Confederation demands real Reservation Amendment All J&K Megh Sabha addresses SC Reservation concerns Bill 2025, warns of statewide agitation

JAMMU: The All India Confederation of SC/ST/OBC Organisations held a protest conference at Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Chowk, Jammu, demanding that the government introduce the Real Reservation Amendment Bill 2025 to ensure justice for marginalized communities.

Addressing the media, RK Kalsotra, State President of the Confederation, strongly condemned the recent viral draft of the Reservation Bill, calling it an attack on constitutional reservations. He warned that any attempt to dilute existing reservation policies would lead to mass protests. "The circulating proposal aims to weaken the funrights SC/ST/OBC communities, and we will not tolerate any such move," he stated.

The Confederation has put forth several key demands. They have called for an increase in reservation quotas, with SC reservation in recruitment and promotions raised from 8% to 10%, ST-1 reservation from 10% to 12%, and OBC reservation fixed at 27% in accordance with the Mandal Commission. Another critical demand is the immediate restoration of reservation in promotions for

employees, which has been pending for

Additionally, Confederation has urged the government to reinstate the five-year age relaxation for SC/ST candidates in employment and education, instead of the current three-year concession. They have also stressed the importance of clearing backlog vacancies, ensuring that all pending reserved SC/ST/OBC candidates in government employment are

A significant demand put forward is land rights for marginalized communities. The Confederation insists that government state lands should be returned to SC/ST/OBC communities and legal ownership granted to them. Furthermore, they are calling for a statewide and national caste census to ensure fair distribution of reservation and resources in proportion to population demographics.

Another major concern

raised is the vacant Scheduled Caste member post in the Jammu & Kashmir Public Service Commission (PSC), which has remained unfilled since December 2022.The Confederation demands that the government immediately appoint a representative to ensure fair participation in decision-making. Additionally, they have urged $_{
m the}$ Bodhgaya Monastery in Bihar be placed under the independent control of the Buddhist commu-

Apart from reservation concerns, the Confederation also highlighted the rising incidents of caste-based atrocities. Kalsotra mentioned specific cases, including the suicide of a tribal boy in Billawar and the rape of a minor Dalit girl in Kathua, as alarming instances of

crimes and ensure justice for

the victims Warning of escalating protests, Kalsotra declared that failure to address these demands would result in a statewide agitation. He emphasized SC/ST/OBC communities would not remain silent if their rights were tampered with. "Our fight is not just for reservations but for digni-

ty, equality, and justice. If the government does not act, we will take to the streets to protect our constitutional rights," he stated firmly.

The Confederation also urged opposition parties to support the Real Reservation Amendment Bill 2025 in the upcoming Assembly session. "Social justice is not a political issue: it is a constitutional responsibility. We call upon all opposition parties to stand with SC/ST/OBC communities and ensure that this bill is passed without any dilution," Kalsotra added.

As a final resolution, the Confederation unanimously decided that if the government fails to pass a pro-SC/ST/OBC bill, they will gherao the Assembly in the coming days as a marker of resistance.

The protest conference was

attended by several prominent leaders, including B.L. Bhardwaj, Ramesh Sarmal, Ramesh Uttama, Dr. Ramesh Kaith, Bansi Lal Ch., K.K. Fottra, Arif Ch., Rashpal Bhardwaj, Hurdutt, Shamsher Chand Bhagat, Roshan Ch., Amar Nath Bhagat, Mohinder Karlopia, Kuldeep Raj, Kasturi Lal Basotra, Dr. Shiv Pal Sarmal, Daulat Ram, and many others.

JAMMU: In a significant move to address concerns regarding the reservation rights of the Scheduled Caste (SC) community, a joint press conference was organized by the All J&K Megh Sabha under the leadership of its President, Narinder Datt.

The event witnessed the participation of prominent community leaders, including Parshotam Lal (President, Sarvara Sabha), Sham Lal Basson (General Secretary, Ravidas Sabha - Bahu Fort), Kali Dass (President, All J&K Mahasa Sabha), Captain Biru Ram (President, Barwala Sabha), and Prithvi Singh (President, Batwal Sabha).

During the conference, Narinder Datt addressed the media and urged the SC community not to panic over a recently circulated bill on social media regarding the reduction of SC reservation from 8% to 4%.

He clarified that the bill appears to be a private member bill, which may or may not be accepted by the concerned party.

While historical instances of reservation curtailment exist, he reassured the community that under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, and former

Minister Omar Abdullah, the SC community's rights and development remain a priority.

He expressed confidence in the capabilities of elected MLAs from the SC community, emphasizing their education, vigilance, and accountability. "They will never let history repeat itself, as every SC community member is watching and supporting them," he added. Narinder Datt strongly

appealed to SC MLAs to raise their voices in the legislative assembly, demanding an increase in the reservation percentage for the SC community from 8% to at least 15%. He also urged the government to consider reservation in promotions as per the Supreme Court's directives, highlighting that Jammu and Kashmir, as a Union Territory (UT), is solely responsible for implementing such policies.

Furthermore, he called upon the Lieutenant Governor and the Chief Minister to ensure the proper implementation and maintenance of the reservation roster. The press conference saw the participation of several key figures, including Kittin Singh, Rashmi Devi (City President), Premila Devi, Sapna Bhagat, Neelam Bhagat, Satya Devi, Narinder Singh, Amar Nath Bhagat, Rajinder Bhagat (Vice President), Ashok Bhagat, Rakesh Kumar (President. Doda), Anil Aryan, Romesh (Ex-Councilor, Doda City), Daulat Ram (President, Kishtwar), Baldev Singh (Ex-Sarpanch), and Rajesh Bhagat. The event marked a collective call for justice, equality, and empowerment for the SC community in Jammu and Kashmir, reinforcing the demand for a fair and equitable reservation policy in line with the region's UT status.

STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: The JammuProvince Bachao Manch (JBM), under the leadership of Senior Advocate Ashok Sharma, former MLA & MLC and Chairman, staged a powerful protest at Ambphalla, Jammu, to raise awareness about the devastating impact of Chitta, a deadly drug that has ravaged countless lives and families. The protest was aimed at urging the authorities to take strict measures to curb the menace that threatens the future of Jammu's youth.
