### Another targeted terror...

Kashmir over the last seven months.

The targeted killings had started in October, the victims being mostly migrants from outside Jammu and Kashmir who came in search of jobs.

In October, seven civilians were killed in five days -- among them a Kashmiri Pandit, a Sikh and two non-local Hindus.

Security forces have intensified their operations and launched a major crackdown on alleged separatist supporters.

The Congress has the BJP-led Centre of failing to protect the people.

"The situation in Jammu and Kashmir is getting worse with every passing day and both Kashmir and Kashmiriyat are in danger. No one knows where the BJP, which has been doing politics in the name of Kashmir for years, is missing nowadays," the Congress had tweeted.

continuously making attempts to disturb peace (in Jammu and Kashmir)," Lt General Singh said, replying to a query about the possibility of increased infiltration attempts from Pakistan with the melting of snow along the possible infiltration routes.

"We are keeping a watch on the situation and our counter-infiltration measures are in place to foil all their attempts," the army officer said.

Asked about intelligence inputs suggesting increasing activity of terrorists on the launch pads across the LoC, he said, "There is no alarming situation that a lot of people had gathered on the launch pads." "The number of terrorists on launch pads is an assessment and nobody has seen them physically. There are many agencies and inputs do come, but there is variation in these inputs. We do not have any input like a lot of them had gathered on the launch pads," he said, adding "if the numbers are compared with last year's, there are minor variations." On the threat posed by the use of drones by Pakistan to drop weapons on this side, he said such activities are mostly taking place along the IB being guarded by the BSF.

"No major action of drones was noticed along the LoC till date. As far as IB is concerned, the BSF is alive to the challenge and are tackling it effectively," he said.

Asked about his assessment of the challenge being posed by Pakistan and China, the GOC said the major challenge for his troops is definitely Pakistan as White Knight Corps does not share borders with China.

On recent incidents of terror attacks in Rajouri, he said "whenever there is peace and development, the enemy is not happy and makes an attempt to disturb it." "Such type of sporadic incidents (are happening)...to give anyone a grenade and he hurls it is the work of a coward. It did not need a lot of courage, so such type of work can be done by our enemy alone," he said.

However, he said the army and the people are together and "I am sure that our enemy will not be able to break our strength and we will emerge as successful. Some of our friends who are misled by any reason will join us as well and the enemy will fail in its design." He lauded the people for enthusiastically participating in the 'Rajouri Day' celebrations and said "we all have joined hands and will move together for peace and development of this region." "Rajouri is a beautiful valley having a

lot of tourism potential. We are making attempts to bring the Rajouri festival on the national calendar," he said.

### Bar, Bench two...

2021, passed by the trial Magistrate in ex-parte against the petitioners, is not being considered on its merits expeditiously. It also appears that there has been some exchange of harsh words between the counsel for the petitioners and the Magistrate, which forced the petitioners to approach Chief Judicial Magistrate, Srinagar seeking transfer of proceedings from Court of trial Magistrate. The Chief Judicial Magistrate has, vide impugned order rightly declined to transfer the proceedings from the Court of learned trial Magistrate, but while doing so, the Chief Judicial Magistrate has made certain sweeping remarks against advocates by stating that advocates level unnecessary allegations against the Judicial Officers in order to facilitate their personal convenience.

Justice Sanjay Dhar further observed that there can be no doubt, that the grounds urged by petitioners, seeking transfer of their case from the Court of trial Magistrate to any other Court of competent jurisdiction, are not cogent.

Justice Sanjay Dhar observed that the sweeping remarks that have been made by the Chief Judicial Magistrate, were uncalled for and unnecessary for the decision of the case. There may be stray incidents where the advocates have resorted to leveling of allegations against the Judicial Officers in order to seek transfer of their cases from one Court to other to suit their convenience, but then this cannot be generalized. "Advocates are the officers of the Court and deserve the same respect and dignity as is being given to the Judicial Officers and Presiding Officers of the Courts. Bench and Bar are two wheels of the chariot of justice. Both are equal and no one is superior to the other. The members of the Bar, as such, deserve the utmost respect and dignity. There may be some rotten apples in the profession, as is true of every profession, but to say that the advocates generally adopt these tactics is not the correct position. The remarks of Chief Judicial Magistrate, as such, deserve to be expunged," observed Court, and added that while upholding the order declining to transfer the case passed by Chief Judicial Magistrate Srinagar, remarks made by the learned Magistrate against the advocates are expunged and it is directed that the same shall not form part of the impugned order. A further direction is issued to trial Magistrate to dispose of the application of the petitioners for modification of order dated November 8, 2021 expeditiously, preferably within a period of 15 days from date a copy of this order is made available to the said Court.

### COVID: 12 new cases in J&K

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir reported 12 fresh Covid cases on Wednesday that took the infection tally to 4,53,909, officials said. Of the new cases, two were reported from the Jammu division while the rest were from Kashmir division, they said.

Srinagar district recorded eight new cases while Budgam registered two new infections, officials said.

Seventeen of the 20 districts in the Union Territory did not report any fresh case.

There are 77 active cases while the overall recoveries has reached 4,49,082, they said.

The COVID-19 death toll stands at 4,750. No Covid-related fatality was reported in the last 24 hours, officials said.

There were 51 confirmed cases of mucormycosis (black fungus), they added.

### Heat wave continues in Jammu, light rains lash Kashmir

JAMMU: Heat wave conditions continued to prevail over the Jammu region on Wednesday, while light rains in Kashmir brought down the day temperature to normal after almost a month, an IMD official said.

Jammu recorded the maximum temperature at 38.5 degrees Celsius and minimum at 24.8 degrees Celsius. While the day temperature is 6.4 degrees above season's average, the night temperature is also 5.6 notches above normal, the India Meteorological Department (IMD) official said.

Katra, the base camp for the pilgrims visiting Mata Vaishno Devi shrine, recorded a high of 34.6 degrees Celsius and a low of 22.8 degrees Celsius. The weather, on the other hand, was pleasant in Kashmir region where Srinagar recorded a high of near normal 20.6 degrees Celsius and a low of 11.8 degrees Celsius, which was 4.2 notches above normal, the official said.

The drop in the mercury in the valley was the result of rainfall under the influence of western disturbance which is presently active over Jammu and Kashmir; the official said, adding Srinagar recorded 5.3mm of rainfall on Wednesday.

According to IMD, most parts of Kashmir valley and some places in the high altitude areas of Jammu region recorded light to moderate rains since Tuesday night.

The weather is expected to remain cloudy with light rain likely at many places in Kashmir and some places in Jammu on April 14, the official said, adding that the next spell of light to moderate rain is likely on April 20 and 21. As per IMD, light snowfall in the upper reaches of north Kashmir, including Razdan top on Bandipora-Gurez road, was reported.

## Woman's murder case solved; husband, accomplice arrested

AKHNOOR: Police on Wednesday solved murder case of a woman by arresting her husband along with an accomplice.

As per details, on March 26, 2022, information was received at Police Post Jourian that an unidentified female body was found near Bhagwana Chak in suspicious circumstances. To ascertain the cause of her death, an inquest proceeding under section 174 CrPC was initiated at Police Post Jourian.



During enquiry, PSL team and dog squad team were called on spot. Deceased was identified as Daleep Kumari, wife of Basant Sahu, resident of Chhattisgarh and presently staying at Baba Talab, Kanachak. Based on technical inputs, it came to fore that deceased had died due to strangulation. Accordingly, inquest proceeding was converted into FIR No. 85/2022 registered under section 302 of IPC at Police Station Akhnoor and investigation started. A team of Police Station Akhnoor under supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial led by SHO Akhnoor Inspr Hilal Azhar assisted by Incharge Police Post Jourian PSI Karnail Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts and based on various CCTV footages of the areas, rounded up two suspects namely Basant Sahu (husband of deceased), son of Punni Ram Sahu and Dinesh Sahu, son of Bhagirath Sahu, both residents of Chattisgarh. During questioning, they confessed their involvement in crime.

Moreover, accused namely Basant Sahu, told that as there was a matrimonial dispute going on between him and his wife, as he along with his friend conspired to kill her at Bhagwana Chak in Jourian, where they strangulated her and left body. Based on disclosure of accused and confessions before the magistrate besides pointing out memo, some seizures were also made by Police corroborating the incident. The overall investigation was done under the supervision of SP Rural Sanjay Sharma.

## Theft case solved; 4 arrested, stolen items recovered

## Major crackdown against bovine smuggling; 442 bovines rescued in single day

UDHAMPUR/RAMBAN: In a major crackdown against bovine smuggling, Udhampur and Ramban Police rescued 442 bovines in a single day by foiling various smuggling bids.

Udhampur Police under overall supervision of SSP Dr Vinod Kumar, seized 6 vehicles and rescued 108 bovines. During the intervening night of April 12-13, police team led by SHO Chenani Insp Charanjeet Singh under the supervision of Addl SP Udhampur Anwaar U1 Haq and SDPO Chenani Ahmed Shafi, seized 6 vehicles carrying bovines. A total of 102 bovines were rescued and 12 smugglers were arrested. FIR Nos. 46, 47, 48, 49, 50 & 51/2022 under relevant sections of law were registered at Police Station Chenani.

Meanwhile, under jurisdiction of Police Station Ramnagar, 6 bovines were rescued by a police party headed by SHO Police Station Ramnagar Insp Pushpinder Singh under supervision of SDPO Ramnagar Dr Bhishm Dubey. FIR no. 53/2022 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Ramnagar.
