CRIME REPORT**4 drug peddlers arrested, contraband recovered****STATE TIMES NEWS**

KUPWARA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, Police on Thursday arrested 4 drug peddlers and recovered contraband substance from their possession.

As per details, acting on specific information, a party led by Incharge Police Post Hatmulla SI Lokesh Manhas under supervision of SHO Kupwara SI Mohd Rafiq Lone arrested 2 drug peddlers, who were identified as Javeed Ahmad Wani, son of Mohd Yousaf and Rayees Ahmad Khan, son of Abdul Qayoom Khan, both residents of Halmatpora. The duo was arrested when they were on way to sell Charas among youth. They were shifted to police station where they remained in custody.

In another action, a police party led by SHO Police Station Kupwara SI Rafiq Lone under supervision of DySP DAR Sarfaraz Bashir established a checkpoint at Tikker. During checking, the team arrested two drug peddlers identified as Mohd Hussain Lone, son of Abdul Jabbar Lone, resident of Mirnag Hyhama and Manzoor Ahmad Khoja, son of Saifuddin Khoja, resident of Manwan Awoora. On search, contraband substance was recovered from their possession. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at Police Station Kupwara and further investigation started.

Youth commits suicide, other dies in mishap**STATE TIMES NEWS**

SUNDERBANI: A youth committed suicide while other died in a road mishap at Panchayat lower Bhajwal on Wednesday.

As per details, Sunny Raina (28 yrs), son of Late Gian Chand Raina, resident of village Kalideh was found hanging with a tree. His relatives shifted him to Sub District Hospital (SDH) Sunderbani where doctors declared him as brought dead. A suicide note was also found from deceased and it is suspected that a love angle might be behind the act.

Meanwhile, Banti Shoor, son of Yog Shoor (28 yrs) resident of village Ainpur Tlani, on way from Sunderbani to his house on bike, got hit by a vehicle and got injured. He was shifted to Sub District Hospital (SDH) Sunderbani where doctors declared him as brought dead.

DMO Samba seizes Excavator, imposed fine on tractor-trolley**STATE TIMES NEWS**

SAMBA: To curb illegal mining practices in district Samba, the District Mineral Officer Mohammad Sayeed on Thursday conducted multiple inspections in Ghagwal area and imposed penalties on violators.

The DMO, under supervision of Deputy Commissioner, along with a team visited several areas of Ghagwal and seized an excavator (Pokland) machine involved in illegal mining. During inspection, they also seized material near one Crusher found illegally dumped. The DMO informed that a penalty was imposed on a tractor-trolley found illegally carrying earth material.

The DMO appealed to people to refrain from any type of illegal mining and contact control room in case of any illegal material demand. "Crusher unit holders will be held accountable if found raising minor minerals without permission," added DMO Samba.

Enforcement teams recover Rs 12,500 fine from erring traders**STATE TIMES NEWS**

RAMBAN: In view of ongoing Ramzan & forthcoming festivals, the Department of Food Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs, along with other enforcement agencies on directions of Deputy Commissioner Ramban, Mussarat Islam, conducted a massive market checking drive across the district on Thursday.

A joint team of officers of FCS&CA, Legal Metrology Department and Police carried out market checking drives in Banihal and Ukhral market and recovered Rs 12,500 as fine from defaulters. Various other enforcement teams also checked markets in their jurisdictions and booked several erring shopkeepers found failing to maintain quality of food items, not displaying rate lists, selling expired products besides indulging in illegal profiteering.

35 bovines rescued, 4 smugglers arrested**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU/SAMBA: In a massive drive against bovine smuggling, Police on Thursday rescued 31 bovines during Naka checking at two different Nakas i.e., Ban Toll Plaza and Tawi bridge, in the jurisdictions of Police Station Nagrota and Police Post Sidhra. Three different vehicles (JK03E 3570, JK02AD 4442 and JK02AN 4710) were also seized. In this regard, FIR Nos. 163 & 64/2022 under sections 188/11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Nagrota and cognizance of case taken by Police Post Sidhra. The arrested accused were identified as Khurshed Ahmed, son of Ab Gani, resident of Assar Baggar Doda; Rafaqat Hussain, son of Mohd Kalu, resident of Sidhra and Mohd Qayoom, son of Bashir Ahmed, resident of Jagti Jammu. The overall arrests and recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Instrpr Vishav Pratap Singh and Incharge Police Post Sidhra SI Majid Hussain under overall supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardip Kumar. The overall operation was done under guidance of SP Rural Sanjay Sharma.

District Police Samba also foiled an attempt to smuggle bovines by rescuing 4 bovines and arresting a bovine smuggler in jurisdiction of Police Station Ghagwal. Acting on information received through reliable sources regarding illegal transportation of bovines, a party from Police Station Ghagwal during surprise vehicle checking near main Chowk NHW Ghagwal, intercepted a Tata Mobile load carrier (JK08H/8124) for checking.

During checking, 4 bovines were found laden inside it which were rescued while driver, identified as Shakeel Ahmed, son of Nawab Din, resident of Rathian Tehsil and District Udhampur was arrested and FIR No. 64/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered against him.

Missing girl traced, reunited with family**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Police on Thursday traced a missing girl and reunited her with family.

As per details, one missing report was lodged at Police Post Bathinda by legal heirs of a missing girl stating that girl went missing from her home. In this regard a missing report was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Post Bathinda under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari led by Incharge Police Post Bathinda PSI Mohd Younis Khayand, after putting in hectic efforts, traced the missing girl. Finally family of the missing girl was informed and she was reunited with her family after completing all legal formalities.

Thief arrested, stolen car recovered**STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Police on Thursday solved a theft case by arresting an accused and recovered stolen car.

As per details, on April 17, 2022, a complaint was lodged by one Sameer Ahmed, son of Gafoor Ahmed, resident of Bharat Nagar Jammu regarding theft of his car (JK02AB/1104). In this regard, FIR No 111/22 under section 379 of IPC was registered at Police Station Bahu Fort and investigation started.

After this, a team of Police Post Narwal under supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari led by SHO Police Station Bahu Fort Instrpr Nayat Ali assisted by Incharge Police Post Narwal SI Achal Rana, after putting in strenuous efforts, rounded up a suspect namely Hari Darshan, son of Late Anil Gupta, resident of Jain Bazar. During questioning, accused confessed his crime and on his disclosure stolen vehicle was also recovered.

JAMMU: A rape case was reported at Trikuta Nagar Police Station, however accused is at large.

As per details, a woman, resident of Reasi, presently staying at Bhatinda lodged a complaint with police that one Anwar Ali, resident of Janipur had raped her on several occasions, on pretext of marriage but now he is refusing. It was also learnt that woman had acted in a movie also after which accused came in contact with her. After conducting medical examination of victim, police has registered a case and started manhunt to nab the accused.
