Rubia misses ton, Sandhya spins web, Sheeraza scores fifty as J&K crush Manipur

GUWAHATI: Explosive batter Rubia Sayed missed century by a whisker, while skipper Sandhya Sayal spun web around the rival batters and Sheeraza Bano scored a magnificent half-century as Jammu and Kashmir crushed Manipur by a big margin of 110 runs in the ongoing BCCI's Senior Womens T20 Trophy at ACA Stadium, Barsapara, Guwahati, today.

Earlier, winning the toss and batting first, J&K began on a disastrous note, losing

first three wickets without opening the account. Sarla, Bawandeep and Bushra all were sent back to the pavilion without scoring.

However, Sheeraza Bano and Rubia Sayed salvaged the sinking ship and after consolidating the innings, sent the bowlers on a leather-hunt to take the score to 149 runs in 20 overs, without losing more wickets. The duo of Rubia and Sheeraza made a partnership of 149 runs.

For Manipur, Chingkhei M was the only successful bowler, who took 2 wickets by conceding 12 runs in her 4 overs.

In reply, J&K bowlers, led by skipper and off-spinner Sandhya Sayal, plotted

with utmost ease to score power-packed unbeaten 94 runs off 52 balls, studded with 11 fours and 5 massive sixes, while Sheeraza showed stellar grit and tenacity to notch up a brilliant fifty, scoring 54 runs off 55 balls including 6 crispy boundaries.

Manipur collapse and the team could only manage to score 39 runs in 20 overs, losing 9 wickets in the process, thus Manipur lost the match by 110 runs. Milan Y was the only batter to cross double figure mark, contributing 22 runs off 34 balls, studded with 3 boundaries, while skipper Ganga scored 6 runs.

For J&K, Sandhya Sayal wreaked havoc from the word go and took 4 wickets in her 4 overs by conceding just 3 runs, while Speedster Mithun Manhas and Member Legal Affairs, Sunil Sethi sent congratulatory messages to the team.

Earlier, in the day-night match yesterday evening, J&K lost to Nagaland by 32 runs. Nagaland scored 125, while J&K was bundled out for 93 runs.

J&K will take on Sikkim in the next outing at ACA Stadium Guwahati on April 21.

JAMMU: Udhampur and Reasi District Sport Climbing Competitions shall be organized by Mountaineering Association of J&K (MAJK) in collaboration with Sprawling Buds ICSE School, Bantalab, here on May 1. "About 200 climbers from various institutions of Udhampur and Reasi districts are likely to vie for honors in the competition which may extend to the next day in case the competitions are not completed on the first day," informed General Secretary of the Association, Shweta Khajuria. These competitions, to be conducted on the pre-fabricated 40 ft high Tenzing Norgay Sport Climbing Wall in Sprawling Buds ICSE School campus, shall be held in eight categories of Men, Women (born in 2005 and earlier), Boys, Girls (born in 2006, 2007 and 2008); Sub Junior Boys and Girls (born in 2009 and 2010) and Mini Boys and Girls (born in 2011 and after).
