SRINAGAR: A self-styled commander of Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) terror outfit, who was involved in several attacks on civilians including non-locals and security personnel, was killed in an encounter in Anantnag district on Saturday, police said.

The slain terrorist was identified as Nisar Ahmad Dar alias Musaib, resident of Redwani Bala, Kulgam, a police spokesman said.

NEW DELHI: CRPF ASI Mohan Lal, who was martyred while attempting to thwart the February 2019 Pulwama terror attack on a force bus, and NDRF Director General (DG) Atul Karwal were decorated with police gallantry medals at an event held here on Saturday. Union Home Secretary Ajay Bhalla pinned the medal on Karwal's uniform, while he gave the medal, awarded posthumously, to Lal's wife Sarita Devi during the "Valour Day" of the Central Reserve Police Force

Lal (50) was among the 40

personnel killed during the Pulwama attack on a CRPF bus on February 14, 2019.

He was the picket commander of the CRPF roadopening party deployed at milestone number 272, near BSNL tower in Pulwama's Lethpora along the Jammu-Srinagar highway, when the dastardly attack was carried out by proscribed terror outfit Jaish-e-Mohammed (JeM).

The car that rammed into the CRPF bus was being driven by suicide bomber Adil Ahmed Dar with about 200 kg of explosives stuffed inside. Lal's citation



'Got instructions from Pakistan' 13 arrested for sloganeering inside Jamia Masjid

SRINAGAR: Police Saturday arrested 13 persons, a day after 'Azadi' slogans were raised at the Jamia Masjid in Srinagar.

"Yesterday afternoon, there were Friday prayers in Jamia Masjid wherein huge number of gathering took place, around 24,000 persons attended the Friday prayers, which is among largest in recent history', a police spokesperson said.

After culmination of the prayers about a dozen persons started anti-national and provocative sloganeering for while, this was joined by a couple of others as well, while most of the gathering remained aloof. There was also altercation between the



persons indulging in sloganeering and the volunteers of intezamia committee of Jamia Masiid who tried to stop such sloganeering and

This created a situation of ruckus inside the mosque leading to clashes between them. Later the hooligans were dispersed outside the mosque by volunteers. Even

after coming outside from one gate, more than a dozen among them tried to provoke others by sloganeering which failed and in 2-3 minutes they dispersed in hurry seeing police presence around.
