

MP Jugal Kishore inspects development of SAGY village Patrara; listens to people's issues

RAJOURI: Member Parliament, Jugal Kishore Sharma on Monday chaired a public outreach camp at the village Patrara of Sunderbani block and reviewed the progress of development works there.

It is pertinent to mention here that Village Patrara is being developed under Sansad Adarsh Gram Yojna with the implementation of several Central sponsored schemes.

At the outset, District Development Commissioner Rajouri, Vikas Kundal gave a brief about the physical and financial achievements in respect of the SAGY village Patrara.

Later, on the instructions of the MP, the officers shared the physical and financial achievements of their respective departments in the particular village.

On the complaint of the Public about the irregular water supply, the SE Jal Shakti Department said that a water supply scheme

under the Jal Jeevan Mission has been approved at an estimated cost of Rs 6.30 crore and the work on the said project would start soon.

Speaking at the meeting, the MP said that the goal of SAGY was to develop three Adarsh Grams or model villages complete with state of art facilities. The SAGY scheme encourages MPs to identify and develop one village hence, the village Patrara was selected for the year 2017-18. The MP also said that for SAGY separate funding is not provided so the public and Departments

officers to work collectively to ensure effective implementation of Central Schemes and generate massive awareness among the people so that they can avail the benefits of the same.

He asked the officers of different departments to organise special camps and sensitize the farmers and unemployed youth about the schemes so that Patrara village can be developed at 'Atam Nirbar Village'.

The MP also desired for installation of Solar Street lights for Patrara and asked the DDC to submit a proposal in the matter.

Later, the MP also inspected the departmental stalls, interacted with officers and also planted a sapling in the premises of the High School Patrara.

The Students drawn from different parts/schools of the district participated in the interactive session. They were made aware about the scholarship schemes and asked to submit the requisite documents on time for renewal and timely disbursement of the scholarship amount. Some students shared their feedback and thanked District Administration, UT Administration and the Govt. of India for providing assistance to the militancy victim.

Pertinently, National Foundation for Communal Harmony (NFCH) is an autonomous Organisation with the Ministry of Home Affairs which was registered in the year 1992 under societies

Registration Act, 1860. The major activity of the foundation is to implement programmes and projects for effective rehabilitation of the victim children of communal, caste, ethnic terrorism and any other form of violence/clashes. Under the project, victim children are provided assistance for education and promoting communal harmony and national integration through different promotional activities. While giving details about the project, District Social Welfare Officer Kishtwar, Mr Tariq Parveez Qazi informed that in district Kishtwar a total of 176 children have been assisted by NFCH, "Out of 176 assisted children in Kishtwar and 103 have come out of the scheme after attaining 25 years of age and 73 children are still on the live registration" he added. While giving details of revised scale of assistance, the DSWO informed that the monthly assistance per child effective from April 1, 2018 is Rs 1250 for those studying up to class XII, Rs 1500 per month for those doing graduation/post graduation and Rs 1750 per month for professional courses like Medical, Engineering and Management.

DM Doda seeks effective implementation of NTEP

DODA: A meeting of District Registering Authority under Clinical Establishments and District Advisory Committee on Pre-Conception and Prenatal Diagnosis Techniques (PC & PNDT) was held under the chairmanship of District Magistrate Doda Vikas Sharma here in mini meeting hall of DC office complex Doda.

The meeting also reviewed the achievements under National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme (NTEP) in the district.

It was informed that 34 applications have been received online for provisional registration of clinical establishments in the district. The Chairman (DM) directed to constitute a sub committee comprising Assistant Commissioner Panchayat Doda, District Information Officer Doda and one member nominated by CMO, who shall conduct basic exercise and scrutinize the applications received online. "The Committee shall submit its findings before the Registering Authority within seven days for further course of action", he said.

The District Magistrate asked the members to follow proper procedure while dealing with applications for grant of provisional registrations. He asked them to devise a proper format for requisitions with all descriptions.

Meanwhile, the DM also chaired a meeting of the District Advisory Committee (DAC) on Pre-Conception and Pre-Natal Diagnostic Techniques (PC&PNDT) Act.

The DC, who is also Chairman of District Advisory Committee, asked to re-designate the committee members in terms of Govt order number 502-HME of 2011. The Committee discussed the means to check the illegal sex determination which is main cause of female foeticide and imbalanced sex

ratio in the district.

The DAC reiterated that awareness among the Health workers and people regarding the Act through workshops, awareness camps and other promotional activities must be carried out to reduce the incidence of female foeticide.

The meeting was informed that a total of 8 Ultrasound Centres were registered in the district which are all functional.

It was also unanimously resolved that frequent and surprise checking of Ultrasound centre is required by the designated Committee to have a close eye on their activities and control illegal testing.

The DM asked the Committee to take necessary action in case of complaints filed against any diagnostic centres for non-compliance

of the Act and cancel the registrations with due public notice.

Besides, the DM also reviewed the achievements under the National Tuberculosis Elimination Programme, Har Ghar Dastak and Tuberculosis Mukht Panchayats. He directed the concerned to increase the activities and sampling in the district. He asked for effective implementation of the Har Ghar Dastak campaign on the ground by ensuring that the field functionaries visit every house for health survey/ health check up. The field functionaries must take samples and guide the public on TB disease.

He directed the DTO and CMO to take Block wise review on NTEP and gear up their efforts to make Panchayats of our district TB free.

The meeting was attended by the CPO Doda, ACP Doda, CMO Doda, Dr Madhu Kapoor AP Gynecology department GMC Doda, DSWO Doda, Dy. SP DAR Doda, DIO Doda, AMO Ayush Doda, MS Associated Hospital GMC Doda and other health officials.
