## Another targeted terror attack in Kashmir: Civilian shot dead

SRINAGAR: Terrorists shot dead a civilian in Kulgam district in the Kashmir Valley on Wednesday, officials said here.

Satish Kumar Singh, a Rajput, was shot by terrorists in Kakran area of the south Kashmir district at around 7.30 pm.

Officials said the two police personnel posted at his house rushed out after hearing gunfire and found Singh in a pool of blood.

Fifty-five-year-old Singh, who received one bullet in the head and two in the chest, was taken to a hospital in

Srinagar where he died.

"Civilian Satish Kumar Singh, a resident of Kulgam, succumbed to his injuries at hospital. Terrorists involved in this gruesome terror crime will be neutralised soon. Search to track the involved terrorists in progress," the police said in a tweet.

Officials suspect that a new recruit of the Lashkar-e-Taiba terror group was involved in the attack.

Kulgam and Shopian districts have small pockets with Rajput families who have not migrated out of Jammu and Kashmir. They are mainly into apple business.

JAMMU: The sleuths of Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) caught three officials of Kashmir Power Distribution Corporation Limited (KPDCL) namely Masood Ahmad and Gh Mohd Bhat (Junior Engineers) and Inspector Ab Rashid Bhat (A Meter-Reader) of Special Sub-Division, KPDCL Tangmarg for demanding and accepting bribe of Rs 2, 60,000.

As per an official spokesperson, the ACB received a complaint from a resident of village Gofbal

Kunzer, tehsil Kunzer, district Baramulla alleging therein that that his father is proprietor of a manufacturing unit situated at Gofbal Kunzer. The complainant alleged that he had applied for upgrading the electricity consumption/ sanction load from present 63 KV to 250 KV on Nov, 2021. The officials namely Masood Ahmad, Gh Mohd Bhat (Junior Engineers) and Inspector Ab Rashid Bhat (Meter-Reader) demanded huge amount as

bribe for processing of file for upgrading the load and finally the matter was settled for Rs 2,60,000 as bribe for completing work.

"Accordingly, FIR 12/2022 under section 7 of PC Act 1988 was registered in Police Station ACB Baramulla and investigation started, during which a trap team constituted, which caught the erring officials Masood Ahmad, Gh Mohd Bhat, and Ab Rashid Bhat red-handed

## Investment in armed forces shouldn't be seen as burden on economy: Gen Naravane

GANDHINAGAR: The expenditure on the armed forces is an investment on which one gets full returns and it should not be seen as a burden on the economy, Chief of Army Staff General M M Naravane said on Wednesday.

A nation can survive the shocks that wipe out the share market and leaves thousands of investors bankrupt only when the armed forces of that country are strong, he said addressing a gathering after releasing a book, titled 'Fifty Years of 1971 War: Accounts from Veterans', at the Rashtriya Raksha University.

The book is compiled by the university and contains a



message by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The book is an outcome of a series of webinars organised at the university and deals with various aspects of the 1971 war.

General Naravane's comments have come at a time when Russia and Ukraine are engaged in a war and

there is eastern Ladakh border standoff between the India and China.

"Whenever we talk about the armed forces, and whenever we talk about investments and expenditures made for the armed forces, we should see this as an investment -- an investment

on which you get full returns, and it should not be seen as a burden on the economy," the Army chief said.

He said one has seen how the economy suffers whenever there is a crisis.

"The moment there is a war anywhere, whenever there is instability in a region, straightaway you can see the impact on the shares, on the stock market," he said.

Surviving such kinds of shock can only happen if the armed forces of the country are strong, he said.

While the armed forces play a major part in the security of a nation, other organs of the state play an equally important role, he noted.

"All of us are equal
