In a statement, police spokesperson said, Police Station Kund on February 17, 2025 received a written complaint from a person Namely Manzoor Ahmad Bakerwal, resident of Koka Basti Nageenpora Nard that his daughter (name withheld) was missing at Koka Basti Nageenpora Kund.

Acting promptly upon the complaint Case with FIR No 03/2025 U/S 87,49 BNS was registered in Police Station Kund and investigation was set into motion.

On tip off a team headed by SHO Kund under the close supervision of ASP, and SDPO Quazigund constituted to rescue the kidnapped girl and to nab the culprit, spokesper son said.
