## CRIME REPORT

### Specially-abled woman handed-over to family

JAMMU: Police on Monday handed over a specially-abled woman to her family.

As per details, information was received at Police Post Rehari through reliable sources that a specially-abled woman was roaming near Kali Maa Mandir, Pacea Talab area under jurisdiction of Police Post Rehari, Jammu. On this, women police team of Police Post Rehari brought her to Post Rehari and offered her meals. After this special police teams of Police Post Rehari under supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu were constituted. A team led by SHO Police Station Pacea Danga Inspr Raghubir Singh assisted by Incharge Police Post Rehari SI Ahmed Din, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of various sources, contacted the family members of woman, who disclosed that she is mentally unsound and had gone missing from home. The woman was finally handed over to her family after completing all legal formalities.

### Absconder evading arrest for 2 years arrested

JAMMU: Police on Monday nabbed an absconder who was evading arrest for two years.

As per the details, an information was received at Police Post Pallanwala through reliable sources regarding presence of an absconder namely Vijay Kumar, son of Kali Dass, resident of TCP Pallanwala, who was evading arrest in FIR No. 217/2020 registered under sections 341/354 of PRC at Police Station Akhnoor. On this, a team of Police Post Pallanwala under supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial led by SHO Akhnoor Inspr Hilal Azhar assisted by Incharge Police Post Pallanwala PSI Vijay Kumar, after putting in strenuous efforts, arrested the absconder. It is pertinent to mention that proceedings under section 512 of CrPC were also initiated against him by the Court.

### 10 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police teams of Police Station Gharota, Police Posts Chatta, Panjirthi and Chatha acted stringently on specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 7 vehicles involved in illegal mining, which included a JCB, a tractor (JK02CS 0962) and another without registration number seized by Gharota police; a tractor-trolley bearing Chassis No QRTL30405025320 and another without registration number seized by Chatta police; a tipper (JK02CN4758) seized by Panjirthi police and a tractor-trolley without registration number seized by Chatha police. DMO Jammu was also intimidated about the same. The recoveries were made by SHO Gharota Insp Khyatimaan Khajuria, Incharge Police Post Chatta PSI Arun Kumar Shan, Incharge Police Post Panjirthi PSI Rahul Sharma and Incharge Police Post Chatha SI Ranjit Singh in their respective jurisdictions.

Samba Police also seized a dumper, a JCB & a tractor-trolley which were being used for illegal transportation/mining of construction material. A party of Police Station Ramgarh while on patrolling near Radwan area, seized a tractor-trolley (JK21B/ 6496) and a JCB without registration number for illegally transporting/mining of construction material. In another incident, a party from Police Station Vijaypur while performing routine checking duty at NHW Naka AIIMS, seized a dumper (JK21F/1897) for carrying construction material (sand) without any valid permission. All seized vehicles were handed-over to Geology & Mining Department by Samba Police for further action.

### Six narco-smugglers arrested with heroin

JAMMU/UDHAMPUR: Police on Monday nabbed six narco-smugglers and recovered 69 gm heroin from their possession.

As per details, a team from Police Post Belicharana led by SHO Satwari Inspector Sameer Jeelani assisted by Incharge Police Post Belicharana PSI Jeevan Kumar while on Naka-duty rounded up two suspects from a vehicle (JK02AU4203). On search 50 gm heroin was recovered from them. The accused were identified as Narvir Singh, son of Jagjeet Singh, resident of Belicharana and Amarjeet Singh, son of Sohan Singh, resident of Belicharana. Duo was arrested and FIR under relevant sections of law has been registered. The whole operation was done under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma.

Similarly, at another Naka, a team of Police Post Chowk Chabutra led by SHO Police Station Pacea Danga Insp Raghubir Singh assisted by Incharge Police Post Chowk Chabutra PSI Jyoti Choudhary, rounded up a suspect who turned suspicious on seeing police. Identified as Yasir Ali, son of Abdul Latif, resident of Palper (Ragoora) Tehsil and district Jammu, he was intercepted and on search, 9 gm heroin was recovered from his possession. He was arrested and FIR No 28/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Pacea Danga. The arrests and recoveries were made under supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu.

Meanwhile, a party of Police Station Udhampur led by SHO Udhampur Insp Chaman Gorka under supervision of Addl SP Udhampur Anwaar Ul Haq and DySP Hqrs Sahil Mahajan, while performing patrolling duty at Sambal road, Udhampur apprehended a suspect and recovered 6 gm heroin like narcotic substance from his possession. The accused identified as Asif Hussain, son of Intiyaz Sheikh, resident of Shiv Nagar, Udhampur was arrested and FIR No. 90/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Udhampur.

In another action, party from Police Station Udhampur intercepted two more suspects namely Sunil Malik, son of Pinka Teja, resident of Christian Colony, Udhampur and Smile Gill, son of Madan Lal, resident of Barta, Udhampur. On frisking, 4 gm Heroin like substance was recovered from both of them.

Duo was arrested and FIR No. 91/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered against them.

### Two drug peddlers arrested; over 3 Kg Ganja recovered

JAMMU: Continuing its efforts against menace of drugs, Jammu police in a major breakthrough recovered 3 Kg 950 gm Ganja at two different Nakas and arrested two drug peddlers.

As per details, a team of Police Station Akhnoor constituted under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial and led by SHO Akhnoor Inspr Hilal Azhar while on Naka duty rounded up a suspect, later identified as Sachin Chouhan, son of Keshal Prasad, resident of Kottetra Chhattisgarh and presently staying at Kotgadhi Akhnoor. During search, 2 Kg 700 gm Ganja was recovered from his possession. He was arrested and FIR No. 47/2022 under sections 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Akhnoor.

Similarly, at another Naka by team from Police Station Domana constituted under supervision of SDPO Domana Sunil Singh and led by SHO Domana Insp Mahesh Sharma assisted by Incharge Police Post Pounichak PSI Nitish Khajuria rounded-up a suspect later identified as Raj Kumar, son of Lalit Kumar, resident of Champa Chhattisgarh, presently staying at Gho Manhasa. On search 1 Kg 250 gm Ganja was recovered from his possession. He was arrested and FIR No 80/2022 under section 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Domana.

### Theft case solved; thief arrested, stolen items recovered

BARI BRAHMANA: Police on Monday worked out a theft case by arresting a thief and recovered stolen items from his possession.

As per details, on March 4, 2022 a written complaint was lodged at Police Station Bari-Brahmana by one Gagandeep Singh, son of Gulsharan Singh, resident of Sanik Colony, Jammu regarding theft of 12 electric poles from Capital Eletech Store, Khoti Morh, Bari Brahmana. Acting over complaint, FIR No. 49/2022 under sections 457/380 of IPC was registered at Police Station Bari Brahmana and investigation started. During course of investigation, a team of Police Station Bari-Brahmana led by SHO Bari Brahmana Insp Rakesh Sharma under supervision of SDPO Bari-Brahmana Shivali Kotwal had rounded up several suspects. During questioning, a suspect namely Pardeep, son of Bhoore Singh, resident of UP and presently staying at Teli Basti, Bari Brahmana confessed his crime. On discourse of accused, all 12 stolen electric poles amounting to approximately Rs 2.40 Lakh were recovered from Balol Nala near Quality Casting Factory.

### Three arrested with Charas & poppy straw



RAMBAN: Police on Monday nabbed three drug-peddlers and recovered 37 gm Charas and 3 Kg poppy straw-like substance from their possession.

As per details, during routine checking at Ramsoo Naka, a party from Police Station Ramsoo intercepted a truck (PB13X/9741) for checking, driven by one Gurpreet Singh, son of Dharampal Singh, resident of Kupkhrud, Tehsil Malerkotla, district Sangrur, Punjab. During search, 3 Kg Poppy straw-like substance was recovered from his possession. In this connection, FIR No 22/2022 under sections 8/15 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Ramsoo.

In an another incident, a team from Police Post Khari foiled a narcotics smuggling bid at Khari and arrested two persons with Charas like substance. While on routine patrolling and checking duty, a team from police post Khari rounded up two suspects, who tried to flee on seeing police.

On checking of accused, identified as Showket Ahmed Naik, son of Ab Rehman Naik and Munwar Ahmed Naik, son of Ghulam Rasool Naik, both residents of Mahoo Tehsil-Khari, Ramban, 37 gm Charas like substance was recovered from their possession.

Duo was arrested and FIR No 36/2022 under section 8/20/29 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Banihal. The overall arrest and recoveries were made by a party of Police Post Khari led by Incharge Police Post Khari PSI Sweet Singh under guidance of SHO Banihal Insp Naem ul Haq and a party of Police Station Ramsoo led by SHO Ramsoo under supervision of SDPO Banihal Nisar Ahmed Khoja and overall supervision of SSP Ramban, Mohita Sharma.



### Army Jawan commits suicide

SRINAGAR: An Army Jawan allegedly committed suicide by shooting himself with service rifle in Awantipora area in Pulwama district on Monday evening.

As per details, Army Jawan identified as Mohit, shot himself dead at 34 RR D-Coy presently attached with Victor Force committed suicide in Awantipora. A case under section 174 of CrPC has been registered for investigation.

### Notorious timber smuggler arrested

SOPORE: Police on Monday arrested a notorious timber smuggler in Sopore, who was involved in four FIRs but was evading arrest from last year.

During intervening night of March 6-7, 2022, a party from Police Station Panzla acting on specific information arrested the timber smuggler from Srinagar, who was identified as Syed Khan, son of Khushal Khan, resident of Kutru Naribal, Rafiabad. He was a habitual and chronic forest offender and involved in 4 FIRs viz 80/17, 63/21 at Police Station Panzalla and 80/18, 101/19 at Police Station Dangiwaacha.

Pertinent to mention here that despite several warnings and registration of FIRs, offender had not refrained from indulging in illegal activities regarding timber smuggling, due to which a warrant under Public Safety Act was issued by the District Magistrate Ganderbal in month of September 2021 against him.

### House burgled, cash & jewellery stolen

JHAJJAR KOTLI: Thieves on Monday burgled a house at Jhajjar Kotli and decamped with cash & jewellery.

As per details, one Radhe Sham, son of Des Raj, resident of Samral lodged a complaint with police that thieves targeted his house when his family was out for some work. He further disclosed that thieves decamped with Rs 70,000 cash and some jewellery. Police has registered a case and detained some suspects for questioning.

### 3 drug peddlers arrested; contraband recovered

GANDERBAL: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, Police on Monday arrested 3 drug peddlers in Ganderbal and recovered contraband substances from their possession.

As per details, Ganderbal police at various checkpoints established across the district arrested three drug peddlers identified as Tawseef Ahmad Khan @ Kaka, son of Awrang Gull Khan, resident of Dursuma Manigam; Ishfaq Ahmad Sheikh, son of Gh Nabi Sheikh, resident of Batpora, Safapora and Suhail Ahmad Tantary, son of Mohammad Yousaf Tantary, resident of Wakoora. Huge quantity of contraband substances including 42.5 Kg grinded Cannabis and 2.160 Kg Cannabis powder were recovered from their possession. Besides, 5 bottles of liquor were also recovered from them. Both the accused were arrested and shifted to police stations where they remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at respective police stations and further investigation started.

### Two eve-teasing cases reported

As per details, a woman from Gadawal lodged a complaint with Sidhra Police that one Mohd Khalid teased her when she was grazing cattle. Police has registered both the cases and started investigation.

### Girl goes missing

### Black-marketing of Govt cement foiled; 1 arrested, 450 bags seized

R S PURA: Police on Monday foiled a bid to black-market Govt cement by arresting an accused and seized 450 bags cement, meant for railways.

As per details, acting on an input that someone had dumped Govt cement bags in a hideout, R S Pura police raided a suspected location and recovered 450 bags of cement. Police has also arrested a person in this connection, who is being questioned to find other links in the case. It was also learnt that cement was meant for railway works.

### Child among 2 killed in mishaps

As per details, one Divya Rajput, daughter of Chaman Singh, resident of Khawas, Rajouri was hit by a bike, due to which she got injured and was shifted to hospital, where doctors declared her as brought dead.

Meanwhile, Sant Ram, son of Makhan Lal, resident of Vijaypur also died after getting hit by a vehicle in Vijaypur area.

### Notorious drug peddler among 2 booked under PSA, another arrested

SRINAGAR: Acting tough against drug dealings, Police in Awantipora booked a notorious drug peddler under PSA.

Another peddler was also arrested in Sopore and psychotropic substance was recovered from his possession. Earlier, Police Station Pampore arrested a notorious drug peddler identified as Manzoor Ahmad Mir alias Mana Tiger, son of Abdul Khaliq Mir, resident of Kadlbal Pampore and a case was registered against him. Pertinent to mention here that he was involved in many NDPS and burglary related cases.

Despite his involvement in many FIRs, accused was again promoting drug trade by supplying narcotics to local youth. Subsequently, case was duly processed and after obtaining sanctions from concerned authorities, the drug peddler was detained under Public Safety Act (PSA). Besides, another accused identified as Shabir Ahmad Najar, a released terrorist; son of Gh Ahmad Najar, resident of Wuyan Pampore was also booked under PSA after obtaining sanctions from concerned authorities.

Meanwhile, Sopore police led by Incharge Police Post Fruit Mandi, at a checking point established at Vijbal Crossing, signaled a vehicle bearing registration number DLCT3 3503 to stop, but driver tried to flee after noticing Police.

Acting swiftly, the alert cops intercepted the vehicle and after search, recovered 1,560 capsules of Spasmoproxyvon from the possession of accused, who was identified as Jamsheed Ahmad Malik @ Bat Bakra, son of Ghulam Mohd Malik, resident of Achaabal Sopore.

He was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 40/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Sopore and investigation started.
