The inaugural ceremony, held at the Seminar Hall of the Department of Zoology, was graced by Prof. Umesh Rai, Vice Chancellor, JU, as the Chief Guest, and Prof. Yash Pal Sharma, Dean of Life Sciences, as the Guest of Honour and Convenor Prof. Seema Langer.

In his inaugural address, Prof. Umesh Rai underscored the significance of peace education in today's rapidly changing global land-

scape. However, he emphasized that peace cannot be attained solely through education; rather, it must be cultivated from within. He further highlighted that in an era where young minds are inundated with vast amounts of information, their learning process is often disrupted, leading to confusion and

Prof. Rai stressed the need for experiential learning, which allows students to engage more deeply with their education. With this vision, he introduced the "Design Your Degree" program at Jammu University and its affiliated colleges, focusing on experiential and immersive learning to ease

students' academic burdens. Additionally, he pointed out the critical need for role models in students' lives, particularly among teachers, a gap that he believes is prevalent in today's society.

The workshop designed and

conducted by Egra Foundation is rooted in experiential learning, emphasizing that peace is best understood through experience. It helps children grasp the essence of peace through training, personal stories, and shared experiences. The workshop promotes conscious and mindful living through peace education, personal growth, and community harmony. Participants engage in reflective activities, interactive discussions, and practical exercises to enhance emotional awareness. By fostering personal peace, they become catalysts for positive change in their relationships and communities.

Prof. BK Bajaj in his address emphasised the significance of peace in today's world, highlighting the prevailing chaos and conflict and also underscored the significance of mental well-being, especially in the context of rare genetic disorders and healthcare challenges.

Professor Yashpal highlighted a traditional approach to peace, emphasising the recitation of Gitas Shlokas. He also emphasised on the significance of interdisciplinary collaborations in promoting peace education.

Simran Kaur, co-founder and President of the EQRA Foundation, highlighted the organization's vision, origins, and mission in her address. Founded in 2020, the EQRA Foundation is a civil society organization committed to fostering conscious and mindful living through initiatives centered on Mental Health, Peace Education, and Religious Pluralism in

Reflecting on her journey, Kaur shared that in 2017, before establishing EQRA, she initially perceived peace as merely the absence of conflict. However, over time, she came to understand that true peace encompasses justice, equity, sustained harmony, and overall well-being.
