CRIME REPORT

Narco smuggler arrested with 2.2 Kg brown sugar

KUPWARA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, Police on Wednesday arrested a narco smuggler in Kupwara and recovered narcotics from his possession. Acting on specific input regarding the narcotics smuggling, Police arrested a smuggler identified as Rafaaqat Khurshed, son of Khurshed Ahmad, resident of Gabdoori Nawagabra, Karnah. During questioning, he confessed that he has received consignment of narcotics from across the LoC. He further disclosed that he had concealed narcotics in forest area of Hajitra. On this, Police along with concerned Magistrate raided the specific spot and recovered 2.2 Kg Brown Sugar concealed in three packets. Accordingly, FIR No. 18/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Karnah and further investigation started. More arrests are expected in case.

Geology & Mining Deptt goes tough against illegal mining

SAMBA: In continuation to its drive against illegal mining, transportation and storage/dumping of minor minerals, the department of geology and mining has booked several persons found dumping minor minerals in contravention with laws and without a valid license. Two illegal dumps were seized on spot and handed-over to the police party, accompanying DMO Samba. Meanwhile, fine was also imposed on three defaulters on the spot.

The District Mining officer has asked all those associated with mining activities to abide by rules and take necessary permissions before doing any type of mining activity. He also requested general public to extend all possible cooperation to the department to enforce rules strictly to meet the demand of building material besides preserving fragile ecological system. He further informed that there are multi-departmental task force Committees in place which include officers from civil administration, police department, forest and wildlife, irrigation and flood control etc who are active at every level and any violation can be reported to them directly.

Four missing persons traced, reunited with families

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday traced four missing persons and reunited them with their families.

As per the details, information was received at Police Station Gandhi Nagar, regarding missing of one Nareesh Gandotra, son of Shanti Sarup, resident of Extension Nanak Nagar. On this missing report was lodged and investigation started. A team from Police Station Gandhi Nagar under the supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gandhi Nagar Insp Pankaj Sharma, after putting in hectic efforts, traced the missing person.

Similarly, another missing report regarding one Sahil Kundal, son of Sat Paul Kundal, resident of Bishnah was lodged at Police Post Talab Tillo. On this, a team of Police Post Talab Tillo under supervision of DySP Hqrs Swati Sharma led by

SHO Nowabad Inspr Vijay Kumar assisted by Incharge Police Post Talab Tillo PSI Rajesh Kumar, after putting in hectic efforts, traced the missing person. Another complainant report regarding missing of one Miyan Khan, resident of Bhata Kharota Tehsil Bhalwal District Jammu was lodged at Police Station Gharota. On this, a team under supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial led by SHO Gharota Insp Rajesh Khajuria traced missing person.

At Kathua, on August 7, 2021 a missing report was lodged at Police Station Rajbagh by one Parshotam Lal, resident of Chhan Lal Din, Tehsil Marheen District Kathua stating therein that his son namely Arjun Kumar went missing. Accordingly, missing report was lodged and search was launched to trace him. After putting in hectic efforts, the missing boy was traced. All traced person was handed over to their legal heirs after completion of all legal formalities.

4 bovines rescued, vehicle seized

KATHUA: Tightening noose on bovine smuggling under overall supervision of SSP R C Kotwal, Kathua Police rescued 4 bovines and seized a vehicle at Hiranagar.

As per details, a police team led by Insp Sunil Kumar SHO Police Station Hiranagar under supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan, during routine naka/checking duty in its jurisdictional area noticed few suspects, who on seeing police party, managed to flee leaving behind 4 bovines along with a bike (PB06AS-7616). The bovines were rescued and bike was seized. A case has been registered at Police Station Hiranagar vide FIR No. 42/2022 under section 188 of IPC.

Bootlegger arrested 23 bottles of illicit liquor

AKHNOOR: Police on Wednesday arrested a bootlegger and recovered 23 bottles of illicit liquor from his possession.

As per details, a bootlegger namely Mohinder Kumar, son of Mohan Lal, resident of Rajgarh District Chura Rajasthan at present Gumpul Tehsil Bhalwal Jammu was arrested by Akhnoor Police. On checking, 23 bottles of illicit liquor were recovered from his possession, which he was carrying for selling purpose. FIR No. 87/2022 under section 48 (A), (F) of Excise Act was registered against him. The arrest was made by a party of Police Station Akhnoor led by SHO Hilal Azhar.

Bike-lifter nabbed, stolen vehicle recovered

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday solved a theft case by arresting a bike-lifter and recovered stolen bike.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Peernitha by one Akhil Gupta, son of Vipan Gupta, resident of Dhakki Sarajan Jammu stating that his bike (JK02BK 4114) was stolen near Peer Kho. On this, FIR No 21/2022 under section 379 of IPC was registered and investigation started.

After this, a team of Police Station Peernitha under supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu led by SHO Peernitha Inspr Zaheer, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of CCTV footages of area, rounded up a suspect namely Shubam Dogra, son of Sham Lal, resident of Peernitha. During intensive questioning, accused confessed his crime and on his disclosure, stolen bike was also recovered.

Police proclaims court notice by beating drums

As per details, in compliance to order of the Court of 2nd Addl. Distt & Session Judge Jammu, SHO Police Station Gangval Insp Joginder Singh Chib along with other officials beat drum, made announcements and attached court order at conspicuous places to make accused and his legal-heirs aware of court order.

Court Jammu issued a notice of proclamation against accused Kuldeep Singh alias Ladi, son of Mohinder Singh, resident of Santokh Vihar, Kalu Chak, Jammu who was evading arrest in FIR No. 116/2003 under sections 302/307/326/149 of RPC of Police Station Gangval. The act was done to aware parents of accused regarding court order so that accused could not deny information of the same.

Ten vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which teams from various Police Stations made a massive recovery of vehicles involved in illegal mining.

The police teams of Police Stations Bahu Fort and Domana acted stringently on the specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 10 different vehicles, which included a tipper (JK02BB 2064) seized by Bahu Fort police and 8 tractor-trolleys and a mini-tipper without registration number seized by Domana Police.

The overall recoveries were made by SHO Bahu Fort Insp Nayat Ali and SHO Domana Insp Mahesh Sharma in their respective jurisdictions.

DFCO Ramban seals 3 unauthorised medical shops

RAMBAN: Drug and Food Control Organization, Ramban on Wednesday carried out an extensive inspection in far-flung areas of Tehsil Rajgarh. The inspection team inspected medical shops in villages Bhartund, Trihal, Budni, Thatta, Grala, Rajgarh Town, Chuchatter, Chakka, Bibrota, DiyarGali, Gharagrath, Sulli, Kumate, Sharava and Dahandla. During inspection, the team sealed 3 unregistered medical stores being operated at Bhartund/Trihal, Gralla & Kumate.

The inspection team also inspected registered medical stores located in Rajgarh and its adjoining areas.

Out of 6 retail sale outlets, operation of 3 retail medical stores were disallowed for violation of conditions of drug licenses as mandated under relevant provisions of Drugs & Cosmetics Act 1940.

Walnut factory damaged in fire

JAMMU: A walnut processing plant was damaged in a massive fire in Samba district on Wednesday, officials said. The fire broke out in Birpur industrial complex at Bari Brahmana around 2 AM, they said.

The officials further said that factory suffered extensive damage in the fire, which was brought under control by the official of fire & emergency services after a 12-hour-long operation. Over a dozen fire tenders were pressed into service to put off blaze, they said, adding that none was reported injured. The cause of the fire was not known immediately.

In another fire incident, the officials said, a cloth showroom was gutted at Residency road, Jammu on Tuesday night.

The fire was caused by an electrical short circuit and was put off by the fire and emergency services timely, averting a major loss, they said.
