Seed, Fertilizer dealers sensitized to regulatory provisions

KATHUA: The dealers and retailers of Bashioli dealing in seeds, fertilizers and pesticides were today sensitized to the regulatory provisions governing the sale and distribution of agricultural inputs.

The meeting was convened by Law Enforcement Inspector Kathua Anil Gupta under the directions of Assistant Director Law Enforcement Jammu. The dealers were asked to ensure strict adherence to the provisions of the Seeds Act 1966, Fertilizer Control Order 1985 and the Insecticides Act 1968 along with the rules framed thereunder.

"The dealers and retailers need to prominently display the approved price list of all seeds, fertilizers and pesticides, issue proper bills or invoices for each and every sale and maintain accurate stock and sales registers as provided under the provisions of the Act," they were told. It was further emphasised that any deviation from or non-compliance with these instructions shall be viewed seriously and necessary action under the relevant provisions shall be initiated against the defaulting dealers and retailers without any further notice.

Subject:- Mandatory disclosures of details of tenants and employees working in private sector/ business establishments-regarding.

ORDER

- Whereas, the Senior Superintendent of Police, Jammu has brought to the notice of undersigned that there is an imminent need to conduct verification of tenants/domestic helpers and employees working in private sector/business establishments.
- Whereas, it is necessary that measures be taken to make the landlords/property owners/ business owners/ commercial establishment(s)/ shop owner(s) accountable before renting out/ hiring workers/ making available their premises to tenants/ domestic helpers/ workers; and
- Whereas, I consider the threat posed by any adverse elements as imminent danger to public safety and security that warrants immediate preventive measures under Section 163 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS);
- Now, therefore, for the reasons aforesaid, and by virtue of powers vested in me under Section 163 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita (BNSS), I, Dr. Rakesh Minhas, IAS, District Magistrate, Jammu do hereby order and require all landlord(s), owner(s) of properties, attorney holder(s), person(s) in charge of properties, contractors, business owner(s)/ commercial establishment(s)/shop owner(s) in any capacity (hereafter called as owners) located in entire jurisdiction of the District to comply strictly with the following directions:-
a) All owners shall after the issuance of this order within 07 days submit without fail the detailed particulars of the tenants/workers as per the Declaration Form (annexed herewith), to be signed by both the owner and the tenants/workers, to the concerned Police Station, either in person or by registered post addressed to the concerned Station House Officer (SHO).
b) The above mentioned category of persons mentioned at point number 02 who have already hired workers or let/sub-let/rented out their house(s) or part(s) thereof to any tenants/workers on any date prior to the issuance of this order, shall submit the detailed particulars of the tenants/workers as per the declaration form to the concerned Police Station within 07 days.
c) It is clarified that all arrangements of hiring workers as well as letting or sub-letting the property like Paying Guest, tenants etc; shall be covered by this order.
d) Every SHO in Jammu District shall maintain a separate register for such purpose.
5) Any person contravening this order shall be punishable under Section 223 of BNS.
6) As the notice cannot be served individually on all concerned, this order is hereby passed ex-parte. It is being promulgated for the information of public at large and shall be published on district website, leading newspapers and by affixing copies on the Notice Boards of the offices of Commissioner JMC, SSP Jammu, Vice Chairman JDA, all SDMs, all Tehsildars, all SDPOs, and all SHOs of Jammu District.
7) This order promulgated, shall come into force w.e.f 12th of March, 2026 and shall remain in force for the period of eight weeks, unless withdrawn earlier, and subject to further extension or modification. Any contravention of this order shall attract legal consequences as contemplated under Section 223 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS), 2023.
