# Highest single-day spike in J&K this year with 812 COVID cases

Control measures intensified in Jammu region, panels formed to check violations

JAMMU/SRINAGAR Jammu and Kashmir on Wednesday recorded its highest single-day spike this year as 812 new COVID-19 cases, including 257 travellers, taking the tally to 1,34,827, even as six fresh deaths due to the virus in the past 24 hours took the toll to 2,018, officials said.

Of the fresh cases, 347 were from Jammu division and 465 from Kashmir division of the Union territory,

This is the highest number of single day cases reported in Jammu and Kashmir this year so far.

The UT had less than 1 000 active cases on March 15 while the number of fresh cases crossed the three-digit mark from March 16.

The officials said Srinagar district recorded the highest of 238 cases, including 57 travellers, followed by 138 in Jammu and 79 in Udhampur

## **Search operation to trace hiding** terrorists in Srinagar outskirts

SRINAGAR: Security forces called off an overnight cordon and search operation at Gulab Bagh on the outskirts of Srinagar city as the terrorists believed to be hiding in a house had escaped, officials said on Wednesday.

Police and other security forces had launched the operation late on Tuesday night following information about presence of two terrorists there, the officials said.

They said as the forces closed in on the target house, the police offered a chance to the terrorists to surrender but there was no response. The security forces launched intensive house-to-house searches in the area on Wednesday morning but didn't find the ultras, the officials said.

They said the search operation was called off as the terrorists were believed to have escaped before the cordon was laid. Meanwhile, terrorists opened fire on security personnel in Shopian district this afternoon but there was no damage in the incident, officials said. The ultras opened fire on a mobile check party of the police and CRPF at Imamsahib in Shopian town around 3.20 pm, they added.

NEW DELHI: Union Minister of (Independent Development of North Eastern Region (DoNER), MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr. Jitendra Singh on Wednesday reviewed the measures undertaken by the Department of Personnel & Training (DoPT) to contain COVID spread, particularly in the wake of the recent spike in positive cases.

The meeting was attended, among others, by Union Secretary DoPT Deepak Khandekar, Union Secretary Administrative Reforms Indevar Pandey, Union Secretary and Establishment Officer K Srinivasan, Union Secretary Alok Ranjan, Secretary (Equivalent) Sujata Chaturyedi, Joint Secretary Pension S N Mathur and other senior officers in the Ministry of Personnel including DoPT, ARPG and Department of Pension.

Pertinent to mention that in view of the recent spike in COVID cases, DoPT has issued an Office Memorandum (OM) advising all the Central government employees of the age of 45 years and above to get themselves vaccinated so as to effec-

tively contain the spread of COVID-19. Such government employees are also further advised to continue to follow COVID-appropriate behaviour even after the vaccination, like frequent washing of hands/sanitisation, wearing a mask/face cover, observing

social distancing etc.

Briefing about the meeting, Dr Jitendra Singh said, Ministry of Personnel including the DoPT have been, from time to time, issuing instructions and preventive guidelines to contain the spread of COVID-19. He said, the government has been monitoring the situation very closely and based on the strategy adopted for prioritising vaccination, all persons of the age of 45 years and above can participate in the exercise. He said, it is imperative for all the government employees to avail of this vaccination facility in order to ensure their own safety as well as of those who come in their contact.
