

Amid heatwave, states continue to face power outages **STATE TIMES NEWS**

NEW DELHI: Various states continued to grapple with power shortages on Friday amid soaring mercury pushing the demand higher while opposition parties blamed the Centre for coal shortages at thermal plants.

As the heatwave continued to intensify, the country's peak power demand met touched an all-time high of 207.11 GW on Friday while the railways cancelled 42 passenger trains to facilitate coal freight movement, with South East Central Railway (SECR) division that covers the coal-producing regions cancelling 34 trains.

J&K PDD taking steps to ensure adequate power supply: Nitishwar

SRINAGAR: On Shab-e-Qadr, Power Development Department (PDD) was able to supply 1575 MW and 170 LAC units of energy which is the highest load served to Kashmir valley on the occasion of Shab-e-qadr from 1800 hrs of 28th April 2022 to 0600 hrs of 29th April 2022.

This is 55 MW more peak achieved and about 7 Lac units of more energy supplied vis-a-vis last year's Shab-e-Qadr. During the same time period last year, 1520 MW peak load was served and 163 Lac units of energy supplied.

Maximum load served on 29th April 2021 for Jammu Division was 1001 MW which was increased to 1145 MW on 29th April 2022. At 5PM on 29th April 2021, 752 MW was served in Jammu Division which was increased to 1054 MW this year, which is 302 MW more than the last year. At 2PM 29th April last year, 894 MW load was served which was increased to 1065 MW this year for Jammu Division. ISLAMABAD/RIYADH: authorities on Friday arrested some Pakistani pilgrims for hounding and chanting abusive slogans against Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif and his delegation at the Masjid-i-Nabwi in the holy city of Madina, the Embassy of Saudi Arabia in Islamabad confirmed on Friday.

According to the media director of the Saudi embassy, the protesters have been taken into custody for "violating the regulations" and "disrespecting" the sanctity of the revered mosque by chanting "chor chor" (thieves) as soon as they saw the prime minister, Pakistan's Dawn newspaper reported.

The newly appointed prime minister is on a three-day visit to Saudi Arabia -- his first foreign trip since assuming office -- along with a delegation including Bilawal Bhutto-

faced by pilgrims, Marriyum Aurangzeb in a video message said the act was perpetrated by a "select group", while most Pakistanis respect the sanctity of the holy mosque.

"I don't want to name the person

responsible for this incident because I don't want to use this holy land for political purposes," she added.

Interior Minister Rana Sanaullah said his ministry would request the Saudi Arabia government to take "appropriate action" against the Pakistani pilgrims.

"My ministry will make a humble request to the Saudi government to take appropriate action on this matter. We are going to convey the pain the nation felt at these incidents in Masjid-i-Nabwi," he said.

Sanaullah said the Saudi authorities would be requested to identify those involved in the incident so that they could be deported to Pakistan as they were "not worthy of living on the sacred land".
