Vill. Logate Kathua, its MD Rajinder Kumar, Parveen Kumar (Director), Baljinder Singh (Director), Anil Kumar (Director) and others unknown.

As per the FIR, it was alleged that the accused persons have perpetrated bank loan fraud amounting to approx. Rs. 200 Cr with consortium of banks with lead bank as State Bank of India other banks being J&K Bank, PNB and Karur Vysya Bank. The said FIR was registered on the basis of complaint reference letter No. SAMB Ldh/T-2/2052 dated 11.02.2020 filed by Shri Jagdish Lal, the then Deputy General Manager, Stressed Asset Management Branch, State Bank of India, Ludhiana, Punjab before ACB CBI Jammu for the offence of criminal conspiracy, cheating, Criminal Breach of trust and Criminal Misconduct

On the basis of the afore-stated FIR, Investigation under the provisions of Prevention of Money Laundering Act, 2002 (PMLA) was initiated by this Directorate after recording of an ECIR bearing No. ECfR/JMSZO/02/2023 dated March 31, 2023. Justice Sanjay Dhar after hearing both the sides observed that in the instant case, the Case Diary that has been produced by the DSGI would reveal that the grounds of arrest have been furnished to the petitioner immediately after his arrest. However, a perusal of the impugned Order of Remand passed by the Special Judge, PMLA reveals that it is nowhere recorded in the said order as to whether or not the grounds of arrest have been furnished to the petitioner. The Special Judge has simply recorded that she has carefully perused the Case Diary and entire material on record and because investigation of the case is at initial stage and the accused is involved in a serious non bailable and economic offence, as such, he is remanded to custody of the Enforcement Directorate. The Judge has not even recorded a finding as to whether or not she has perused the grounds of arrest so as to ascertain whether the ED had recorded reasons to believe that the petitioner was guilty of an offence under PMLA and whether or not there was proper compliance with the mandate of Section 19 of the PMLA. In view of this, Court is of prima facie view that the impugned order dated 07.02.2024 passed by the Special Judge, PMLA smacks of non application of mind. For all what has been discussed hereinbefore, the petitioner has been able to carve out a case for grant of interim relief. Accordingly, the petitioner is directed to be released from custody in the subject ECIR, provided he fulfils the following conditions that he shall furnish bail bond with two sureties in the amount of 1 Rs. 1.00 lac each to the satisfaction of the Special Judge designated under PMLA, Jammu. He shall cooperate with the respondent during investigation of the case and he shall not hamper or tamper with the evidence. He shall deposit his passport with Assistant Director, Enforcement Directorate Jammu and shall undertake that he shall not leave the limits of the country without prior permission of the Special Judge.

Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of sub-section (1) of subsection (2) shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to six months, or with fine which may extend to two thousand rupees or with both. It is, therefore, enjoyed upon all the printers and publishers to indicate clearly in the print line the names and addresses of printer and publisher of any election pamphlet or posters or such other material printed by them. Besides, all printing presses have to send the copies or the printed mate rial (along with three extra copies of each such printed material) and the declaration obtained from the publisher as required under section 127-A (2) with in three days of its printing. Also, any violation of the provisions of section 127-A (2) and the above directions of the Commission would be viewed seriously and stern action, which may in appropriate cases include even revocation of license of printing press under relevant laws of the state, would be taken.

Before undertaking the printing of any election pamphlets or poster etc printer shall obtain from the publisher a declaration in terms of section 127-A(2) in the proforma prescribed by the Commission in Append IX-A hereto this declaration shall be fully signed by the publisher and attested by two persons to whom the publisher is personally known. It should also be authenticated ed by the printer when it is forwarded to the Chief Electoral Officer or District Magistrate, as the case may be. Likewise, the printer shall furnish four (4) copies of the printed material, along with declaration of the publisher, within three (3) days of the printing thereof, along with such printed material and the declaration. The printer shall also furnish the information regarding the number of copies of documents printed and the price charged for such printing job in the proforma prescribed by the Commission in Appendix-B hereto. Such information shall be furnished by the printer, not collectively but separately, in respect of each election pamphlet poster etc., printed by him within three days

Rise of China, unsettled borders will be most formidable challenge for India: CDS

PUNE: Chief of Defence Staff General Anil Chauhan on Monday said the unsettled borders with China and the rise of that country will remain the most formidable challenge for India and its armed forces in the foreseeable future.

Speaking at the 3rd Strategic and Security Dialogue on the Rise of China and its implications for the world, General Chauhan emphasised the need for astute handling of the PLA (People's Liberation Army) at all friction points concerning the disputed bor-

General Chauhan said India has disputed borders with neighbours and these conflicts have led to the emergence of terms like the Line of Actual Control, Line of Control, and Actual Ground Position Line.

"The unsettled borders with China and the rise of China will remain the most formidable challenge that India and the Indian armed forces will face in the foreseeable future," the Chief of Defence Staff said.

He said the armed forces need to maintain the legitimacy of India's claims during peacetime on these disputed borders, which will require "very astute handling of the

points, calibrated firmness, and both sides to operate within the ambit of agreed rules of engagement".

The top commander further said that like all disputed borders, there will be a tendency by the adversary to create new facts or markers, toponymy (the study of place names), cartographic aggres-

"This again will have to be countered collectively by all of us at all levels, which academicians, thinkers, and strategists," the Chief of Defence Staff said.

General Chauhan referred to External Affairs Minister S. Jaishankar's statement wherein he had said that there is more to the Sino-India relations than the border disputes.

"Similarly, in an increasingly inter-connected world, Sino-India relations cannot be viewed in a binary kind of perspective. The rise of China affects other nations as well, and we must look at like-minded nations for an equitable balance while remaining cognisant of the fact that one must be prepared to fight its own battle," the Chief of Defence Staff said. Speaking about the challenges related to technology, General Chauhan said as technology emerges as the new currency of power, there is a tendency of nations to deny competitors.

"Technology denial regimes existed in the past, but what we are witnessing now is a race to retain technological edge. India cannot afford the emergence of a major technological gap between us and our immediate adversaries, and that would be fatal for us," the Chief of Defence Staff said.

He said this "battle of increasing technological gap' has to be fought not only by soldiers but also by academcs, scientists, and everyone as a nation together. General Chauhan also spoke

about the challenge of rising fragility and the outcome of political, social, and economic stability in the immediate neighbourhood.

"India seems to be the only island of stability in a sea of turmoil and turbulence. Political, social, and economic instability in countries in our immediate neighbourhood make them vulnerable to foreign influence." he said.

General Chauhan further said adversaries in the past have taken advantage of this situation, thereby increasing India's vulnerability and security problems, which is a
