While technology improvements have unquestionably improved efficiency and convenience, they have also increased the amount of threats. In fact, these hazards are becoming so common that they are beginning to overshadow the advantages of digital technology.

Cybersecurity challenges have not only grown in number but also in complexity and variety. Addressing these challenges requires a greater emphasis, especially for

vulnerablepopulations, such as financially disadvantaged individuals who relvon many digital accounts for transactions. Cybersecurity dangers are increasing at an alarming rate, with terrorist groups platforms Telegram to recruit members and develop local networks. Furthermore, incidences of financial fraud, identity theft, and illegal trading are increasing, emphasizing the critical need for strong security

Further, she stressed how a large number of women have come forward to describe being targeted by

cybercrime, such as data theft and privacy breaches. These crimes vary from illegal access to personal information to increasingly serious kinds of digital harassment, emphasizing the critical need for greater cybersecurity and legislative safeguards to secure women's online safety and privacy.
