

Admin set to launch UT wide campaign against drug menace

CS reviews preparations with stakeholders to make it a big success

JAMMU: Chief Secretary, Atal Dulloo on Wednesday chaired a high level meeting to assess the preparations being made by the Information Department for a UT wide informational and educational campaign aimed at creating awareness about the hazards and prevention of drug abuse.

Present in the meeting were Principal Secretary, Home; Commissioner Secretary, Information & GAD; Commissioner Secretary, Social Welfare Department, Commissioner Secretary, H&UDD; Divisional Commissioner, Kashmir/Jammu; IGP, Kashmir/Jammu; IGP, Crime; Director, Information & PR; State Drug Controller and other concerned officers.

Deputy Commissioners attended the meeting from their Offices through video conferencing.

The Chief Secretary emphasized the importance of training resource persons at the district level to ensure that a pool of trained individuals is kept available to reach every block and pan-

chayat, fostering widespread awareness. He also directed for ensuring training of local officials in each block to act as counsellors, guiding the affected youth towards rehabilitation.

To enhance the campaign's effectiveness, Dulloo instructed for covering every panchayat and higher educational institution across the UT with proper documentation of attendance and activities. He further advised the involvement of Deputy Commissioners in identifying key locations to ensure meaningful grass-roots engagement of all the adult population there.

Highlighting the importance of clear communication, the Chief Secretary stressed the need for translating IEC (Information,

Education, and Communication) materials into all local languages being spoken in the UT. He also urged the Information Department to leverage the reach of Radio and Doordarshan to disseminate educational content in far-off areas, ensuring maximum outreach and participation of the citizens.

To maintain the momentum, he directed the Department to publish a monthly newsletter featuring success stories, preventive measures and legal actions taken against the drug dealers to act as a deterrent. Additionally, he called for creation of a district-wise calendar of activities, widely publicised in advance, so that people in each village are informed

about the campaign schedule and participating resource persons.

Commissioner Secretary Information Department, M. Raju, provided a detailed presentation on the planned implementation of the NashaMukt J&K Abhiyaan. He outlined that a short multilingual film would be showcased at every panchayat-level event, coordinated by designated nodal officers. The campaign will also feature interactive sessions with experts from the Health, Police, Excise, Social Welfare and Youth Services & Sports Departments, followed by Q&A sessions to engage the audience effectively.

To enhance the campaign's reach and impact, he made out that the Department will

collaborate with local influencers, including religious leaders and prominent community figures. Furthermore, individuals and families who have successfully overcome addiction will be publicly honoured as a source of inspiration for others, he added.

As part of the meeting, a short film on the ill effects of drug abuse was screened, which will be played at all campaign events. Additionally, the newly designed logo and web portal for Nasha Mukt J&K Abhiyaan were unveiled for feedback from the stakeholders.

Concluding the meeting, the Chief Secretary urged all stakeholders to play an active role in making the campaign a success, ensuring a lasting impact on the youth of J&K.

The discussions also focused on a strategic roadmap for complete eradication of drug abuse from the society, with a strong emphasis on rehabilitation and support for affected individuals without stigmatising them to live their lives happily ever after.

NEW DELHI: In a landmark decision to enhance transparency and fairness in departmental promotions, the Railway Board has announced that all such examinations will now be conducted centrally by the Railway Recruitment Board (RRB) through Computer-Based Tests (CBT). This new system will ensure uniformity and eliminate any scope for malpractice. All zonal railways will prepare an examination calendar, and tests will be conducted strictly as per schedule.

"Today, a high-level meeting was conducted by the Railway Board. It has been decided that all departmental promotion examinations will be done by RRB/centralised examination through CBT," a press statement from the Railway Ministry said.

This decision follows years of successful, transparent, and foolproof examinations conducted by the RRB. Since 2015, over 7 crore candidates have appeared for RRB exams without a single case of paper leakage, impersonation, remote log-in, or the use of spy devices. The remarkable integrity of these exams has set a new standard for conducting large-scale recruitment tests in India.

To ensure absolute fairness, the RRB follows a multi-layered security system in its examination process. The selection of exam-conducting agencies is done through an open tender following the Quality and Cost-Based Selection (QCBS) criteria. Agencies must meet ISO certifications, CERT-IN certification, CMMI certification, financial stability, and have

prior experience in conducting similar examinations.

All examination centres undergo rigorous auditing by railway teams based on a comprehensive security checklist. CCTV coverage with IP-based surveillance ensures high-resolution, uninterrupted monitoring, with recording beginning two hours before the exam and continuing one hour post-exam. To prevent external interference, exam centres are strategically located away from commercial and residential areas.

The technical infrastructure is designed to prevent any manipulation. Exam centres use high-security servers with encrypted data, and USB ports, internet access, and external devices are disabled. A proprietary operating system ensures a tamper-proof environment, and every mouse click and keystroke is recorded with a timestamp for audit purposes.

Strict authentication and security measures are in place for candidates. Biometric attendance (fingerprint & digital verification) is conducted before entry; during the exam, and post-exam. Candidates also submit handwriting samples at multiple stages. To eliminate impersonation, Aadhaar-based authentication is mandatory, and all candidates undergo frisking with hand-held metal detectors.

The RRB has implemented advanced question paper security measures to prevent leaks. Exam papers are encrypted using 256-bit encryption and are decrypted only when the candidate logs in. Every candidate receives a

unique randomized sequence of questions and options, ensuring no two candidates have the same order. A detailed log of every action taken during the exam is maintained for security and analysis.

A three-tier invigilation system is in place to monitor the examination process. The Exam Conducting Agency (ECA) team, Railway Officers & Supervisors, and Railway Vigilance Team work together to ensure strict compliance with examination protocols. Invigilation teams are shuffled periodically between different labs and centres to maintain fairness.

Transparency is further strengthened by allowing candidates to view their question paper, answer booklet, and correct answer keys post-exam. Additionally, candidates have the right to challenge any question or answer key, ensuring fairness in evaluation.

To prevent fraudulent applications, applications now feature a QR code to detect fake submissions, while admit cards include barcodes to verify the candidate's identity. Eligibility criteria such as caste certificates, photographs, signatures, and qualifications are cross-verified to prevent any discrepancies.

With these comprehensive measures, the Railway Board has reaffirmed its commitment to fair, transparent, and merit-based selections. The decision to centralize departmental promotion exams through CBT will enhance efficiency, eliminate bias, and ensure that deserving candidates advance in Indian Railways purely on the basis of merit.

BJP's Tahir Choudhary condemns NC's remarks on PoJK development, demands public apology

JAMMU: Senior Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader and spokesperson Dr. Tahir Choudhary strongly condemned remarks made by NC MLA Mir Saifullah regarding the development in Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK).

Addressing a press conference at the BJP headquarters, Dr. Choudhary criti-

cized Saifullah for allegedly praising PoJK's development and creating a misleading narrative.

"It is appalling that an elected representative would make such claims. The reality is that PoJK is facing severe economic distress, infrastructural collapse, and a lack of basic amenities.

There are continuous protests against Pakistan's administration, with people

waving Indian flags and demanding integration with India," he stated.

Dr. Choudhary also took dig at Chief Minister of Jammu and Kashmir Omar Abdullah, criticizing his remarks linking PoJK's alleged development to China's involvement. He demanded a public apology from Abdullah and the National Conference.

"Omar Abdullah must apologize to the people of Jammu and Kashmir for propagating misleading claims. The BJP will not tolerate such falsehoods aimed at distorting the truth. If necessary, we will take strong action against such statements," Dr. Choudhary asserted.

He further accused the National Conference of having a soft corner for Pakistan and China, citing the party's history of making statements that allegedly align with Pakistan's interests.

"The NC has always misled the people of Jammu and Kashmir. Their stance reflects an inclination towards Pakistan and China, undermining India's position on Jammu and Kashmir," he added.

Reiterating the BJP's unwavering commitment to the development and inte-

gration of Jammu and Kashmir, Dr. Choudhary affirmed, "The BJP will never compromise on the interests of Jammu and Kashmir or the Dogra community. We stand with the people and remain dedicated to their progress and prosperity."
