SUNDERBANI: A week-long Shrimad Bhagwat Tattva Gyan Yagya (Bhagwat Katha) culminated at Gyan Ganga Math, Sunderbani with full zeal, religious fervour and gaiety on Sunday. Scores of devotees from surrounding areas gathered during the seven days programme to listen to the divine acts of lord Krishna and true meaning behinds his divine acts. The programme was commenced on 12th of this month and concluded on Sunday under the leadership of His Holiness Atal Pithadishwar Shri Shri 1008 Rajguru Acharya Mahamandleshwar Shri Swami Vishwatamanand Saraswati ji Maharaj. 'Restore suspended work on Suringa Morh-Jai link road'

DODA: Sarpanch Panchayat Joura Kalan, Tehsil Kahara, District Doda, Anil Kumar and Panch Joura Kalan, Ashok Kumar in a joint statement issued here have appealed the Prime Minister, Narendra Modi to instruct the concerned for according of forest clearance and taking up the suspended work on Suringa Morh- Jai link road immediately.

They said that on Suringa Morh-Jai link road (14 Kms), earth cutting work is already complete from Suringa Mor to revenue village Joura Kalan - a distance of 4 Kms (Non forest area) & the work from Joura Kalan to Jai (10 Kms)

stands suspended for want of forest clearance. They said that out of these 10 Kms, a stretch of one & half Kms i.e from revenue village Joura Kalan to Revenue village Lower- Shamlain is treeless though it falls in forest area; work on this stretch can be executed without any loss to forest & without any legal hindrance even before forest clearance for the whole.

They also appealed to LG Manoj Sinha & Chief Engineer, R&B, Jammu Province to accord forest clearance at the earliest and simultaneously issue orders of execution of work on this tree-less stretch of one & half kms from Joura Kalan to

Lower Shamlain, so that justice to the poor inhabitants of the village Lower Shamlain & ST village Kunthal will be denied. The letter of indent regarding compensation etc has already been sent to the office of Chief Engineer, PWD (R&B), Jammu by the concerned Executive Engineer PWD (R&B) Sub-Division) Gandoh (Bhalesha), through Superintending Engineer PWD (R&B) Circle Doda, but there is no action till date.
