Rohit Rattan, Associate Coordinator, Western Himalayas Program, WWF-India, chaired the second session. He said that the twin UTs of J&K and Ladakh are divided into three main geographical regions namely the Pir Panjal, the Zanskar and the middle mountain of Lesser Himalaya.
