

# PHE daily-wagers move towards LG's house, face lathi-charge

JAMMU: Police on Monday resorted to lathi-charge against hundreds of agitating daily-wager employees of Jal Shakti Department and detained them when they sought to reach Lieutenant Governor's house here as part of protest for regularisation of their jobs.

The workers who assembled under the banner of Public Health Engineering (PHE) Employee's United Front moved towards Lieutenant Governor's house, raising slogans against the Lt Governor-led administration and the BJP for their alleged failure to regularise their services.

A strong police personnel prevented the agitating workers to reach near the LG's house, using baton charge, resulting in injuries to many. Police also detained many protesting daily wagers.

Over 30,000 daily wagers, casual labourers and other workers who are working in department for over the

past two decades have been regularly holding protests in both Jammu and Srinagar in support of their

long-pending demands including regularisation and release of pending wages.

"We are fed up with the rigid and anti-employee attitude of this government. The BJP leaders only foisted us and did nothing to resolve our long pending demands," protesting daily wagers said.

"We have been working in the department for the last two decades with a hope that our services will be regularised one day. We are being paid meagre wages and that too are not being paid on a monthly basis as a result of which we are forced to live a pathetic life," protesters said.

They urged LG government to redress their demands as promised within ten day otherwise daily wagers will intensify their agitation in a big way and responsibility will lie on the government for any consequence.

## BRO compensates casual labour with Rs 7.67 lakh

LEH: After STATE TIMES published an article last month titled 'BRO fails to provide timely compensation to injured casual labour', Border Road Organisation (BRO) released an amount of Rs 7,67,040 as compensation in favour of T. Norboo, a casual paid labourer who lost 60 percent of his right hand, including three fingers, in a stone crusher machine on 13th November 2020 near North Pulu while on duty with the 54 RCC of the BRO.

Over the last 16 months, Norboo had been running from pillar to post for compensation against the loss he suffered while on work.

The BRO claimed that the time taken to compensate was on account of a minor spelling mistake with Norboo's first name, which was indeed an insignificant justification.

With the help of STATE TIMES Bureau Chief Leh, Tsewang Rigzin, Norboo approached the Assistant Labour Commissioner's office in Leh to seek labour court's intervention to get his due compensation.

"I am grateful to the Assistant Labour Commissioner, Labour Officer and Tsewang Rigzin for helping me get my compensation," Norboo thanked, after the compensation money was credited into his bank account last week.

His son, who had just got selected in the Army, managed to admit his father, Norboo, in an Army hospital in Chandigarh on 11th December of 2020 where was treated till the 12th of January 2021.

### Criminal proceedings should not be permitted to become weapon of harassment for settlement of disputes: CJM

JAMMU: Chief Judicial Magistrate Jammu Amarjeet Singh Langeh on Monday, in a significant judgment, held that criminal proceedings should not be permitted to become a weapon of harassment for imminent settlement of a dispute. This significant order was passed in an application filed by one Goutam Singh seeking invocation of Section 156(3) of CrPC in order to get an FIR registered against non-applicant by SHO Police Station Kana Chak - Jammu under relevant provisions of Penal Code for passing life threats to him. Allegations which are alluded to non-applicant as tailored in application are that applicant sold a vehicle bearing registration No. JK02AQ-7911 to non-applicant against consideration of Rs. 12,50,000 (rupees twelve lakh fifty thousand only) in connection with which non-applicant allegedly issued 17 cheques to him (applicant) which, according to applicant, were dishonoured by the bank. Applicant further asserted that he requested non-applicant many times to pay the whole amount as aforesaid but he refused to pay the same and instead is giving life-threats to him. Thereafter, applicant goes on narrating that he approached concerned Police Station for registration of FIR but of no avail. Similarly, according to applicant even SSP Jammu did not come to his rescue when approached. Chief Judicial Magistrate Jammu Amarjeet Singh Langeh, after going through the application observed that grievance projected by applicant, indeed is pre-dominantly rooted in issuance of 17 cheques allegedly by non-applicant to applicant in connection with sale transaction of vehicle and those cheques subsequently, as per applicant, getting bounced/dishonoured when presented in the bank concerned. In face of this admitted position, by all accounts, remedy available to him (applicant) is under relevant provision of Negotiable Instruments Act and by filing instant application, applicant only displays a penchant desire to apply pressure on non-applicant through criminal prosecution for an imminent settlement of his grievance, a course which is not permissible by law. Vague and bald allegations of passing of threats on facts are simply a camouflage by applicant to give criminal colour and complexion to the application and allegations therein. Criminal proceedings should not be permitted to become weapon of harassment for imminent settlement of a dispute, the Court observed.

While dismissing application, the Court observed that instant application does not disclose commission of any cognizable offence by non-applicant and same has been filed just to abuse process of law by giving colour and complexion of criminal case to a dispute which squarely falls within ambit of Negotiable Instruments Act.

their learning of rational use of medicines especially anti-microbials to curb menace of AMR.



He further informed that the participants of the aforesaid training will conduct the survey in various Departments of the GMC Jammu & Associated Hospital from April 19 to 21, 2022 to collect data on anti-microbial consumption in GMC & AH.

## Fire Services Week: Srinagar lost Rs 2.5 billion property in 146 fire incidents

SRINAGAR: National Fire Services week is observed from April 14, every year across the country and this year's the theme of celebration is 'Learn Fire Safety Increase Positivity'. During the week-long programs, the department is trying to educate people regarding fire safety measures, but the first three months of 2022 proved quite tough for the people of Srinagar and Fire & Emergency Department. The drastic rise in fire incidents across Srinagar district has put firefighters on tenterhooks round the clock. The losses in recent fire incidents in Nigeen Lake and Batamaloo area could have been easily minimised, if firefighting infrastructure across Srinagar could have been improved.

During first three months of 2022, 146 fire incidents were reported in city. In January, 43 fire incidents occurred in which 21 houses, 9 shops, 1 shopping complex, 2 ordinary sheds, a vehicle and 6 electric transformers gutted. In February, 49 incidents were reported in

which 14 houses, 2 buildings, 2 shops, 3 shopping complexes, 6 electric transformers got damaged while in March, 54 incidents were with 58 houses, 1 building, 2 shops, 6 shopping complexes, 2 vehicles, 4 electric transformers and 18 other structures getting damaged. While speaking over fire safety measures, Deputy Director, Fire & Emergency Department Bashir Ahmad Shah said, "We can't relate fire incident to some specific season. We are in summers now and people have minimised usage of electronic gadgets, so it is surprising to see rising fire mishaps. There is no hard and fast reason in such incidents. However, people should take preventive measures and there should be no compromise or negligence in it." According to officer, the fault lies with concerned agencies who issue permissions without inspecting safety measures. A commercial establishment should not be allowed to operate unless it gets necessary Noc from all departments including Fire & Emergency Department. "Fire

occurred in hospital could have controlled at a right time however due to no safety measures in place, it spread fast and engulfed entire structure. However, there are many hospitals in city where fire-fighting system is in place and many are working on it. If a hospital puts such mechanism in place, it costs only Rs 40 to 50 lakhs. There have been no formal deliberations so far. But we are acting in our personal capacity and intimidating others to ensure fire safety measures," he said, adding, "People are constructing modified three-story houses and spending millions. What is wrong if they spend few thousands more on installation of fire extinguishers? This will provide them security as well. In unplanned colonies people should at least take utmost care to give no chance to fire," he added. "Department have identified 92 locations across J&K which have already been submitted to Government for establishing fire stations. The department has done his job and now it needs sanctions from Government," he added.
