- Whereas, on your selection as constable in J&K, Armed Public, you were provisionally appointed as constable by Commandant IRP-25th Bn, vide his office order No. 28 of 2019 Dated:- 22-06-2019 and you joined the department on the same date i.e 22-06-2019.
- Whereas, on your transfer from IRP-25th Bn, to this unit vide APHQ J&K Order No. 710 of 2019 Dated:- 17-10-2019 after having been relieved by Commandant concerned you joined this unit in the month of November 2019.
- Whereas, you are under probationary period and are yet to be confirmed.
- Whereas, being member of the disciplined force, vide PHQ J&K order No. 736 of 2022 dated 28-02-2022 read with PHQ wire message No. Trg/17/2022/12699 dated:- 28-02-2022 followed by APHQ J&K endorsement No. APHQ/Trg/08/2022/5674-5706 dated:- 02-03-2022, among other you were selected to undergo Months BRTC at SPS PTS Kathua w.e.f 07-03-2022.
- Whereas following your selection for BRTC as mentioned above you were relieved from this unit w.e.f 05-03-2022 vide this of the relieving order issued under No. Estt/BRTC-124/IRP-10th/22/4145-60 dated 05-03-2022 with the direction to reported Principal PTS Kathua well in time to attend training programme.
- Whereas, Principal SPS PTC Kathua vide his office signal No. Trg/BRTC/22/2084-2121 dated 12-03-2022, communicated that you have not reported at the said training institute to undergo BRTC.
- Whereas, on the reception of aforesaid communication from Principal SPS Kathua you were informed through your concerned Police station vide this office signal No. Estt/BRTC/IRP-10th/00/4698-4701 dated 12-03-2022 to report to principal SPS PTS Kathua forthwith for undergoing the BRTC as you were already relieved for the said purpose from this unit.
- Whereas, you were properly got informed by I/C PP Rangrait Srinagar as per his communication No. 176/P-A/PPR/22 dated:- 23-03-2022.
- Whereas, neither you reported back to battalion headquarters nor at the said Training centre till date despite having being informed through concerned Police Station as well as telephonically by the battalion Admn, as a result your unauthorized absence was recorded in unit daily diary vide DD report No. 05 dated:- 14-03-2022 w.e.f 05-03-2022 i.e the date you were relieved from this unit to undergo BRTC.
- Whereas, in view of obvious violation and defiance of PHQ J&K orders as well as desecration of duties, you were placed unit suspension vide this office order No. 99 of 2022 dated 16-03-2022 and a proper departmental enquiry into you conduct has been initiated and entrusted to Shri Munish Kumar-SP of this unit.
- Whereas, you not only absent duties un-authorizedly, but also waste the sanction accorded in your favour by PHQ J&K Alment BRTC, Which is a clear loss of Govt. Exchequer and obvious violation and defiance of PHQ J&K orders.
- Whereas, un-authorized absence from duties is also a clear loss of appointment in terms of Article 128 J&K CSR and you were not at the liberty to leave the duties without any permission in light of rule 10 and 30 of J&K Police Manual.
- Whereas, the enquiry officer also informed you through your concerned Police Station to resume your duties and to face the department enquiry.
- Whereas, till date neither you resumed your duties nor bothered to face the departmental enquiry before the enquiry officer, besides noting has been heard from your end regarding your whereabouts and non-resumption of duties/ Non-attendance to the selected course.
- Whereas, prior to the instant sanction/ deputation, twice sanction/ deputation to attend BRTC was earlies accorded in your favour in terms of PHQ J&K order No. 4939 of 2019 dated 24-12-2019 read with PHQ wireless message No. Trg/120/2019/75214 dated 23-12-2019 & PHQ J&K Signal No. Trg/34/2021/52830 dated:- 06-03-2021. but in response to first communication/sanction you did not attend BRTC at STC Talwara and in response to later PHQ J&K Communication you reported at PTS Manigam and later absented un-authorizedly on the same day on which you reported there as a result you were struck off from the said training centre and were reverted back to the parent unit.
- Whereas, on the above, it reveals that you are not interested to serve the department anymore and your formal existence on the rolls of the department for furthermore is not fruitful.
- Whereas, being probationary and member of the disciplined force, you were not at the liberty to leave you formal existence on your of until you have been expressively allowed to left, and the act on part of you being provationer is clear obciour violation you defiance of PHQ J&K order as well as desecration of duties, warrants a Strict disciplinary action to be taken against you until rules.
- Whereas, in light of PHQ J&K Order No. 242 of 2003 dated:- 17-01-2003 and in view of your continuous failure to attend BRTC despite of repeated sanctions for the said purpose, you are liable to be discharge from govt. services.

Consequent upon the above, I Fayaz Ahmed-SSP, Commandant IRP-10th Bn Issue this Show cause notice to you, that "why you should not be discharged from the service on account of aforesaid reasons and for wasting the Govt. Sanction accorded in your favour to undergo BRTC as well as non-responding of Communications made by the department for resumption of duties. Your reply should reach to this office within (03) days positively from the date of issuance of this notice alongwith cause of not attending the selected course/ not reporting for duties till date and evidence, if any in support to your written consent. Failing to which or late responding or approaching to this headquarters after the expiry of given period, you will be discharged from service accordingly without wasting further time of the department being probationer without issuing further notice(s).
