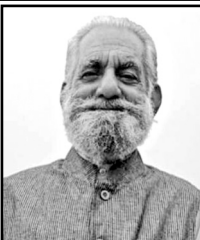

CRIME REPORT

Accused of blackmailing & kidnapping sent on judicial remand

SAMBHA: An accused arrested by Special Investigation Team (SIT) constituted by SSP Samba Benam Tosh in sensational case of blackmailing & kidnapping of a girl student of Govt Degree College Samba and resident of Sumb (Samba), whose dead body was later found in Ludhiana, has been sent to jail on judicial remand. The girl student happened to be a brilliant distinction-holder having excellence in academic as well as sports activities and had won several rewards and medals. On August 20, 2022, she attended GDC Samba but did not return home and next day, news regarding her dead body lying in Ludhiana under mysterious circumstances spread panic in her native village Sumb and adjoining areas, after which people held strong protests demanding in-depth investigation.

During Police-Public meeting held by SSP Samba Benam Tosh at Sumb, people demanded fair probe to unravel facts of the case and arrest of accused involved in heinous crime. Subsequently, on directions of Court of Chief-Judicial Magistrate Samba, FIR was registered at Police Station Samba and Senior Superintendent of Police Samba constituted a SIT led by Deputy SP Priyanka Kumari (SDPO Vijaypur) with Senior Prosecuting Officer Gurpreet Kour; SHO Samba Rajeshwar Singh and In-Charge Police Post Rakh Amb Talli Ravinder Singh as members, which arrested accused Sunil Kumar Sharma.

2 dumpers seized for illegal mining

KATHUA: Acting sternly against illegal mining within district, Kathua Police seized 2 dumpers indulged in illegal transportation of construction material at Nagri Parole area.

The drug peddlers have been lodged in Central Jail Kot-Balwal Jail Jammu.

5 vehicles seized, 5 arrested for illegal mining

BARAMULLA: Acting tough against persons involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals, police on Wednesday seized 5 vehicles and arrested 5 persons in Baramulla. As per the details, a party headed by In-Charge Police Post Kungumudara and In-Charge Police Post Mirgund under the supervision of SDPO Pattan Mohd Navaz seized three vehicles (tractors) and arrested three persons at Kanisuth Colony Mirgund & Goom Ahmadpora Pattan for their involvement in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals. The accused drivers have been identified as Sajad Ahmad Bhat son of Gh Ahmad Bhat resident of Khanpeth, Javid Ahmad Khan son of Assadullah Khan resident of Singhpora and Rayees Ahmad Wani son of Gh Hassan Wani resident of Goom Ahmadpora.

Similarly, officers from Police Station Kreeeri under the supervision of SDPO Kreeeri Khalid Ashraf seized 2 vehicles (tractors) and arrested two persons identified as Muneer Ahmad Dar son of Nazir Ahmad & Muneer Ahmad Ganie son of Gh Mohiuddin Ganie, both residents of Shrakwara, at Shrakwara Kreeeri for illegally extracting and transportation of minerals. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law have been registered in respective Police Stations and investigation have been initiated.

Market checking drive carried out in Ramban, Rs 7,300 fine realized

RAMBAN: Various enforcement agencies carried out massive checking drive at various places in Ramban district on directions of Deputy Commissioner; Mussarat Islam. The Legal Metrology Department also conducted market checking at various places including Nashri, Chhampa and Batote area. They realised Rs 2000 from erring traders for violation of the Legal Metrology Act.

3 shops sealed for violation of Essential Commodities Act

SRINAGAR: The Enforcement squad of FCS&CA Department headed by Assistant Director Enforcement launched a massive drive within the vicinity of Srinagar City during the current month amid complaints pouring in from various corners. During the course of action 355 erring traders were penalised with a sum of Rs 2,40,400 in District Srinagar. Besides, three mutton shops have been sealed for violation of the Essential Commodities Act, 1955.

It pertinent to mention here that during the current financial year in the entire valley, an amount of Rs 11019280 has been collected as fine from 23730 erring traders. Besides, 401 establishments

10 vehicles involved in illegal mining seized

Bootlegger arrested; 36 bottles of illicit liquor recovered
