JAMMU: Over 33,000 people have so far registered themselves for the annual pilgrimage to the cave shrine of Amarnath in south Kashmir, officials said on Sunday.

The devotees are making a beeline for designated bank branches to secure a permit for undertaking the journey to the cave shrine in Lidder valley of south Kashmir Himalayas and paid obeisance to the naturallyformed ice-Shivlingam.

The 43-day yatra is scheduled to start on June 30 after the coronavirus pandemic enforced break of two years.

"As many as 33,795 pilgrims have registered for the yatra till Saturday," Chief Executive Officer (CEO) Shri Amarnath Shrine Board (SASB), Nitishwar Kumar told PTI.

Kumar, who is personally monitoring the arrangements, said 22,229 pilgrims have been registered through through (banks). During the 43-day vatra, the journey to the cave shrine

will begin from the twin routes -- the traditional 48km from Nunwan to the cave shrine from Pahalgam in south Kashmir's Anantnag, and 14-km shorter but steep Baltal route in Ganderbal district of central Kashmir.

districts in the Union territory did not report any fresh cases. Srinagar district recorded the highest of nine


The Union territory currently has 75 active Covid cases while 4,49,115 people have so far recovered from the disease, the officials said

To be chaired by Army Chief Gen MM Naravane, the commanders' conference to be held in the national capital from April 18-22 will also focus on specific plans for capability development and boosting operational prestrong force, officials said on Sunday.

The Army Commanders' Conference is an apex level biannual event that is held in April and October every year. The conference is an institutional platform for conceptual level deliberations, culminating in making important policy decisions for the Indian Army

PALLI VILLAGERS UPBEAT

JAMMU: The residents of Palli in Jammu and Kashmir's Samba district are upbeat over the upcoming visit of Prime Minister Narendra Modi to their village, which is set to become the first carbon-free solar panchavat in the Union Territory.

From the macadamised roads to the recently launched electric bus service, the village located just 17 kms from the winter capital Jammu is witnessing a major transformation with an upgraded Panchayat Ghar, renovated government high school building, a new pond and improved playfields.

The work is going on at war-footing especially on the 500 KV solar plant which is being installed in a record time of nearly three weeks on a total area of 6,408 square metres to provide clean electricity to 340 houses in the model panchayat under the central government's Gram Urja Swaraj' programme. A twenty-five member team is working round the clock to complete the Rs 2.75 crore project in the next couple of days before its formal inauguration by the prime minister during his visit to the village on April 24, chairman and managing director, Central Electronics Limited, Chetan Prakash Jain said.

He said the electricity generated will be distributed to the village, having a daily requirement of 2.000 units, through the local power grid station.

Deputy Commissioner, Samba, Anuradha Gupta has already distributed solar Chulhas' (stoves) among the beneficiaries in the village which has over 450 houses. The rest of the houses will be covered in the next phase after the prime minister's visit.

On the National Panchayti Rai Day, the prime minister is scheduled to fly to Pali village from Jammu airport to address a gathering including over 30,000 Panchayati Raj Institution (PRI) members of Jammu and Kashmir besides around 700 panchayats across the country virtual-

Jahangirpuri clashes: 2 juveniles among 22 held; police meet peace panels to cool tempers

NEW DELHI: Twenty-one people, including the "main conspirators", were arrested over the violence in northwest Delhi's Jahangirpuri, where an uneasy calm prevailed on Sunday as companies of anti-riot police patrolled the streets and people largely stayed indoors.

Two juveniles have also been apprehended in connection with the clashes, police said, adding that the case has been transferred to the Crime Branch for further investigation.

Political parties started the blame game over the matter, with BJP spokesperson Sambit Patra saying "ideology of appeasement" pursued over the last 70 years is responsible for the commu-

nal riots even as Delhi Congress chief Anil Kumar said the clashes happened due to intelligence failure of security agencies. The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) alleged that the sequence of events explain that BJP is behind the violence.

Political leaders, including area MP Hans Raj Hans, Delhi BJP president Adesh Gupta and Leader of Opposition in the Assembly Ramvir Singh Bidhuri, made a beeline for Jahangirpuri on Sunday and appealed people to maintain peace.

A delegation of Vishva Hindu Parishadh (VHP) also met Delhi Police Commissioner Rakesh Asthana on Sunday and demanded strict
