JAMMU: The Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, which is leaving no stone unturned in carving a space on the country's sports map, is all set to win a record haul of medals in the National School Games (NSG) this season, as a total of 49 medals have already been clinched by our athletes in various sports disciplines, while around 40-50 medals are expected to to be secured in the remaining events, which include the medal winning sports disciplines like Roller Skating, Thang-ta, Football and Gatka etc.

This was stated by Rajinder Singh Tara. Director General Youth Services and Sports while reviewing the achievements and activities of the Department.

He said around 1700 athletes drawn from various districts of the Union Territory have already taken part in the National School Games (NSG) so far in this



season, while 500 more athletes are expected to rub their shoulders with their counterparts from the other States/UTs in various disciplines of sports at the National School Games "Jammu and Kashmir has won 49 medals so far in National School Games this year with 10 Gold, 17 Silver and 22 Bronze medals. Moreover, we are expected a good haul of medals in the remaining events as they include the medal winning disciplines,"

Jammu and Kashmir has so far won 16 medals in Fencing with 3 Gold, 5 Silver and 8 Bronze; 15 medals in Wushu with 5 Gold, 6 Silver and 4 Bronze; 7 medals in Judo with 4 Silver and 3 Bronze; 4 medals in Taekwondo with 1 Gold, 1 Silver and 2 Bronze; 3 medals in Soft Tennis with 1 Silver and 2 Bronze: 2 medals in Gymnastics with 2 Bronze and 2 medals in Weightlifting with 1 Gold events in 34 disciplines of the national scene.

and 1 Bronze medal.

"Out of a total of 49 medals, the athletes from Division have bagged 30 medals, while the remaining 19 medals have been clinched by the athletes from Kashmir Division. If we talk of District-wise medal tally, Jammu District has bagged a total of 27 medals with 5 Gold, 8 Silver and 14 Bronze; while District Srinagar has clinched 9 medals with 3 Gold, 3 Silver and 3 Bronze; Budgam has secured 5 medals with 1 Gold, 1 Silver and 3 Bronze and District Ganderbal has won 2 medals with 2 Silver, while rest of the Districts including Udhampur, Anantnag, Poonch, Shopian, Reasi and Baramulla have claimed 1 medal each," informed Tara.

It is pertinent to mention here that out of 1641 athletes who have represented J&K at the National School Games 2024-25 in 156 events out of a total of 194 in different age groups of Wrestling, 36 in Football, 72 in Volleyball, 52 in Judo, 69 in Fencing, 41 in Yoga, 48 in Kho-Kho, 30 in Badminton, 72 in Rugby, 97 in Athletics, 20 in TT, 40 in Archery, 32 in Cricket, 26 in Boxing, Taekwondo,108 in Hockey, 40 in Gymnastics, 96 in Handball, 62 in Karate, 11 in Weightlifting, 51 in Shooting, 72 in Basketball, 96 in Softball, 72 in Kabaddi, 30 in Chess, 72 in Netball, 63 in Swimming, 61 in Baseball, 39 in Wushu, 30 in Soft Tennis
