Two LeT terrorists involved in attack on CRPF personnel killed in Srinagar

SRINAGAR: In a pinpoint intelligence operation, two Pakistani Lashkar-e-Taiba terrorists involved in the April 4 attack on CRPF personnel in the city, were killed while three security personnel got injured in an encounter here on Sunday, police said.

Inspector General of Police (IGP), Kashmir, Vijay Kumar said the police was tracking both the Pakistani terrorists from the day of the attack on the Central Police Force (CRPF) men on April 4, and the operation was launched on Sunday after pinpointing their location.

A police spokesman said at about 10:50 am, on specific input generated by Srinagar Police regarding the presence of terrorists in Bishembar Nagar area of the city, a cordon and search operation was launched by the police and Valley QAT CRPF there. He said as the search party

proceeded towards the suspect spot, the hiding terrorists fired indiscriminately upon search parties which was retaliated, leading to an encounter. In the initial

exchange of fire, one terrorist

was killed.

Keeping in view the tourist movement and huge rush in the area, police and CRPF exercised maximum restraint and carried out the operation in a professional manner to avoid any civilian causality, the spokesman said.

During the course of evacuation of civilians, the trapped terrorist hurled a grenade, injuries to two policemen and a CRPF Jawan who were shifted to hospital for treatment of their injuries, he

The operation was resumed and in the ensuing encounter, another hiding terrorist was killed and bodies of both the killed terrorists were recovered from the site of the encounter, the spokesman

Both the killed terrorists were Pakistanis and identified as Mohammad Bhai alias Abu Qasim, alias Mir Shoaib alias Mudassir, and Abu Arsalan alias Khalid

According to police records, both the killed terrorists were A' categorised and linked with proscribed terror outfit

While Mohammad Bhai was active since 2019, Abu Arsalan was active since year 2021 in Central Kashmir.

Both the killed terrorists had a history of terror crime cases, including pistol-borne attacks and grenade throwing incidents. They were also involved in an attack on CRPF personnel on April 4 in Maisuma area in which one CRPF jawan attained martyrdom and another got injured, he said.

The spokesman said both the killed terrorists were carrying fake Aadhaar cards to conceal their identity.

Meanwhile, IGP Kumar told reporters near the encounter site that the killing of the two terrorists is a huge success for the police and CRPF. I want to give a message that whoever

Precaution dose of COVID-19 vaccine rolled out at private centres

NEW DELHI: India on Sunday began administering precaution dose of COVID-19 vaccines to all aged above 18 years, who have completed nine months since the administration of their second dose, at private vaccina-

The Centre has told all states and UTs that the precaution dose will be of the same COVID-19 vaccine which has been used for administration of the first and second dose and that private vaccination centres can charge up to a maximum of Rs 150 per dose as service charge over and above the cost of the vaccine.

Union Health Secretary Rajesh Bhushan, who held an orientation meeting of all health secretaries of states and UTs on Saturday, also informed that no fresh registrations would be required for precaution dose as all due beneficiaries are already registered on CoWIN.

vaccinations will mandatorily be recorded on CoWIN platform and both the options of 'Online appointment' and 'Walk-in' registration and vaccination will be available at private Covid vaccination centres

Private CVCs will maintain the vaccination sites as per the guidelines issued earlier by the Ministry of Health.

"They can charge up to a maximum of Rs 150 per dose as service charge for vaccination over and above the cost of vaccine," Bhushan had

SRINAGAR: BSF Inspector General (IG) Raja Babu Singh on Sunday reviewed the security situation and operational preparedness of the troops deployed in Gurez Valley along the Line of Control (LoC) in Kashmir, a senior officer said.

He visited forward posts of the Border Security Force (BSF) and met troops.

He was briefed about the current security situation along the frontier.

In addition to the Army, the BSF is deployed along the LoC that is vulnerable to infiltration from Pakistan.

Gurez, a picturesque valley Kashmir's

Bandipora district, is located along the LoC and remains cut off from the rest of Kashmir Valley during winter months due to heavy snowfall.

The area is sensitive from the security point of view as it is vulnerable to terrorist infiltration from Pakistanoccupied Kashmir.

It is located at an altitude of 8,000 feet (2,400 metre) and is about 123 km from Srinagar.

The Kashmir frontier chief of the border guarding force also attended a public interaction and outreach programme in Davar village where the force distributed seeds and farming equipment among locals.

"All-round development of the remote border areas of Kashmir is the objective of BSF," Singh said.

The program was jointly inaugurated by the Director Agriculture Kashmir Chowdhary Mohammad Igbal and Inspector General Border Security Force (BSF). The program was attended by a huge gathering of farmers, officers from the Department and B.S.F.
