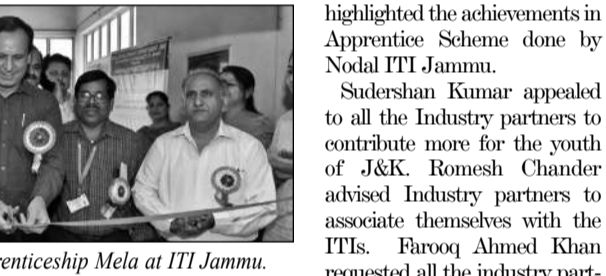

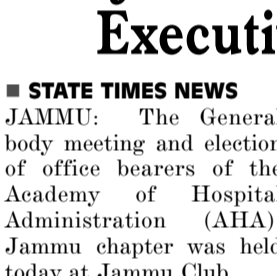

JAMMU: A delegation of central body of J&K Private Schools Association led by its Vice President, Rameshwar Mengi called on Director School Education Jammu, Dr Ravi Shanker Sharma and discussed a number of genuine demands besides presenting a memorandum of demands.

While interacting with the officer, General Secretary JKPSA Ajay Gupta briefed the Director that to prevent exploitation of students by unrecognised schools, to facilitate smooth transfer of students from one recognized school to another and to prevent commercialisation of education, since 2015 onwards confirmation of result of all private schools was done on fixed parameters by CEOs and ZEOs of Jammu division, strictly as the directions. "It seems that the old precedent is going to establish as all CEOs of Jammu division are going to conform/ countersign the results of private schools on their own whims with number of formalities varying from district to district," he added.

To save students from harassment and exploitation, the delegation demanded circular based on fixed parameters for countersignature/ authentication/ confirmation of result of private schools for academic session 2021-22. The members also demanded a mechanism of recognition in accordance to provisions laid in SRO 123 of March 18, 2010 to curb menace of pre-primary/ nursery schools which are still unbridled.

DSEJ Dr Ravi Shanker Sharma gave a patient hearing to delegation and assured the members that Government is keen to frame a policy to bring a transparent system to stop exploitation & harassment. He also promised to issue an order for confirmation of result of Private schools for the Academic Session 2021-22.

Chuni threatens self-immolation if 'Pahari' status denied

JAMMU: Accusing the Lieutenant Governor administration of sabotaging the resettlement plan for people displaced from Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (PoJK), a refugee leader threatened self-immolation if they were denied the 'Pahari' status that will help them get reservation in jobs and admission to educational institutes.

He also hit out at the government alleging total failure to implement the Rs 2,000 crore financial package sanctioned to the community by the Omar Abdullah government previously, and said after six years, only half of the PoJK displaced families had received partial relief.

If these issues are not resolved by the end of April, I will set myself on fire any day in May to register protest against the ongoing injustice with my community, Rajiv Chuni told reporters here. He said the then Jammu and Kashmir cabinet headed by chief minister Omar Abdullah had proposed for them a financial package and sent it across to the Centre seeking approval. The package promised Rs 25 lakh per family, reservation for students from the community in professional and technical colleges of the country, and 8,500 government jobs for educated unemployed youths. The Modi government, instead of implementing this package, sent it to the Parliamentary Standing Committee for a review.

The Parliamentary Standing Committee, in its 183rd report submitted to Parliament, recommended Rs 30 lakh per family instead of the proposed Rs 25 lakh. It also endorsed other components of the package recommended by the (then) Jammu and

Kashmir state cabinet, he said. Further, on November 7, 2015, Prime Minister Narendra Modi announced a package of Rs 80,000 crore for the erstwhile Jammu and Kashmir state and this included the Rs 2,000 crore proposed for the displaced community.

When the package was released in November 2016, it was clearly mentioned that this amount should be provided to the beneficiaries within three months, but it has been nearly six years now and only half of the PoJK displaced families have got this relief, Chuni said.

He alleged that even those that received the compensation were paid only Rs 5.5 lakh of the assured Rs 30 lakh and that the incumbent government ignored all other recommendations promised in the package. Commenting on a recent legislation of the Jammu and Kashmir government for identifying 'Pahari Speaking People' in the union territory, he said, "We qualify all the prerequisite conditions, including clan, tribe and mother tongue. But the government is not issuing us a certificate. He also demanded a minimum of eight Assembly seats to be reserved for the displaced community.

Association requested the Commissioner to ink a written agreement the association so that their long-pending grievances can be addressed. Major demands of the association included HR issues, conducting pending DPCs, release of budget/

salary, disposal of SRO-43 cases etc. As no concrete agreement was finalised between Association and Provident Fund Commissioner, the employees decided to continue the ongoing strike till all genuine demands are fulfilled.
