

# KPS celebrates Navreh with fervour

JAMMU: Navreh function was organized with traditional gaiety and fanfare by the Kashmiri Pandit Sabha (KPS) Jammu on Saturday.

The day marked the beginning of the Hindu calendar year 2079 Bikrami Samvat and Saptrishi Samvat 5098.

Two minutes silence was observed in the memory of those members of the Biradari who have expired during the past three years due to various reasons including the COVID-19 pandemic and other terrorist related incidents.

Advisor to the Lt Governor, R.R. Bhatnagar was the Chief Guest on the occasion and Ashok Koul, General Secretary organization of BJP for the Union Territories of J&K and Ladakh was the Guest of Honour.

The fuction started with the traditional lighting of the lamp by the chief guest and others, followed by the musical program.

Scintillating performance by singer Deepali Watal enthralled the audience with her renditions of Bhajans and other songs.

General Secretary of the Sabha, S.L Bagati read out the report of the activities of the Sabha during the past three years.

President of the Sabha, K.K Khosa, while welcoming the guests and life members of the Sabha, elaborated upon the role of the 108 year old organization of the Kashmiri Pandits during the past many decades especially after the forced exodus of the entire Kashmiri Pandit community from Kashmir in the year 1990 due to the targeted killings and other atrocities

perpetrated by the gun totting terrorists on them.

Khosa recollected how the Sabha put in all possible efforts to provide help and support to the people who had left the valley and come down to Jammu leaving all their belongings in the valley.

While thanking the Narendra Modi led GoI and the UT government led by Manoj Sinha for looking after the community while in exile, the president requested that steps should be taken immediately to ensure return and rehabilitation of the community back in the Valley with dignity, honour and full sense of security by framing a robust return and rehabilitation policy in consultation with the community's leadership. He further elaborated that the minuscule community' is facing an existential threat to it's culture and identity which can only be addressed by it's resettlement in the land of its forefathers.

The Sabha proposal to create concentrated settlements in the erstwhile three districts of Kashmir finalized after wide consultation with the community leadership in the year 2013 was reiterated by the president.

The president requested the Chief Guest to make a strong recommendation to the government of India for reservation of three assembly and one parliament seat for the Kashmiri Pandit community to enable them to send their representatives to these institutions empowering the community politically.

The president highlighted the issues being faced by the PM package employees in the valley related to their accommodation, the unjust and

unconstitutional conditions attached to their jobs affecting their promotional prospects and other security related issues as the administration is reluctant to post both husband and wife at one place. This is not only illogical but is a violation of their human rights as well.

The president requested the Advisor to address these issues on humanitarian grounds.

He made a fervent appeal for announcement of at least 6000 more class two and three posts for the youth of the community which need to be filled up on priority.

He also requested the Advisor to facilitate the passage of the long awaited temple's and shrines bill to secure our places of worship in the valley.

The president forcefully pleaded for enhancement of the monthly relief amount being paid to the displaced community from the present Rs 13000 per family being paid today to at least Rs 25000 per month in view of the rising cost of living.

He also requested that till the time return process is complete the present accommodation provided at Jammu should be properly maintained while some more accommodation should be constructed to accommodate those people who have been living in rented houses for the past 32 years.

On the occasion the sabha felicitated Ms Sandhya Dhar for being conferred with the Nari Shakti Puruskar by the GOI for her contribution towards uplifting the specially abled section of the society.

In his address, Sh. Ashok Koul asked the community to

take a resolve to go back to valley to celebrate next Navreh there. He said that we have to repeat continuously this resolve every year till we actually celebrate this function at Hari Parbhat in the valley. He also exhorted the KP Community to vote in their respective constituency in the valley and ensure winning of BJP Candidate. He stressed that all community people should make their votes in the valley by deleting in the Jammu voter list.

Hon'ble Advisor Sh. R.R. Bhatnagar said that UT Government and GOI are quite aware of the community problems and will in near future fulfill all your respirations. He said that the problem of separate posting of migrant couples serving in the valley will be looked into and efforts made to unite them at one station.

The chief guest and the guest of honor while extending their good wishes on the occasion stated that both the UT Government and the GOI are fully aware about the difficulties being faced by the displaced community and assured early redressal of all these at the earliest.

# CS visits Dal Lake, inspects restoration work of Char Chinar

SRINAGAR: Chief Secretary, Dr Arun Kumar Mehta on Saturday conducted an extensive tour of interiors of Dal Lake and took stock of various ongoing works for the development of Model In-situ Rehabilitation and Tourist Villages.

The Chief Secretary was accompanied by GOC 15 Corps, D P Pandey; Divisional Commissioner Kashmir, Pandurang K Pole; Deputy Commissioner, Srinagar; Commissioner SMC; VC LCMA; Directors of various departments including Tourism, Handloom & Handicraft, Animal Husbandry, Sheep Husbandry, Horticulture, Agriculture, Floriculture, Fisheries, Skill Development and Chief Engineers of UEED, PHE, KPDCCL and PWD besides other officers.

During the tour, the Chief Secretary stressed upon the officers to prepare a comprehensive plan for holistic development of hamlets in Dal Lake to create tourist villages.

Dr. Mehta directed officers to frame a plan under VC LCMA for five vil-

lages; Kachri Mohalla, Sofi Mohalla, Tinda Mohallah, Akhoon Mohalla, Vegetable market and floating garden on pilot basis for the development of tourist villages having all basic facilities for inhabitants as well as tourists and local visitors.

The Chief Secretary also asked the officers that the development of tourist villages should be carried in such a manner that they will provide home stay facilities to tourists.

While asking for handholding of youth of these areas, Dr. Mehta directed the officers of Handloom & Handicraft and Skill Development to establish skill training centers in these areas for imparting skill training to educated youth of these hamlets in relevant trades.

He also directed other officers to utilize schemes of respective departments for the benefit of educated local unemployed youth and aware maximum people about those schemes.

Dr. Mehta, on the occasion asked the officers to explore the possibilities under mission youth scheme for

development of these Model villages and stressed on creation of youth clubs in these areas and their involvement in sustainable development of these hamlets.

Highlighting about creating awareness among people regarding various welfare schemes, the Chief Secretary directed officers of Fisheries, Floriculture, Agriculture, Animal Husbandry and Sheep Husbandry to acquaint people about the beneficiary schemes implemented by their respective departments so that local people would get employment and reap maximum benefits out of them.

During the tour, several Dal dwellers also interacted with the Chief Secretary and apprised him regarding various issues like dredging of channels, power, washroom for tourists, development of parks besides sought technological guidance from various departments on various issues related to conservation of Dal Lake.

Earlier, the Chief Secretary also visited Char Chinar and inspected its ongoing restoration works.

SRINAGAR: Chief Secretary, Dr Arun Kumar Mehta, on Saturday had a detailed review of arrangements being put in place by divisional administration for the Holy Month of Ramzan and Navratri festival.

Chief Secretary took stock of availability of essentials including ration, kerosene, LPG, electricity and water supply in the valley.

Divisional Commissioner Kashmir, Pandurang K Pole, DC Srinagar, Commissioner SMC and Chief Engineers of line departments were present on the occasion.

Chief Secretary asked the officers of all departments to ensure that all necessary services are extended to the people during the month so that they celebrate their religious days in a convenient

manner. He directed KPDCCL officers to ensure uninterrupted power supply at peak hours of Sehri and Iftaar. He also directed the PHE officers to ensure adequate supply of drinking water to the public during the period.

Chief Secretary further directed for continuous market checking to curb profiteering and hoarding by traders and shopkeepers. He asked for initiating strict action against the erring traders so that the innocent customers do not suffer on this account.

Later, Chief Secretary took stock of arrangements put in place to facilitate devotees during Navratri festival like sanitation, electricity and water supply and other basic amenities put in place at various temples including

Shankaracharya, Hariparbat, Kheer Bhawani and other such destinations of the valley.

Divisional Commissioner briefed the meeting that sufficient quantity of essentials has been made available by the Food and Civil Supplies and Consumer Affairs Department for convenience of the people. He informed that adequate measures have been taken up to ensure essential supply of consumables during the festive days adding that sufficient stock for a couple of months has been distributed among districts.

He said directions have been given to district administrations to keep stocks available to people living in remote areas so that they don't face any difficulty during the month of fasting.

These works had been conceived by the gram panchayats and were thrown open for public use in festive fervour.

Sports tournaments were also organized with active participation of youth. It is in place to mention that playfields have been developed throughout district Anantnag and sports equipment distributed in all Panchayat Halqas during the B2V2 programme held last year.

The district administration has extended all support to ensure that youth have avenues to channelize their energy in a productive fashion.

The District Administration has issued an activity schedule to hold gram sabhas and various other activities in all 335 panchayas in the first phase of Gram Swaraj Mahina.

ANANTNAG: Various Gram Swaraj Mahina related activities were kick started on Saturday . The activities are aimed at highlighting achievements of panchayats in the last year, carry out awareness programs and adopt resolutions for sustainable development in Panchayats and deliberate at the Panchayat level on development plans for the present fiscal.

Joint departmental camps will be organised to achieve saturation in various welfare schemes and social audits conducted at halqa panchayat level. The following shall be eligible to participate in this special round of physical counselling: -

- Candidates who have not been allotted any seat during the 1st / 2nd / mop up (3rd) round of counselling can participate in this special round of counselling in terms of conditions contained in the e-Information Brochure.
- Candidates who have been allotted a seat during 1st round of counselling and have joined the college but have not been upgraded during the 2nd or mop-up (3rd) round and those candidates who have been allotted seat during the 2nd or mop-up (3rd) round of counselling and have joined the college/institution and wish to participate in the mop-up round for purpose of upgradation. However, any candidate who has been upgraded during the 2nd or mop-up (3rd)round shall under no circumstances be eligible to participate in this special round of counselling.
