JAMMU: Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Monday stated that the controversial fashion show at the famous skiing resort of Gulmarg was organized by a private party at a private hotel, with no involvement of the government at any stage. The Chief Minister, who is

also the Leader of the Legislative Assembly, made this statement in response to concerns raised by various members regarding the controversial event held during the holy month of Ramadan.

Informing the House about the matter, he said, "An inquiry into the matter was promptly initiated, and some preliminary findings have come to light.

Providing further details, the Chief Minister stated that a fashion show was organized by a private entity on March 7 as part of a fourday event.





tinction in various judicial capacities, demonstrating profound legal acumen and dedication to the rule of law. Justice Mohammad Yousuf Wani began his legal career in 1990 and was appointed as Munsiff in December 1997. He was promoted to Sub Judge in 2000 and to District & Sessions Judge in 2008. Throughout his tenure, Justice Wani has held various significant positions, including Member (Judicial) of the J&K Special Tribunal in Srinagar. His elevation to Additional Judge of the High Court was
