AJHLA seeks Govt's support in revitalizing tourism industry in Jammu

JAMMU: The meeting of the office bearers of the All Jammu Hotels and Lodges Association (AJHLA) highlighted several critical issues concerning the tourism industry in Jammu.
The chairman, Inderjeet Khajuria, expressed serious concern over the neglect of Jammu as an independent tourism destination by the J&K government.
"This neglect has led to a severe downturn in business for hoteliers and other stakeholders in the tourism industry," he said. Pawan Gupta, President of the Association, welcomed the government's decision to hold the Shri Amarnath Ji Yatra for 52 days this year. He appreciated the efforts to enhance security arrangements, widen tracks, and simplify registration processes for the pilgrimage.
While praising security arrangements for the pilgrimage, he also raised concerns regarding the longevity of the Natural Ice Lingam, a significant aspect of the pilgrimage.
The deployment of additional paramilitary forces for the pilgrimage was noted, but attention was drawn to the need for measures to protect the natural ice Lingam from melting due to various factors, including the influx of devotees and helicopter flights, he said.
The association proposed using a curtain raiser or glass slab to maintain the temperature near the natural ice Lingam, citing a report from 2003 by IIT and DRDO.

Gupta emphasized the importance of infrastructure development, such as new tunnels and roads along the Shri Amarnath Ji route. These developments would not only shorten the distance of the pilgrimage but also make it more convenient for devotees, he added.
The extension of the train service to Katra was noted as a factor contributing to the decline in tourism in Jammu. Many pilgrims visiting Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Ji now bypass Jammu altogether, he said.
With the upcoming direct connectivity between Kashmir and the rest of India, association members raised concerns about the further decline in tourism to Jammu.
The association fears that without government intervention, Jammu could be wiped out from the tourism map.
The association appealed to the government to take necessary measures to develop Jammu as an independent tourist destination.
They emphasized the importance of government support in revitalizing the tourism industry in Jammu.
The meeting highlighted the urgent need for government intervention to address the challenges facing the tourism industry in Jammu and ensure the prosperity of the region's tourism sector.
Other office bearers present in the meeting were M L Sharma, Anil Khajuria, Pritam Sharma, H S Manhas, Baldev Raj, Sunil Suri, Swarn Singh and Varun Gupta.
