With no indication of improvement in the near future, Noval said the patients, students, and the old are under tremendous stress due to the hide and seek of

electricity.

While general public including the students are bearing the brunt of the unscheduled power cuts, the crisis has hit the traders the most, especially those associated with tourism, and other sectors, he added.

Sharma said that the situation has gone from bad to worse during the past few weeks. "Power cuts are more frequent and extended during the evening hours. The situa-

tion in the rural areas is far worse and most of the villages don't get electricity for hours together.

Noval Sharma urged the government to improve power supply failing which the people have no other option to come on roads.
