tuesday.

While a vast Russian armoured column threatening Ukraine's capital remained stalled outside Kyiv, the shelling in Mariupol showed Russia's determination to cut Ukraine off from access to the Black Sea and the Sea of Azov, further damaging the country's economy.

Even in cities that have fallen to the Russians, there were signs of resistance - peaceful or otherwise. As homes in the northern city of Chernihiv burned from what locals blamed on the Russian shelling that's targeted Ukraine's urban areas from the start, Ukrainian officials released images showing a Russian plane they said was shot down there.

Presidential adviser Oleksiy Arestovich said the situation was generally quiet Saturday and Russian forces have not taken active actions since the morning.

Instead it was Putin who was most on the offensive with his comments warning against a wider war.

Ukraine's president has pleaded for a no-fly zone over his country and lashed out at NATO for refusing to impose one, warning that all the people who die from this day forward will also die because of you.

NATO has said a no-fly zone, which would bar all unauthorized aircraft from flying over Ukraine, could provoke widespread war in Europe. But as the United States and other NATO members send weapons for Kyiv, the conflict is already drawing in countries far beyond Ukraine's borders.

As Russia cracks down on independent media reporting on the war, major international news outlets said they were pausing their work inside the country. Moscow also blocked Facebook and Twitter.

And in a warning of a hunger crisis yet to come, the U.N. World Food Program has said millions of people inside Ukraine, a major global wheat supplier, will need food aid immediately.

Ukraine's president was set to brief U.S. senators Saturday by video conference as Congress considers a request for USD 10 billion in emergency funding for humanitarian aid and security needs.

And the U.N. Security Council scheduled an open meeting for Monday on the worsening humanitarian situation. The United Nations estimates that 12 million people in Ukraine and 4 million fleeing to neighbouring countries in the coming months will need humanitarian aid.

At least 351 civilians have been confirmed killed since Russia's invasion on Feb. 24, but the true number is probably much higher, the U.N. human rights office has said. Russia said Wednesday 498 of its troops had been killed and has not updated since. Kyiv's central train station remained crowded with people desperate to flee. People just want to live, one woman, Ksenia, said.

Elsewhere in the capital, in a sign of nerves near breaking point, two people on a side-walk froze in their tracks at the sound of a sharp bang. It was a garbage truck upending a bin.

### BSF opens fire...

general area of Arnia around 4.10 am.

"The humming sound of a suspected drone was heard in the morning at 4:10 am by

alert troops of the BSF in the general area of Arnia. The troops fired towards the direction of the sound," the spokesperson said.

He said the area was cordoned off with the help of police, and a joint search operation was underway.

The officials said BSF troops fired around 18 rounds within a span of 10 minutes after picking up the movement of the drone.

This comes 10 days after police recovered a huge consignment of arms and ammunition dropped by the Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) and its offshoot, The Resistance Front, by a drone in the same area in R S Pura sector.

The seizure on February 24 included a pistol with two magazines and 70 rounds, three detonators, three remote-controlled IEDs, three bottles of explosives, one bundle of cortex wire, two-timer IEDs and six grenades.

In the past one year, security forces have shot down two drones and seized their payloads, including rifles, improvised explosive devices (IEDs), sticky bombs and narcotics, in Jammu region.

### Modi chairs another...

exercise. India on Saturday said its main focus now is on the evacuation of around 700 Indian students stranded in the eastern Ukrainian city of Sumy which has been witnessing bombings and airstrikes.

At a media briefing, External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Arindam Bagehi said India hopes to evacuate its citizens from Kharkiv and Pischyn in the next few hours.

"Our main focus is now on evacuating Indian students from Sumy. We are exploring multiple options for their evacuation," he said.

Meanwhile, the Civil Aviation Ministry has said that eleven flights with more than 2,200 Indian evacuees will operate from Ukraine's neighbouring countries to India on Sunday.

About 3,000 Indians were airlifted on 15 flights to India on Saturday, the ministry's statement noted.

"These included 12 special civilian and 3 Indian Air Force (IAF) flights," it added.

The Ukrainian airspace has been shut since February 24 due to the ongoing Russian military offensive against it. Indian citizens who were stuck in Ukraine are being airlifted via its neighbouring countries such as Romania, Hungary, Slovakia and Poland.

The IAF is conducting its flights using C-17 military transport planes. The civilian flight are being operated by Indian carriers such as IndiGo, Air India, Vistara and SpiceJet.

"Today's (Saturday's) civilian flights included five from Budapest (Hungary), four from Suceva (Romania), one from Kosice (Slovakia) and two from Rzeszow (Poland)," the ministry said.

Tomorrow, 11 special flights are expected to operate from Budapest, Kosice, Rzeszow and Bucharest, bringing more than 2,200 Indians back home, it noted.

In simple terms, the NSWS will eliminate the need for investors to visit multiple platforms or offices to gather information and obtain clearances from different stakeholders, they said.

During interrogation, accused Kifayat Rashid Koka disclosed that initially he was working as SPO but subsequently left the job and started a Ready-made garment shop in partnership with Ishfaq Majeed Koka and Irfan Ahmed at Sangam Anantnag. Ishfaq Majeed Koka was already running a retail shop of Readymade garments wherein, he engaged Azad Ahmed Koka and Altaf Ahmed Dar as Salesmen, and later shifted Azad Ahmed Koka and Altaf Ahmed Dar in their wholesale readymade garments shop. After sometime, the shop fell in loss, on which Irfan Ahmed cancelled the partnership thereby making Ishfaq Majeed Koka and Kifayat Rashid Koka only partners of business. Since the real brother of Ishfaq Majeed Koka namely Burhan Koka was an active terrorist of Ansar-Ghazwat-Hind and accused persons were impressed by living standard of Ishfaq Majeed Koka and Altaf Ahmed Dar, they came to know that these persons had connection with terrorists of Ansar-Ghawat-Hind organization. As wholesale business of Ishfaq Majeed Koka and Altaf Ahmed Dar was not working well and ultimately got closed, while in April 2020, Burhan Koka was killed in an encounter and his dead body was not handed over to family members, on which all family members including Ishfaq Majeed Koka were not happy with army and got inclined to assist terrorist activities. Since Ishfaq Majeed Koka and Altaf Ahmed Dar were already working as OGWs and after death of Burhan Koka, they started receiving messages from terrorists on Whatsapp and Telegram. Both of them were in direct contact with the aforesaid terrorist and Ishfaq Majeed Koka, who motivated Kifayat Rashid Koka and Azad Ahmed Koka to join terrorist rank and in September 2020, Ishfaq Majeed Koka assigned the task to Kifayat Rashid Koka and Azad Ahmed Koka for bringing terror money from Jammu. One of the close friend of Altaf Ahmed namely Zubair Farooq Koka, who was also a friend of deceased terrorist Burhan Koka and was studying in Jammu, was contacted by Ishfaq Majeed Koka and Altaf Ahmed Dar and he was assigned the job under the direction of Muzamil Manzoor Tantray to collect terror money from Sunjwan Jammu. He was further asked to deposit the money in parts in different accounts and after withdrawing the same, it was decided to hand-over the same to terrorist namely Muzamil Manzoor Tantray. As per directions of Ishfaq Majeed Koka and Altaf Ahmed Dar, accused Zubair Farooq Koka collected terror money amounting to Rs 16 lakh from an unknown person who came in an i-20 car at Sunjwan. Complying the directions , the accused Zubair Farooq Koka had deposited Rs 3,50,000 in each of the bank accounts of Ishfaq Majeed Koka and Altaf Ahmed Dar and subse-

ed a person at Moughla area, who was taking two bovines by foot without any of permission. FIR no. 17/2022 under section 188 of IPC and 11 of PCA Act was registered against him.

During search of duo, 18 Kg Poppy Straw and 200 gm Charas like substance was recovered from their possession. Duo was arrested and FIR No 29/2022 under sections 8/15/20/29 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Batote. Shah breathed his last at SKIMS hospital where he was undergoing treatment since February 22.

He had set himself on fire as the irrigation and flood control department launched a demolition drive against illegal constructions along the banks of water bodies following many complaints.

They said during the demolition drive along the banks of Sindh stream, Shah suddenly appeared from behind an illegal structure and self-immolated on its roof in protest against the demolition.

Though Shah was rescued by locals and police personnel on the spot, he received burn injuries before the flames were doused, the officials said.

The owners of the illegal structure had also dug a deep trench to prevent any ingress into the premises which prevented a prompt rescue, they added.

The incident went viral on social media, prompting police to appeal to people not to share it. The administration has already ordered an inquiry into the incident.

There are 380 active cases in the union territory, while the number of recovered patients was 4,48,085, the officials said.

The death toll in the union territory due to the pandemic remained unchanged at 4,749 as no fresh death was reported since Friday.

The officials said there were 51 confirmed cases of Mucormycosis (black fungus) in the union territory as no fresh case was reported since last evening.

Meanwhile, Ladakh has reported 11 new coronavirus cases, continuing with the downward trend of new infections, officials said, as the overall tally reached 28,095.

The number of active cases in the union territory dropped to 125 with recovery of 23 more patients in Leh, they said.

According to the officials, there was no COVID-related death in the region, which has so far recorded a total of 228 fatalities linked to the pandemic since its outbreak.

Of the total fatalities, Leh district accounts for the highest 168 deaths followed by 60 in Kargil.

The officials said all the 11 fresh cases were reported in Leh, taking the number of active cases in the district to 123. Kargil, on the other hand, has two active cases.

The total number of recovered patients now stands at 27,742, the officials said.

## Major bovine smuggling bids foiled, 120 bovines rescued

RAMBAN/RAJOURI: Acting tough against bovine smugglers and to curb bovine smuggling menace, Ramban and Rajouri police in a major breakthrough rescued 120 bovines.

As per details, during intervening night of 4th & 5th March, acting on specific inputs regarding transportation of bovine animals, different police parties of Police Stations Batote, Chanderkote and Ramban intercepted eight different vehicles (JK03H-9378, JK02CV-1420, JK02CA-8284, JK02CV-2536, JK20A-9835, JK14F-3081, JK03H- 7135, JK03H-0259, JK02AR-1385, JK01BF-0596 & JK02BA-1634) which were on way from Jammu towards Srinagar. During checking, the vehicles were found laden with 110 bovines which were rescued. FIR Nos 30, 31 and 32/2022 were registered at Police Station Batote whereas FIR Nos 35, 36 and 37/2022 were registered at Police Station Chanderkote and FIR Nos 58, 59, 60, 61 & 62/2022 were registered at Police Station Ramban under relevant sections of law.

The overall rescue operation was made by police parties under command of Insp Sudhir Sadotra SHO Batote, Insp P D Singh SHO Chanderkote and Insp Sandeep Charak SHO Ramban under supervision of Vigar Younis Bhat DySP DAR Ramban with overall supervision of SSP Ramban, Mohita Sharma.

Meanwhile, Rajouri police rescued eight animals being smuggled in a vehicle, which was seized by Police. On Saturday morning, a team of police from Dharamsal police station under supervision of SHO Neeraj Choudhary intercepted a Tata mobile with registration number JK11E 7165, which was found laden with 8 bovine animals. The driver of vehicle escaped from the spot soon after observing Police Naka. The vehicle was plying towards Rajouri from Bhambla via Kadma Solki area. FIR no. 16/2022 under sections 188 of IPC 11 of PCA was registered by Police.

Meanwhile, a team of Police Post Teryath headed by SI Raza Ali Incharge Police Post Teryath under supervision of SHO Neeraj Choudhary also intercept-
