

All JK colleges to start skill courses this year: Kansal

JAMMU: 'A good college strives to give employability to youth and its strength lies in its academic excellence. The quality and quantum of improvement it brings in lives is the true test of its impact on society.' The remarks were made on Monday by Principal Secretary Higher Education Department, Rohit Kansal during e-inauguration of an additional block in Government Degree College Marh.

The Principal Secretary assured that construction of the college campus would be started in this financial year and it would be ready to move by early next year. The college runs from a pre-fabricated structure at present.

It was assured by the Principal Secretary that the UT administration would provide more pre-fabricated structures for the college in the present financial year. It was also suggested that the college submit detailed project report, to Director Planning, for additional infrastructural requirement of the college.

Among other things, the Principal Secretary directed colleges to prepare framework of courses to be provided under the National Education Policy

He called for giving students facility to provide feedback on quality of instruction through feedback system. In return, it would provide teachers a chance to improve and build on their strengths, said the Principal Secretary and added that set guidelines in this regard would also be introduced.

The Principal Secretary suggested for starting pre-admission and career counselling facility in colleges and advised them improvement of surroundings, cleanliness of common areas and toilets.

BJP accuses Cong of unleashing propaganda against delimitation commission

JAMMU: Expressing satisfaction over the functioning of Delimitation Commission, Jammu and Kashmir BJP president Ravinder Raina on Monday accused Congress of unleashing a "propaganda" against the independent body after losing credibility among the people.

Raina made the remarks shortly after meeting the members of the Delimitation Commission headed by Justice (Retired) Ranjana Prakash Desai at the convention centre here.

Talking to reporters after meeting the commission, Raina said Justice Desai led the commission with chief election commissioner Sushil Chandra and state election commissioner K K Sharma as its members have done a tremendous job and came out with its draft proposal after over two years of hard work.

"They are available to hear the grievances and are meeting various delegations including elected panchayat members, represen-

tatives of public and former legislators. People put forth their concerns and grievances and the commission heard them. We are hopeful that the commission will seriously look into the representations for redressal before preparing its final report, the BJP leader said.

Asked about Congress terming the exercise as an eyewash to put a stamp on the report allegedly made at the behest of BJP, Raina said the commission is an autonomous body and headed by former chief justice of Supreme Court.

Some political parties have lost their credibility in Jammu and Kashmir and are involved in such type of propaganda and Congress is one among them, he said.

The BJP leader said the commission is expected to submit its final report by its timeline of May 6 and we are hopeful that it will be followed by assembly elections which will take place within six to eight months as announced by the Prime Minister and Home minister.

J&K Cong stages protest against Delimitation Commission in Jammu

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir unit of Congress on Monday staged a protest against delimitation commission here, urging the visiting team to provide sufficient time to the party so that it can highlight the irregularities in its draft report in a proper way.

The protest led by J&K Pradesh Congress Committee president G A Mir coincided with the start of the public sitting of the delimitation commission on its report which was made public last month after nearly a two-year-long exercise.

The commission headed by Justice (Retired) Ranjana Prakash Desai reached here on a three-day visit to Jammu and Kashmir on Sunday. The delegation started interaction with delegations from across Jammu region on Monday morning and they are scheduled to visit Srinagar later in the day for a similar exercise on Tuesday.

Carrying placards and shouting slogans, the Congress activists led by Mir and other senior party leaders including former ministers and legislators assembled outside their

party headquarters at Shaheedi Chowk in the heart of Jammu and staged a sit-in against the delimitation commission.

We are holding this peaceful protest against the delimitation commission over its draft report which is against settled norms, ground situations and containing large scale irregularities, Mir told reporters.

The Commission had invited claims and suggestions from all political parties, organizations and individuals from March 14-21 after putting draft report in public domain.

The Commission had received over 400 suggestions and objections which were in addition to those already received from five Associate Members including Union Minister Jitendra Singh and Jugal

Kishore Sharma, both BJP MPs from Jammu division and Farooq Abdullah, Mohammad Akbar Lone and Hasnain Masoodi, all three National Conference MPs from Kashmir.

We have submitted a detailed objections to the commission and want the commission to hear us for the benefit of the aggrieved population. We have not been given any time that shows they are on a picnic and fulfilling the formalities to put a public stamp on their report made at the behest of BJP, Mir said.

Suggesting the commission to extend their stay in Jammu and Kashmir by one more day to give sufficient time to all parties especially Congress to explain its objections before it, Mir claimed that the report had given tension to the public as it was

prepared in violation of the set parameters and rules like population, terrain and means of communication.

After downgrading J&K to a union territory, the report has now completely bulldozed the local units...What are they going to understand in a short time and by clubbing delegations? People are angry and there is nobody to listen to them neither the administration nor the commission, he said.

Terming the report as highly objectionable, Mir said several constituencies have less than 50,000 voters while others more than 1.50 lakh. He said Congress was hoping for one more Lok Sabha seat for Jammu region but the commission's readjustment of Anantnag Lok Sabha seat and inclusion of Rajouri and Poonch dis-

tricts in it is most unreasonable and against the public interests and convenience.


There are several irregularities and violations which need to be fully reviewed and reconsidered but the Commission is merely doing an eye wash to complete the formality, he said.

Pendency of petitions shall not come in way of BCCI to finalise constitution of JKCA: HC

SRINAGAR: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir High Court comprising Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey and Justice Punit Gupta held that pendency of writ petitions shall not come in way of BCCI to finalize the Constitution of JKCA and for electing a new body in consultation with all the stakeholders as directed in terms of final order dated March 23, 2021.

Division Bench observed that the subject of these writ petitions has reference to the challenge to the decision of the then Ombudsman, JKCA, as appointed by the Court at the relevant point of time.

DB further observed that in terms of final order/judgment passed on

March 23, 2021 in appeals challenging the

Constitution of the JKCA made by the then Committee, the Court had while disposing of the appeals, passed certain directions which include a direction to the BCCI to supervise, run the management, control and administration of the JKCA as an interim measure till a new body of the JKCA is elected under its supervision. Further direction to the BCCI had reference to finalizing the amendment, if any, in Constitution of the JKCA, and for electing a new body. The Court being conscious of the controversies/disputes, had already authorized the BCCI to take on board all the stakeholders, including the parties litigating before this Court i.e. the representatives of the then Ombudsman, JKCA, as appointed by the Court at the relevant point of time.

DB further observed that in terms of final order/judgment passed on March 23, 2021 in appeals challenging the

Constitution of the JKCA and for electing a new body.
