Unnecessary diversions, improper use of traffic signals adding to woes of commuters

SRINAGAR: Unnecessary diversions and improper use of traffic signals on major roads in Srinagar are creating traffic congestion thereby affecting free flow of commuters bound for tourist places like Mughal Gardens, Harwan Garden, Tulip Garden and other scenic places. Commuters alleged that authorities failed to put in place an effective traffic light system at busy intersections, causing hardships for passengers.

Most of the commuters said that closure of one of the lanes for vehicles bound towards other sides, cause inconvenience to them. Commuters bound for Boulevard from Lal Chowk, have to take U-turn near Khonakhan bridge. Similarly passengers coming from Abdullah Bridge have to take U-turn near Modern Hospital and commuters coming from Budshah Chowk have to take U-turn for Residency road near Sangarmall complex. These exercises prevent smooth flow of vehicular movement from old city towards other places besides leading to gridlocks at different crossings. "These days there are a huge flow of tourists and public transport is already diverted towards other route. Due to fear of traffic jams on normal days, taxi operators move via Gupka road leaving many passengers stranded. We understand that sometimes diversions are imposed to streamline traffic, but the bottleneck at different places is only creating problems for passengers. We hope that traffic department will look into the issue as these diversions are hindering essential service like ambulances coming from the district headquarters and adjoining areas of Srinagar city," a local said. The volume of vehicles on roads has increased manifold during last few decades but roads are still the same. Stray animals on roads also add to the mess prevailing in city. Government should step in and widen city roads so that city-dwellers can get rid of traffic mess.

"Authorities have installed traffic lights at many places in Srinagar but traffic signals are yet to be made operational. Government should prioritize operationalising traffic lights. I think it will play an important role in reducing traffic jams," told a resident, adding, "Road infrastructure in Srinagar is far below standard. People use their personal vehicles for short distances. There is a problem with traffic management. Proper traffic management and upgradation of road infrastructure are keys to manage continuously increasing vehicles on city roads."

Hostel have been catered in the first phase.

JAMMU: The Excise Department on Friday said revenue of Rs. 2045.34 crore, including Rs.36.06 crore from Ladakh, has been realised during the financial year 2019-20. This also includes toll revenue of Rs.727.75 crore realised upto 31st of December, 2019.

Reacting to a news report published in a local daily newspaper, the department clarified that since the abolishing of all

the toll posts by the government with effect from January 1, 2020, vide notification SO 59 dated 31/12/2019 and SO 60 dated 31/12/2019 issued by the Finance department, an amount of Rs.1353.81 crore was collected in the financial year 2020-21 as excise revenue by the Excise Department as toll tax, which had already been abolished by the government vide aforementioned SOs.

After implementation of new Excise Policy from 2021-22, a revenue of Rs.1777.37 crore has been collected by the department, Rs.423.56 crore more than the excise revenue realized by the department during the year 2020-21.

For the policy year 2021-22, 228 liquor vending were put on e-auction, of which, 221 licenses were issued. During the current year, 279 liquor vending were put on e-auction, of which, 252 vending have been cleared for allotment of JKEIL-2 license.
