PUBLIC NOTICE

Whereas, it has been observed that deposits of rubbish, filth and other waste including Single use plastic are seen littered in public places including vacant plots, street etc

Whereas, section 9 of the Jammu and Kashmir Non-Bio degradable Material (Management, Handling and Disposal) Act, 2007 also prohibits to throw biodegradable and non-biodegradable garbage in public, natural or man-made lakes, wetlands etc.

Whereas, silting of garbage and litter on public places including tourist/religious places open plots projects a very bad image of the city among the visitors and the residents alike besides endangering public health.

Whereas in terms of section 266 of Municipal Corporation Act, 2000 there is prohibition against accumulation of rubbish etc and no owner or occupier shall deposit any rubbish, filth and other polluted/obnoxious matter in any street or on the veranda of any building or any unoccupied ground alongside any street.

Now, in exercise of the powers vested under section 43 of the Jammu Municipal Corporation Act, it is hereby ordered as under:-

- There is prohibition and complete ban to throw rubbish, filth, waste, single use plastic in public places including religious, tourist places in the city and open plots.
- It is impressed upon all the vacant plot owners within Jammu Municipal Corporation limits to construct boundary walls around the plot and also install boards in their plot with name of owner, contact no., address within 15 days failing to do the same may invite penalty as under rules.
- It is further directed that no wastes of any kind shall at any time shall be littered/thrown on the streets, public spaces including religious and tourist places in the city and violations thereof will attract penalty/ fine against the defaulter under Jammu Municipal Corporation Solid Waste Management By-Laws, 2019.
