
SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir on Tuesday reported 12 fresh Covid cases that took the infection tally to 4.53,827, officials said.

18 Indian, 4 Pakistani YouTube-based news channels blocked

NEW DELHI: The Ministry Information Broadcasting has directed the blocking of 22 YouTubebased news channels, of which four are from Pakistan, alleging that they were spreading fake news that could impact national security, foreign relations and public order.

This is the first time that action has been taken against the Indian YouTubebased news publishers since the notification of the IT Rules, 2021 in February last year, it said

Union Minister Anurag Thakur asserted that the government will not shy away from taking such action in the future as well.

In an official statement, the ministry said it issued an order on Monday to block 22 YouTube channels, three Twitter accounts, Facebook account and one news website.

With this action, the ministry has, since December 2021, issued directions for blocking 78 YouTube-based news channels and several other social media accounts on grounds related to national security, sovereignty and integrity of India, public order, etc. "Out of the

General of Police Dilbagh Singh on Tuesday said the attacks on civilians and security forces in Jammu and Kashmir will not be tolerated and action will be taken against the perpetrators.

He said the attacks are orchestrated from a neighbouring country where some people cannot digest peace and tranquility in the Valley.

"These attacks are condemnable and have been rightly condemned in civil circles. These acts are inhuman and will not be tolerated at any cost," Singh said.

He was interacting with media persons after a



wreath-laying ceremony of head constable Vishal Kumar of CRPF, who was killed in a militant attack at Maisuma in the city on Monday.

The Bhat family is one of the two Kashmiri Pandit families in Chotigam, nearly 10 km from the Shopian district headquarters and 70 km from Srinagar.

The region is a hotbed of militancy and is considered a stronghold of the terrorist group Lashkar-e-Taiba.

"We have lived here all along and never left the place. I will add that we have never felt threatened," Bal Krishan Bhat's brother Anil Bhat told PTI.

"We don't know what is in store for us, all our neighbours are very nice, but how will we counter the threat of gun. We will decide on our future course only after my brother returns from

Voice votes taken 200 times during passage of CA Bill in RS

NEW DELHI: Rajya Sabha saw voice votes being taken a whopping 200 times for the passage of a bill on Tuesday as the House gave clause by clause approval, reflecting the procedural rigours involved in enacting legisla-

debate on the Chartered Accountants, the Cost and Works Accountants Company and $_{
m the}$ Secretaries (Amendment) Bill, 2022 including the reply of the Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman took about two hours and twenty minutes.

However, the process of voting on the 106 clauses and clause-wise amendments took over 30 minutes, Rajya Sabha officials said.

According Secretariat officials, it was after a long time that a bill with so many clauses and amendments was passed with voting taking substantial time.

Procedurally, each clause, if amendments are moved, is required to be put to vote twice based on the number of members moving amendments to each clause.

CPI-M member John Brittas gave 163 notices for amendments to various clauses in the Bill and moved almost all of them during the clause-wise consideration of the Bill. CPI's Binoy Viswam also moved a few other amendments.
