

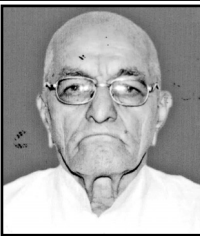

CRIME REPORT

General store caught fire under suspicious circumstances

BANL: Property worth lakhs was damaged in a fire incident, which broke out under suspicious circumstances in a General Store at a remote area of Dagar. When the shop caught fire, at the same time people also received electric shocks on touching electrical equipments. Besides this, a recharge point also burnt to ashes. Former Sarpanch Puran Chand told that on Monday night, a fire broke out in a general store under suspicious circumstances and as soon as people saw flames, they tried to extinguish it, but till then all goods kept in store turned to ashes. He told that shopkeeper Dheeraj Kumar has suffered a loss of lakhs.

Minor girl raped after friendship on social media site, accused arrested

SAMBA: A minor girl was raped after a youth developed friendly relations with her on social media site. However accused has been arrested by the police.

As per details, a youth namely Raman Kumar, son of Roop Lal, resident of Madeyal, Tehsil Madeen, Kathua developed friendly relations with a minor girl through social media and later raped her. The accused also made obscene videos of victim. When she narrated the ordeal to her parents, they approached police and lodged a complaint. Acting on complaint, police conducted medical examination of girl and nabbed the accused. FIR 34/2022 under sections 376, 554, 363, ¾ under POCSO Act was registered against him at Police Station Ramgarh.

Woman among three held for drug peddling, heroin recovered

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday arrested three drug peddlers in jurisdictions of Police Stations Bahu Fort & Gandhi Nagar and recovered 130 gm heroin from their possession.

As per details, a team of Police Station Bahu Fort constituted under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Ahmed Jafari and led by SHO Inspir Nayat Ali assisted by PSI Farneen Choudhary and PSI Balbir Singh, during patrolling duty at Channi Pulli, under the jurisdiction of Police Station Bahu Fort, rounded up a suspect later identified as Monika Kumar, wife of Ravi Kumar, resident of Rajeev Nagar. On search, 105 gm heroin was recovered from her possession. She was arrested and FIR No. 118/2022 under section 8/21/22 NDPS Act was registered against her at Police Station Bahu Fort.

Similarly, a team of Police Station Gandhi Nagar led by SHO Gandhi Nagar Inspir Pankaj Sharma under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma, while on patrolling duty near Peaks Auto Shivaji Chowk rounded up two suspects later identified as Mandeep Singh, son of Satnam Singh, resident of Digiana Jammu and Tejinderpal Singh, son of Davinder Singh, resident of Indira Nagar on their vehicle (JK02CT/9625) and bike (JK02CE/1870). During search, 25 gm heroin i.e., 10 gm from Mandeep Singh and 15 gm from Tejinder Pal Singh was recovered. Duo was arrested and FIR no. 96/2022 under sections 8/21/22/29 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Gandhi Nagar. The arrests and recoveries were made under the supervision of SP South Manta Sharma.

Cop among two arrested with 69 Kg poppy straw, cash

BUDGAM: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, police on Tuesday arrested two drug peddlers including a cop and recovered 69 Kg poppy straw and Rs 55,000 cash from their possession.

As per details, a party of Police Station Chadoora during patrolling at Nagam-Hayatpora road intercepted a vehicle (Alto-800) bearing registration number JK04E-9628 with two persons onboard, who were identified as Mohammad Ayoub Beigh (a cop, posted at DPL Budgam), son of Mohammad Jamal Beigh, resident of Nowhar, Chadoora & Nazir Ahmed Sheikh, son of Mohammad Shafi Shiekh, resident of Tangnar, Chadoora. During search, 69 Kg Poppy Straw and cash amounting to Rs 55,000, believed to be proceeds of narcotic crime were recovered from their possession. They were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Besides, vehicle used in commission of crime was also seized. Accordingly, FIR No. 69/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Chadoora and further investigation started.

Police destroys poppy cultivation

SRINAGAR: Police on Tuesday destroyed poppy cultivation in Pulwama.

As per details, a special team of Police comprising of DySP Hqrs Pulwama along with SHO Pulwama and revenue officials launched a special drive against poppy cultivation and destroyed poppy spread over approximately 7 Kanals of land in Pinglena and Gundipora areas of Pulwama. Besides, Police also recovered 21 Kg green poppy from the spot. FIR No. 107/22 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Pulwama against two accused namely Gh Rasool Bhat, son of Gh Qadir, resident of Pinglena & Nazir Ahmad Mir, son of Mohd Subhan, resident of Gundipora Pulwama.

Theft case solved; 2 arrested

BARAMULLA: Police on Tuesday solved a theft case by arresting 2 accused involved in crime. Stolen property was also recovered.

As per details, on April 11, 2022, Police Post Wussan received a written complaint from one Abdul Rashid Dar of Sultanpora Pattan stating therein that during intervening night

of April 10-11, 2022 some unknown thieves barged into his cowshed and decamped with 20 sheep. Accordingly, case under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Pattan and investigation initiated, during which a special investigation police team headed by SHO Pattan under supervision of SDPO Pattan was constituted and raids were conducted at several suspected locations while many suspects were called for questioning. Investigating team after strenuous efforts zeroed in on two suspects namely Umar Farooq Dar, son of Farooq Ahmad Dar, resident of Rakh Asham, Sumbal and Ishfaq Ahmad Yatoo, son of Mohd Ibrahim Yatoo, resident of Sultanpora Pattan. During questioning, officers learnt about their involvement in crime and on their disclosure all stolen sheep were recovered. A vehicle TATA Mobile bearing registration number JK15B-1858, which was used in crime was also seized. Both the accused were arrested and stolen property (sheep) was handed over to the legal owner.

Fraudster arrested for cheating woman on pretext of getting her son released from custody; Rs 50,000 recovered

BARAMULLA: Police on Tuesday arrested a fraudster who cheated a woman of Rs 50,000 on pretext of getting her son released from custody.

As per details, Baramulla Police received a complaint from a woman stating their in that one Mohd Shafi Bhat, son of Gh Mohd Bhat, resident of Iqbal Colony Old Town Baramulla, Paakeza Textiles Baramulla had taken Rs 50,000 from her for release of her son namely Shabir Ahmad Teli, son of Gh Mohd, resident of Banglaw Bagh Baramulla from police custody. However, he had not helped her in any way and later, issued fake cheques which got bounced. Accordingly, a case under relevant sections of law was registered and investigation started. Acting swiftly, investigating team arrested the accused person and recovered Rs 50,000 from his possession. Pertinent to mention that fraudster, posing as a social activist, used to remain active on social media thus giving an impression of a responsible citizen with intent to target gullible masses.

Rs 12,500 fine recovered from erring traders

RAMBAN: In view of ongoing Holy Ramzan & forthcoming festivals, the Department of Food Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs, along with other enforcement agencies, conducted a massive market checking drive across the district.

The teams headed by Assistant Director FCS&CA Ramban Shoaib Latif and concerned Tehsildars inspected markets in their jurisdictions and booked several erring shopkeepers found failing to maintain quality of food items, not displaying rate-lists, selling expired products besides indulging in practices of illegal profiteering and sale of underweight products. A joint team comprising Naib Tehsildar Chanderkote, FCS&CA, Legal Metrology Department and Police carried out surprise check in Peerah, Chanderkote areas, while some other teams conducted checking from Nashri to Banihal and recovered Rs 12,500 as fine from defaulters. They also destroyed spoiled fruits and vegetables. The shopkeepers, Dhabawalas and vendors were advised to maintain hygiene and quality of eatables besides ensuring proper display of price-lists.

Narco-smuggler booked under PSA

KATHUA: Police on booked a narco-smuggler under PSA at Kathua. As per details, a police team led by Insp O P Chib SHO Kathua under the supervision of DySP Headquarters Shammi Kumar under the overall supervision of SSP R C Kotwal on Tuesday apprehended a notorious narcotic smuggler Daljeet Singh, son of Tarlochan Singh, resident of Langate Morh, Kathua Tehsil & District Kathua who was evading arrest and against whom a detention warrant under Prevention of Illicit Traffic in Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (PITNDPS) Act- 1988 was issued by Divisional Commissioner, Jammu. In order to prevent him from carrying out illegal activities, a dossier was prepared against him and sent to Divisional Commissioner, Jammu for his detention under PITNDPS Act- 1988 (PSA). Accordingly, Divisional Commissioner, Jammu issued a detention warrant against him under PITNDPS Act and warrant has been executed. He was lodged in Central Jail, Kot Bhalwal Jammu to curtail his activities in drug peddling.

Woman nabbed with 70 pouches of illicit liquor

KATHUA: In a decisive action against consumption/production of illegal liquor, Kathua Police under supervision of SSP R C Kotwal seized 70 pouches (180 ml each) of illicit liquor from a woman near Chak Drab Khan.

As per details, information was received from reliable source that illicit liquor was being manufactured near Chack Drab Khan and adjoining areas. Acting swiftly, police team led by Insp Balram Sharma Incharge Police Post Nagri under supervision of DySP Headquarter Kathua Shammi Kumar during special checking/ patrolling duty, noticed a suspicious woman. On checking, 70 pouches of illicit liquor (180 ml each) weighing approximately 10 lts were recovered from her possession. Identified as Pooja Devi, wife of Late Joginder Kumar, resident of Chack Drab Khan Tehsil & District Kathua, the woman was arrested and FIR No 158/2022 under section 48(A)/ Excise Act was registered against her at Police Station Kathua.

Pattan accident: Injured Sarpanch succumbs, toll three

SRINAGAR: A Sarpanch injured in an accident in Pattan area of Baramulla district succumbed on Tuesday. As per details, the victim was identified as Abdul Jabbar (56), son of Abdul Rahim Lone of Lachipora Baramulla. He was among many injured after a bus carrying PRIs had a head-on collision with a tipper last evening. While a Sarpanch Fayaz Ahmad Bhat, son of Samad Bhat from Gulgam Kupwara died on the spot, the driver of bus succumbed on way to hospital. Four others were injured in the accident.

Meanwhile, six CRPF personnel were injured when their vehicle collided with a truck in Shopian district. The accident took place at Zainapora and injured Jawans were rushed to a hospital.

Abortive bid to snatch gun from CRPF Jawan

ANANTNAG: A terrorist on Tuesday tried to snatch rifle of a Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) Jawan in Anantnag's Reshi Bazar area, but the personnel resisted and foiled the attempt.

According to reports, the terrorist threw chilly-powder into eyes of the CRPF personnel who was guarding gate of a Kashmiri Pandits' colony. After the failed bid, the terrorist fled from spot. The area has been cordoned off and a search operation has been launched. The remnants of chilly-powder were clearly visible on ground.

Four missing women traced, reunited with families

KATHUA: Police on Tuesday traced four missing women and reunited them with their families.

As per details, an application was received at Police Station Ramban on April 22, 2022 by father of a girl, resident of Udhampur stating that his daughter went missing from Seri Ramban area since April 23, 2022. In another incident, a person, resident of Demote, Tehsil Ramban lodged a missing report stating that his wife went missing from Ramban town since April 22, 2022. Acting swiftly on reports, wireless messages were flashed to all Police Stations/Police Posts and special Police Teams were constituted to trace missing women. After hectic efforts & with help of local human intelligence, police traced the missing women and reunited them with their family members.

The entire search was effected by police team headed by Insp Sandeep Charak SHO Ramban under the supervision of Pardeep Singh Sen DySP HQ Ramban with overall supervision of Mohita Sharma, SSP Ramban.

Meanwhile, two different missing reports regarding girls were registered at Police Post Parade and Police Post Sainik Colony. After this special police teams led by Incharge Police Post Parade PSI Lalit Kumar and Incharge Police Post Sainik Colony PSI Bhawani Singh, put in hectic efforts and traced both the missing girls. Finally, they were reunited with their families after completing all legal formalities.

Major bovine smuggling bids foiled; 181 animals rescued, 19 smugglers arrested

SAMBA/POONCH/RAMBAN: Police on Tuesday foiled attempts to smuggle bovines at different places across Jammu province by rescuing 181 animals in a single day and arrested 19 smugglers.

As per details, on reliable information, a team of Police Station Ghagwal rescued 4 bovines and apprehended a smuggler who was transporting animals on foot without any valid permission. FIR No 61/2022 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered against him. In another action, acting on information received from reliable sources, another party of Police Station Ghagwal led by SHO Inspector Vijay Verma signaled a Mahindra vehicle (PB10BY/0788) to stop for checking at Naka Tapyal. But, instead of stopping vehicle, the driver accelerated speed and jumped Naka but was successfully chased and apprehended by alert cops within a few metres away from Naka point. On checking of vehicle, 5 bovines were found laden inside vehicle which were rescued and FIR No. 62/2022 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Ghagwal. Similarly, same police party rescued 5 more bovines at Naka Tapyal, Ghagwal which were being transported illegally in a Mahindra load carrier (JK14E/3517). FIR No. 63/2022 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Nagrota and investigation started. Poonch Police also rescued 65 animals from clutches of bovine smugglers in Surankote area. On direction of SSP Poonch Rohit Baskotra, teams headed by DySP Surankote Tamvir Jelani, SHO Surankote Insp Niaz Ahmed, Incharge Police Post Behramgalla SI Sushant Singh established Nakas at Behramgalla, Bafiaz and other places and apprehended 8 bovine smugglers and a Tata mobile (JK12C 0655). Nine FIRs viz Nos 68/2022, 69 /2022, 70/2022, 71/2022, 72/2022, 73/2022, 74/2022, 75/2022, 77/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act were registered at Police Station Surankote and further investigation started.

In another instance, Ramban Police rescued 43 bovine animals under operation 'Kamdhemu'. Acting on the specific inputs of transportation of bovine animals, a party of Police Station Ramban at a Naka near Shaan Palace intercepted three vehicles (JK14-A-9461, JK02-BE-8189 & JK03-G-4627) driven by Tariq Hussain Shah, son of Khalid Hussain, resident of Jakhani, Tehsil Udhampur; Arif Hussain Khan, son of Mohd Iqbal, resident of Braring Shangs and Gohar Ahmed, son of Ghulam Ahmed, resident of Chareet, Qazigund respectively. During checking of vehicles, 43 bovines were found laden which were rescued. The overall rescue operation was made by police parties under command of Insp Sandeep Charak SHO Ramban under the supervision of Pardeep Singh Sen, DySP Hqrs Ramban with overall supervision of SSP Ramban, Mohita Sharma.

Meanwhile, Police also rescued 59 bovine animals during Naka checking at Ban toll plaza and seized five trucks i.e., JK02AT/4665 loaded with 12 bovines, truck bearing registration number JK02AJ/7155 loaded with 12 bovines, truck with Registration No JK02BM/1757 loaded with 11 bovines animals, truck with Registration No JK02BC/7817 and truck bearing Registration No JK02X/5534 loaded with 12 bovines. In this regard five FIRs viz No 154, 155, 156, 157 &158/2022 under sections 188/11 of PCA Act were registered at Police Station Nagrota and 7 smugglers were arrested.

The arrested accused were identified as Mohd Iqbal, son of Abdul Ganni, resident of Tanda Jagti; Mustaq Ahmed, son of Noor Ali, resident of Ramban; Kamran Ahmed, son of Jahangir Iqbal, resident of Mehndar District Poonch; Khurshed Ahmed, son of Faiz Ahmed, resident of Upper Roop Nagar; Shokat Ali, son of Mohd Sharif, resident of Jhajjar Kotli; Nissar Ahmed, son of Ab Hamid, resident of Kulgam and Ajaz Ahmed, son of Gulam Qadir, resident of Kulgam. The arrests and recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Pratap Singh under overall supervisions of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar.
