



KPS expresses concern on increasing targeted killings in Valley

JAMMU: Expressing grief on dastardly killing of one Satish Singh at Kakrin Kulgam, the Kashmiri Pandit Sabha (KPS) Jammu, during a meeting held in Jammu on Thursday under the leadership of its President K K Khosa has prayed for peace to departed soul.

Speaking on the occasion, Khosa said that the tragic killing took place on the day when a purported notice had become viral in social media directed at Hindu minorities living in Kashmir. "Although the veracity of the notice issued by a lesser known terrorist organization Lashkar-e-Islam threatening the minorities living in the valley with death and destruction in case they don't leave the valley was suspicious but

it has sent a wave of fear amongst the community members living in valley, including PM package employees," he added. Khosa further said that a few days back, one Kashmiri Pandit namely Sunny Kumar, son of Pandit Janki Nath had a narrow escape when he was fired on from a point-blank range by terrorists in Shopian. "These targeted killings have sent shock wave within Kashmiri Pandit community living in valley and also living outside since their nears and dears live in Kashmir," said Khosa, urging the UT administration and the Government of India to take adequate steps to reassure minorities living in valley that no untoward incident would take place in future. "These incidents clearly

show that the security establishments have not been able to check targeted killings. Killings have been taking place regularly on one pretext or another which is highly deplorable and disturbing. It has dent the tall claims of the government that normally has returned to Valley. Sabha believes that jingoistic approach should be avoided while dealing with Kashmiri and parameters that the Government affords about normally like increase in tourist footfall, huge quantum of development activities and large investment proposals, most of which are on papers," he added.

SRINAGAR: The Department of Tourism has advised all tourism service providers to desist from any sort of cheating or overcharging from the tourists. The Department has made it amply clear that relevant provisions of J&K Registration of Tourist Trade Act-1978/2012 and other penal laws would be invoked in case of deviant stakeholders. A spokesman of the Department on Thursday said though it was good that we are witnessing a bumper season of tourist arrivals, it was incumbent upon the stakeholders and the Department to ensure that

tourists are attended decently, properly and charged fairly for the services they utilize so that they return back with memories as beautiful as Kashmir is known for. In a specific complaint received from a tourist group, the Department has blacklisted the service provider from undertaking any commercial activity besides initiating other criminal proceedings against the concerned unit holders. The accused unit holders have also been detained for questioning by Tourist Police.

Reminding the stakeholders of an old tagline of the Department-Sayaah aap kay husne sulook ka talib hai, usko

khush karkay aap Kashmir ki khubsoorti aur mehman nawaazi mein charh laga sakta hain-the spokesman impressed upon all the segments of tourism fraternity and their representatives to play their role in checking any incident of cheating or overcharging of tourists and live upto the expectations of highest levels of hospitality Kashmir has been known for centuries. Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Jammu & Kashmir led by




path charted by Dr Baba Saheb Ambedkar for an egalitarian society and prosperous India.
