

Man, woman found dead inside car


UDHAMPUR/JAMMU: The bodies of a man and a woman, both in their 20s, were found inside a car on Dhar road in Udhampur district, officials said on Wednesday.

Rahul Klotra (28) of Gora Slathia and Vimla Devi (26) of Ramgarh, who were married separately, were found inside the car in an unconscious state near Darsoo village, 20 kms from Udhampur, late Tuesday night, the officials said.

They said some people got suspicious and informed police about the car which was parked on the road for several hours.

Police broke the window panes and shifted the duo to hospital, where the doctors declared them brought dead, the officials said, adding preliminary investigations suggested that the two were having an affair and apparently died by suicide. They said the autopsy of both

a central ministry dedicated to these alternative medicine systems.

HC debars MD, XEn KPDCL from withdrawing salary for 2 months

SRINAGAR: Justice Sanjeev Kumar of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court, has debarred Managing Director (MD) and Executive Engineer (XEn) of Kashmir Power Distribution Corporation Ltd (KPDCL) from withdrawing their salary for two months.

According to the amended law, a minor apprehended for heinous crime would be treated as an adult before the law. Earlier, a juvenile could be out of a remand home after a maximum

tractor who has executed work years before.

The controversy dates back to 2020 with petitioner, approaching the court claiming that he was allotted a contract of painting ST Poles and that he executed the work to the satisfaction of the department, during the financial year 2018-2019.

An amount of Rs 22,91,083 had incurred on execution of the aforesaid work and the department had not disputed petitioner's claim in the court.

Accordingly, the court had given six weeks time to the

department to release the billed amount to the petitioner.

On the failure of the department to release the admitted liability, the petitioner filed contempt petition and many orders came to be passed including the order dated March 22, 2022 wherein department was granted three weeks time to make payment failing which, the court had said, the Managing Director shall appear in person along with cheque so that the petitioner is paid payment in court.

However, in total disre-

gard to court orders, the payment continues to be withheld.

The Executive Engineer, instead of Managing Director, appeared before court on April 19, instantly drawing flack from the Judge.

For want of Managing Director, the court stopped short of sending Executive Engineer back. The engineer eventually got audience of the court. He sought minimum 2 months time to complete formalities of disbursement of the admitted amount in favour of the petitioner.

Fraudster arrested for cheating army personnel, cash Rs 1,50,800 recovered

AKHNOOR: Police on Wednesday arrested a fraudster for cheating army personnel and recovered cash Rs. 1,50,800.

As per the details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Akhnoor by one person working as casual labour under army and posted in Akhnoor stating that some unknown person has debited Rs 1,50,800 from his bank account. On this case FIR No 107/2022 under section 420/IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Akhnoor under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial led by SHO Akhnoor Inspri Hilal Azhar assisted by PSI Manoj Kumar did stren-

uous efforts and with the help of technical assistance got the details that the money was sent to some Paytm account. On getting details of the concerned account, police team finally rounded up a suspect later identified as Raman Kumar, son of Shiv Dayal, resident of Melu R.S. Pura Distt Jammu. During intensive questioning, accused confessed his involvement in the above case and on his disclosure cash Rs 1,50,800 was recovered from his possession. The accused also revealed that he was an operator in Common Service Centre (CSC) and when the victim approached him at CSC for applying for driving licence, he took the details of victim debit card which

Soldier among 3 die in separate road accidents in J&K

BANJHAL/JAMMU: Three people, including an army personnel, were killed and two others injured in separate road accidents in Samba, Ramban and Rajouri districts of Jammu and Kashmir on Wednesday, officials said.

The army jawan, Manpreet Singh (25) of Kathua, died after his private vehicle skidded off the road and fell down from a bridge near Veer Bhoomi Park in Samba district, the officials said.

They said the soldier was posted in Srinagar and was on leave since March 26. He was on his way to Jammu from his Kathua residence when the accident took place.

In a separate incident, a trucker was killed when his vehicle rolled down into a deep gorge on the Jammu-Srinagar National Highway near Khooni Nalla in Ramban district, the officials said, adding the body of the deceased was recovered by police and civilian volunteers and is being identified. In another incident, Shazia Akhtar (27) of Budhal was killed and her relatives Mohammad Ikhlaq and his wife Nazia Kousar were injured when their private car plunged into a gorge at Tralla Rehan on Rajouri-Kotranka road in Rajouri district, the officials said. They said the injured were shifted to a hospital and their condition was stated to be serious.
