

Normalcy claim in J&K, GoI's biggest subversive disinformation campaign: IkkJutt Jammu

Calls for intensified protest against attack over temple

JAMMU: Coming down heavily on J&K Government, President IkkJutt Jammu, Adv Ankur Sharma has expressed anguish at carelessness, causal and unbecoming approach of administration in dealing with Sidhra temple attack and desecration case. Terming periodical and repeated attacks on Hindu temples in Jammu Province as attacks on Jammu's spiritual and religious identity and a graduated and more pronounced form of genocidal pan-Islamic Jihadist project of J&K's Islamisation, an extension of Kashmir of 1990s, Adv Ankur Sharma, while addressing a press conference in Jammu on

Thursday, said that it is shameful that no effective action has been against culprits and the ecosystem

producing such culprits despite lapse of considerable gap of time. "Apparently, entire admin-

istration is involved in whitewashing Jihadist footprints, brushing bad things under carpet thereby reducing it to a dangerous instrument of disinformation shamelessly claiming normalcy in the region when the situation is clearly otherwise," he added.

President IkkJutt Jammu said, "People of Jammu province are caught between convenience and denial approach of both Congress and BJP as far as their

position on Jihadist onslaughts on them is concerned. Temple attacks, idol breaking, terrorising Hindus, forcing them to flee and migrate are processes which are directly related to a bigger genocidal process of demographic assault and an organised, planned design to change Jammu's demography." He further told that few days back, IkkJutt Jammu's team visited the desecrated temple premises from where the party had demanded demolition of illegal religious structures built on forest and public lands of Bhatindi, Sidhra,

Rangoora and arrest of fundamentalist preachers involved in radical indoctrination producing Jihadists at a large scale. It had also asked for the grant of Rs 1 crore as assistance for reconstruction of desecrated temple and construction of approach road. Since none of the demands have been met by the Govt as on date, President IkkJutt Jammu gave a call to its cadre to prepare themselves for a bigger protest in Jammu within a week's time.

JAMMU: After coming to power by making tall poll promises, the Narendra Modi-led BJP government at the Centre had miserably failed on all fronts and hence it was deflecting the people's attention by raising sensitive issues, said JKPCC Working President, Raman Bhalla, while addressing prominent persons of Ward-48 Bahu Fort in Gandhi Nagar constituency on Thursday.



Kashmir weather: Snowfall in higher reaches, rains in plains

SRINAGAR: Many areas in the higher reaches of Kashmir received fresh snowfall on Thursday while the plains were lashed by rains, bringing respite from the unusual warm temperature, officials said.

Many areas including the famous tourist destination of Gulmarg in north Kashmir's Baramulla district, Gurez in Bandipora, Machil in Kupwara, and Sonamarg in Ganderbal, received fresh snowfall, the officials said.

They said snowfall was reported from Zojila axis on the Srinagar-Leh highway as well as in the higher reaches of Srinagar.

The plain areas in the Kashmir Valley received rainfall, they added.

The MeT office has said the weather will remain cloudy, with occasional rain, thunderstorm, gusty winds, and hailstorm at isolated places of the valley till Friday.

There is possibility of snowfall over the higher reaches as well.

COVID: 10 new cases in J&K

SRINAGAR: J&K reported 10 fresh Covid cases on Thursday that took the infection tally to 4,53,966, officials said. Of the new cases, five each was reported from Jammu and Kashmir division, they said. Jammu district logged four new cases, followed by three in Srinagar, two in Baramulla and one in Kathua, officials said. There are 55 active cases while the overall recoveries has reached 4,49,160, they said. The COVID-19 death toll stands at 4,751. There were 51 confirmed cases of mucormycosis (black fungus), they added.
