

DC Jammu reviews progress of works under B2V3

JAMMU: Deputy Commissioner Anshul Garg on Monday reviewed the progress of works proposed under B2V3 as on March 31, '22.

The concerned official informed the Chair that a total 485 works including 452 works of Rural Development Department have been proposed under Back to Villagell across 305 Panchayats of the district.

"Out 485 works, 451 works have already been approved and tendered", the meeting was told.

The concerned officials further apprised the Deputy Commissioner that 368 works have been allotted out of which work on 228 has been started and 78 are nearing completion.

Speaking on the occasion, the DC stressed on the concerned authorities to take all possible measures to accelerate the pace

of work on different projects. He asked them to submit the report regarding progress of works till March 15.

The Deputy Commissioner

exhorted for mobilizing men and machinery for completing the projects in stipulated time frame besides urged to ensure productive and fruitful utilization

of the available resources. Among others, CPO Yoginder Katoch and senior officers from concerned departments were present in the meeting.

SRINAGAR: Set target of 100 % saturation of all Individual Beneficiary Schemes directed Divisional Commissioner Kashmir Pandurang K Pole to officers while reviewing the implementation of Individual Beneficiary Oriented Schemes (IBOS) and Centrally Sponsored Schemes (CSS) in a meeting with officers of different departments, here.

Besides, he stressed on them to elaborate the details and guidelines of Centrally Sponsored Schemes to these officers by employing the services of resource persons so that the benefits will reach to the people.

Div Com also impressed on publication of contents of individual beneficiary oriented schemes besides display the details on dashboards and hoarding for mass awareness regarding schemes.

While reviewing targets achieved by different departments, Div Com asked concerned officers to broaden the scope of schemes and increase the number of beneficiaries to achieve hundred percent saturation.

Further, he directed officers present to upload the details of all beneficiaries on official websites so any person can access and evaluate nature of benefit and efficiency of schemes.

He stressed on flagging and addressing of constraints if any faced in implementation of any CSS.

DC Poonch directs for efficient, prompt, hassle-free revenue services to public

POONCH: Deputy Commissioner Poonch, Inder Jeet, today directed revenue officials and field staff to ensure efficient prompt and hassle free revenue services to the general public.

He was reviewing the functioning of the Revenue Department here at a meeting held in the meeting hall of Dak Bunglow Surankote.

The meeting held threadbare deliberations on various Revenue related matters including eviction of encroachments on Kahcharai and State Land, recording of Jamabandies, recovery fee, progress under SVAMITVA, digitization of records, redressal of grievances, evacee property details and various other revenue related issues.

At the outset, the chair was given a detailed account of the different Revenue related matters of the district.

While reviewing the progress of writing Jamabandies, the DC asked the Tehsildars/Naib Tehsildars to complete exercise well within stipulated time period and warned of strict action against the non performers. Discussing the status of the public grievances, he issued instructions for time bound disposal of complaints. He also directed all the tehsildars to submit the details of mutation attested From Jan 2021 to Dec 2021.

The DC also directed all the Tehsildars and Naib Tehsildar to submit a weekly progress report of identification of revenue records which are missing, non traceable, damaged or otherwise to the administrative department for further appraisal to the office of chief secretary. The DC also reviewed the revenue court cases right from the court of

the Deputy Commissioner and Tehsildars. The Deputy Commissioner asked the concerned officers to remove commercial encroachment and submit the compliance report within a week and ensure that no re-encroachment occurs by doing geo-tagging and bio-fencing. The Deputy Commissioner directed Naib Tehsildar Khanater/ Haveli to remove the encroachments near Poonch city within one week except residential houses and prioritize prime land. He directed for retrieval of the prime land within one week and issuance of advance 15-day notice to the residents who are in possession of any state land. The Deputy commissioner directed all the Tehsildars to organise camps on Aap Ki Zameen Aap Ki Nigrani and aware the general public of their respective areas and compile daily progress reports.

For e-office implementation, the Deputy Commissioner asked the ADC and DIO NIC to submit the details regarding availability of computers. He further asked the SDMs and tehsildars to submit the report regarding availability/requirement of computer and rationalization thereof, so that physical file could be shifted into online system.

The meeting was attended by Additional Deputy Commissioner, Dr. Basharat Hussain; Assistant Commissioner Revenue, Zaheer Ahmed Kaifi; SDM Surankote, Naheem-un Nissa Bhatti; SDM Mendhar; Dr.Sahil Jandyal; Tehsildar Surankote, Sheraz Ahmed; Tehsildar Mandi, Shazad Latief Khan and Naib Tehsildars besides all district and Sectoral officers.
