Construction of Gabion Check-dams HC refuses to quash Challan in case regarding misappropriation of Rs 35 lakh

JAMMU: Justice Sanjay Dhar of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court Srinagar Wing refused to quash a Challan presented by the Vigilance Organization (now ACB) in a much publicized misappropriation case of Rs 35 lakh for construction of Gabion Check-dams.

While dismissing the petition, Justice Sanjay Dhar observed that it is clear that it is not necessary that every participant in a criminal conspiracy should have knowledge of the part that is being played by other co-conspirators or that his participation should be from very inception of the conspiracy to its actual execution i.e. commission of actual offence. Contention of the counsel for the petitioners that the petitioners were disassociated from the entire process long before actual works were executed and payments were made to the beneficiaries and, as such, they cannot be booked for offence of criminal conspiracy, is without any merit, the Court observed.

The petitioners have challenged charge-sheet arising out of FIR No.25/2010 for offences under Sections 5(1)(c), 5(1)(d) read with Sections 5(2) of J&K Prevention of Corruption Act and Sections 120-B, 467, 468, 471, 409, 420 and

Zaigham of DPS Jammu shines in national science conference


