The portal was said to help in tracking all economic activities undertaken by SHG members, their income and other services availed from different departments like gold card, artisan card, Shram cards, insurance benefits under PMSBY, PMJJY.

from Sumy. They are currently en route to Poltava, from where they will board trains to western Ukraine," Bagchi tweeted.

"Flights under Operation Ganga are being prepared to bring them home," he said. Bagchi, however, did not specify from which border point and when will they be evacuated from Ukraine to board flights for their return to India.

The MEA spokesperson also posted a video on Twitter showing Indian students having refreshments in the backdrop of parked buses.

Also, the Indian Embassy in Ukraine issued an advisory urging all stranded Indian nationals to make use of "humanitarian corridor" announced in various parts of Ukraine and evacuate using trains, vehicles or any other available means of transport giving due consideration to safety.

Humanitarian corridor for evacuation of stranded people has been announced in various parts of Ukraine from 1000 hours on March 8, 2022.

Considering the security situation, establishment of the next humanitarian corridor is uncertain, the advisory said.

"All stranded Indian nationals are urged to make use of this opportunity and evacuate using trains/vehicles or any other available means of transport giving due consideration to safety," the advisory said.

Earlier in the day, Union minister Hardeep Singh Singh Puri had confirmed that the evacuation process for Indian students stranded in Sumy has started and they are being taken in buses to Poltava.

"Last night, I checked with the control room, 694 Indian students were remaining in Sumy. Today, they have all left in buses for Poltava," Puri told reporters here.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi held discussions with Russian President Vladimir Putin and Ukrainian leader Volodymyr Zelenskyy on Monday on ways to start the stalled evacuation process of the Indian students from Sumy, which is being pum-melled by the invading Russian forces.

Sumy has been witnessing intense fighting between Russian and Ukrainian troops for days now. India had been making efforts to evacuate its citizens from the north-eastern Ukrainian city, but was facing the challenge of heavy shelling and air strikes. India has brought back over 17,100 of its nationals from Ukraine so far.

### Two responsible for...

(SIT) headed by Lakshay Sharma, SP South and SDPO Kothibagh Shabir Ahmed, SDPO Shaheed Gunj Shri Fayaz Hussain, DySP Faizan Ali, DySP (P) Anzar Shah, SHO PS Shaheed Gunj Insp. Gowhar Hussain and Insp. Taseer Ahmed as members.

The SIT employed modern means of investigation and used technical evidence like minute frame by frame analysis of the CCTV footages of scene of crime, footages of

CCTVs in the whole of Srinagar city, Cell Tower dump analysis, IP dump analysis, recreation of crime scene and by examination of some eye witnesses, officials said.

Based on these, the SIT was able to identify the two accused who came on a two wheeler without a number-plate to commit the crime and fled on the same vehicle after committing the terrorist act.

During the intense analysis of the CCTV trail in Srinagar city, the route adopted by both the accused was located back to Khanyar area of the downtown.

It further came out that these two accused had committed the terrorist act on the directions of active terrorists in the Kashmir valley, they said.

The plan was to attack the parked security vehicle but as the grenade was thrown from a moving two-wheeler, the target was missed and the grenade exploded in an adjacent crowded area where many road-side vendors and buyers were present.

It was also found that this particular area was chosen due to the omnipresent chaos and turbulent traffic in this stretch of area due to unorganised vendors and stalls on the road, the officials said.

There have been two other recent grenade attacks in this area -- the first one on August 10, 2021 and the second on January 25, 2022.

This act of grenade throwing created terror, panic and anguish among the masses in whole of Srinagar city.

Jammu and Kashmir police also requested all commercial establishments and shops to install CCTV cameras inside and outside of their establishments, according to the advisory issued by Deputy Commissioner Srinagar.

This will act as strong deterrence to all the anti-social elements.

IGP Kashmir Vijay Kumar has congratulated Srinagar Police for their strenuous efforts in cracking such heinous case of terror crime on civilians. He also reiterated that the whole terror module involved in the crime will be smashed as soon as possible.

In a related development, Pulwama Police along with 55RR and 182BN CRPF apprehended 03 terrorist associates linked with proscribed terrorist outfit LeT. They have been identified as Amir Nazir Hazar son of Nazir Ahmad Hazar resident of Wagam, Suhail Ahmad Bhat son of Ab Rashid Bhat and Nasir Hussain son of Bashir Ahmad Ganie both residents of Chinar Bagh Pulwama. Incriminating materials, including grenade and 13 rounds of AK 47 were recovered from their possession.

During the preliminary investigation, it was revealed that the arrested terrorist associates were acting as associates of terrorist Arif Hazar@ Rehan.

Accordingly, a case under relevant sections of law has been registered in Police Station Pulwama and further investigation is in progress.

Meanwhile, on receipt of a specific information about extortion activities in the general area of Srinagar, one extortionist identified as Muzaffer Ahmad Rather son of Mohd Altaf Rather resident of Laloo Sheeshgaribagh Humhama Budgam was arrested from Shergarhi area of Srinagar. A small weapon was also recovered from his possession.

He was extorting money from people by instilling fear in them due to possession of this small weapon. In this regard, a case vide FIR number 31/2021 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Shergarhi and investigation was initiated.

### 46 stranded passengers...

Courier transported 111 people while Mi-172 Pawan Hans helicopter flew 35 to their destinations. As many as 41 people were flown from Jammu to Kargil and 12 from Kargil to Jammu, they said.

Similarly, AN-32 aircraft flew 16 people from Kargil to Srinagar and 42 from Srinagar to Kargil, they said.

The Mi-172 Pawan Hans helicopter transported 32 from Srinagar to Kargil and three from Leh to Kargil. The IAF has been operating C-17, C-130 and AN-32 aircraft regularly to airlift stranded passengers in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh due to the closure of the 434-km Srinagar-Leh national highway owing to heavy snowfall in January.

involved in civilian killings and grenade-throwing incidents, were busted last year, while half-a-dozen modules were neutralised in Jammu and Kishtwar in the Jammu zone. Several other modules in Kashmir's Awantipora, Ganderbal, Sopore, Baramulla and Anantnag were busted this year.

Asked about the details of a liquid that was seized along with arms and ammunition after being dropped by a Pakistani drone in Jammu's R S Pura sector last month, Singh said the forensic report has confirmed that it was a liquid explosive.

"The Jammu police, headed by Additional Director General of Police Mukesh Singh, is thwarting conspiracies from across the border (to smuggle weapons and narcotics). We are working with different agencies and have also seized some more material that have been sent for (a forensic) analysis. We will share the report once it is available," the DGP said.

He said the security grid along the border with Pakistan has been strengthened to stop the smuggling of narcotics and weapons into the Indian side.

"We have strengthened the security to completely stop the smuggling of drugs and weapons, which are being dropped by drones," Singh said.

Seeking the support of the public to wipe out the menace of drugs from the Union Territory, he said it is a bigger challenge than terrorism and police alone cannot fight it off.

"It is a big challenge and every section of the society, including youngsters, should come forward to help police fight this plague. We have seized big consignments and will continue our work, but we need support in tackling the menace," the DGP said.

He said police have launched a special drive against drugs in every district, while the zonal heads are monitoring at the zonal level and "with the support of people, this will be dealt with as well".

### India to resume...

Air bubble arrangements will also stand revoked thereafter, he said.

In an air bubble arrangement formed between two nations, carriers of each country are allowed to operate a limited number of international flights to other's territory with specific restrictions.

According to the Union health ministry, India on Tuesday reported 3,993 fresh coronavirus infections -- the lowest in 662 days.

In a statement, the MoCA said that international operations from March 27 will be subject to strict adherence to Union health ministry guidelines that were issued on February 10.

"After having recognised the increased vaccination coverage across the globe and in consultation with stakeholders, the Government of India has decided to resume scheduled commercial international passenger services to and from India from March 27, 2022, i.e. start of summer schedule 2022," it said.

The suspension of scheduled commercial international passenger services to and from India, thus, stands extended only up to 23:59 hrs (Indian standard time) on

Stolen property including 5 golden rings, a Pendulum and other essential items etc were recovered from his possession. He was shifted to Police Station where he remained in custody.

violent insurgency. Baloch insurgent groups have previously carried out several attacks targeting the China-Pakistan Economic Corridor (CPEC) projects and security personnel in the region.

According to local media reports, the blast took place after President Alvi, who had attended the annual festival, had left the area.

"The blast took place 30 minutes after President Alvi attended the festival in Sibi," Counter-Terrorism Department official Hafeez Rind was quoted as saying by Dawn newspaper.

Rind said that it appeared to be a suicide blast. However, the investigation was underway.

At least 28 injured were brought to the Civil Hospital, while five of them were in critical condition, Coordinator Balochistan Health Department Dr Wasim Baig said.

Medical Superintendent Civil Hospital Dr Sarwar Hashmi said that most of the injured were security personnel. Five of the critically injured were moved to Quetta, the provincial capital, Hashmi added.

Balochistan Chief Minister Mir Abdul Quddus Bizenjo strongly condemned the attack and directed authorities to provide the best possible medical treatment to those injured in the explosion.

On Friday, an ISIS suicide bomber blew himself up inside a Shia mosque in Peshawar during congregation, killing 63 people and wounding over 200 others.

On March 2, a bomb exploded near a police van in Quetta's Fatima Jinnah Road, killing three people, including a senior police officer, and injuring 24 others.

At least 20 militants and nine soldiers were killed in the attack on security forces in Balochistan's Panjgur and Naushki area on February 2.

## ATM fraud, burglary cases solved; 7 arrested, stolen property recovered

SRINAGAR: Police on Tuesday arrested 7 burglars/fraudsters in Kulgam, Bandipora & Tral and recovered ATM cards & other stolen items worth lakhs from their possession.

As per details, on February 14, 2022, Police Station Kulgam received a written complaint from one Arshad Ahmad Parray, resident of Chattabal stating therein that on February 6, 2022, his father visited an ATM at main branch J&K Bank Kulgam and handed over ATM card to an unknown person, requesting him to withdraw cash from his account and accordingly shared his ATM PIN. The aforesaid person after withdrawing cash, exchanged the card and thereafter withdrew a sum of Rs 40,000 from account of complainant's father. Subsequently, FIR No. 19/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Kulgam and investigation initiated, during which officers zeroed in on 4 suspects identified as Sohail Ahmad Wani, son of Mubarak Ahmad Wani, (ATM Exchanger), Wasim Ahmad Ganai, son of Abdul Gani Ganai, both residents of Rangrezpora Kulgam, Adnan Ahmad Ahangar, son of Ghulam Ahmed Ahangar, resident of Ziyarat Gali Kulgam and Umar Yaqoob Naik, son of Mohd Yaqoob Naik, resident of Khuloora Malwan. During questioning, they confessed their involvement in different burglaries & other offences. On their disclosure, 6 ATM Cards, 6 mobile phones and cash amounting to Rs 15,000 was recovered. Accordingly, all accused were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Further investigation of the case is going on and more recoveries & arrests are expected.

In Bandipora, on March 6, 2022 Police Station Bandipora received a complaint from one Mohammad Hamza Lone, son of Ayat Mohammad Lone, resident of Mehoobul Alam Colony Kaloosa, Bandipora stating therein that some thieves targeted his house and decamped with goods worth lakhs. Accordingly, FIR No. 34/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Bandipora and investigation was initiated.

During the course of investigation, a special investigation team headed by SHO
