in Pakistan and have been floated under a deep-rooted conspiracy to portray terrorism in Jammu and Kashmir as home-grown insurgency, the NIA official said.

A well-organised propaganda machinery operating on cyberspace through various websites, blogs, social media handles, closed channels on encrypted communication platforms wherein concocted and skewed narrative is presented to impressionable and Pakistan-based nodes have been used to radicalise youth, the spokesperson said.

All this media propaganda of different terrorist outfits was epicentred around common nodes operating from Pakistan, the NIA official said.

A key element of aforementioned conspiracy was inducting new cadres in form of "hybrid terrorists" belonging to various walks of life, who could use their cover to remain rooted in the society and simultaneously carry out instructions of their terrorist handlers, the spokesperson said.

While acting as an overground worker, they were also found indulging in terrorist actions such as grenade lobbing, undertaking lone attacks on vulnerable targets, arson among others, the NIA official said.

The investigation has also revealed a clear shift in the strategy of terrorist organisation towards targeted killings of minorities, civilians, migrants, government officials and unguarded security personnel, the official said, adding that further investigation into the case continues.

Saeed, a UN-designated terrorist on whom the US has placed a USD 10 million bounty, was arrested in July 2019 in the terror financing cases.

Saeed-led JuD is the front organisation for the Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) which is responsible for carrying out the 2008 Mumbai attack that killed 166 people, including six Americans.

The US Department of the Treasury has designated Saeed as a Specially Designated Global Terrorist.

The global terror financing watchdog Financial Action Task Force (FATF) is instrumental in pushing Pakistan to take measures against terrorists roaming freely in Pakistan and using its territory to carry out attacks in India.

Pakistan has been on the grey list' of the Paris-based Financial Action Task Force (FATF) since June 2018 for failing to check money laundering, leading to terror financing, and was given a plan of action to complete it by October 2019.

Since then, the country continues to be on that list due to its failure to comply with the FATF mandates.

Pakistan has so far avoided being on the black list with the help of close allies like China, Turkey and Malaysia.

The FATF is an inter-governmental body established in 1989 to combat money laundering, terrorist financing and other related threats to the integrity of the international financial system.

### Over 1.76 lakh...

the highest 37,381 pilgrims have visited the cave shrine on the first day of 'Navratra' on April 2, followed by 33,340 on the second Navratra, 29,078 on 3rd, 27,302 on 4th, 29,078 on the 5th and over 20,000 on the 6th day, they said.

and the second dose to the eligible population as well as the precaution dose to healthcare workers, frontline workers and those above 60 years will be accelerated, the ministry stated.

So far, about 96 per cent of all those above the age of 15 years in the country have received at least one COVID-19 vaccine dose, while about 83 per cent have received both doses. More than 2.4 crore precaution doses have also been administered to healthcare workers, frontline workers and those aged above 60 years. Besides, 45 per cent of beneficiaries in the 12-14 years age group have also received the first dose, the ministry said. The cumulative number of COVID-19 vaccine doses administered in the country has exceeded 185.38 crore.

one of the two appeals, said that he was not pressing that point at all .

"No, we are watching it every day. You are a senior counsel, you have seen this more than us. It is a new trend. The government has started maligning judges. It is unfortunate, the CJI said.

Dwivedi said Aman Kumar Singh, who had joined the service in 2004, resigned and became a secretary on a contract basis and his officer wife also followed the same pattern.

When the officer joined the service he had one property worth Rs 11 lakh and later became the owner of seven properties worth Rs 2.76 crore, the senior counsel for the state government said.

Another senior advocate Siddharth Dave, appearing for anti-corruption activist Uchit Sharma, assailed the high court verdict quashing the FIR as a judgement based on probability .

The allegation was amassing disproportionate assets and the inquiry would be closed automatically the moment the person concerned explained the assets, he said. "Based on surmises and your allegations we cannot allow this kind of victimization, the bench said and fixed the case for further hearing on April 18.

Dave said the probe was not based on surmises as the allegations were that the officer in question has accumulated Rs 2,500 crores.

The bench expressed amazement and said this appeal is an exaggeration.

"Don't generalise people like that. Tomorrow when the government changes and another government comes then lakhs become thousand...., the CJI said.

Quashing the FIR, the Chhattisgarh high court had said that the case was based on probabilities and "on the basis of probability any person cannot be prosecuted". It had also held that the government failed to file documents to substantiate its case.

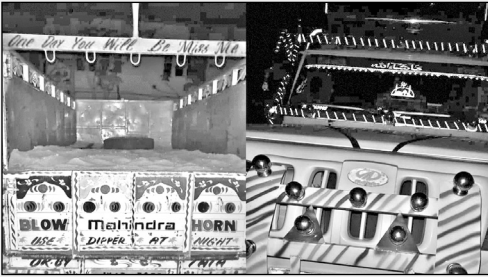
### 2 arrested, 3 vehicles seized for illegal extraction & transportation of minor minerals

BUDGAM: Acting tough against elements involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals, Police in Budgam arrested 2 persons and seized 3 vehicles.



Acting on specific information regarding illegal extraction & transportation of minerals at Sehpora Magam, a party from Police Station Magam established a checking point and during checking,



intercepted two vehicles (Tippers) bearing registration numbers JK03B-0560 & JK01T-4280 loaded with illegal extracted mineral. During search, 314 bottles of illicit liquor in total were recovered from their possession.

On this six different cases viz FIR No 59 & 56/2022 under section 48 of Excise Act was registered at Police Station R S Pura; FIR No. 32 & 31/2022 under section 48-a of Excise Act at Police Station Miran Sahib; FIR No. 60/2022 under section 48 Excise Act at Police Station Bishmah were registered and all accused were arrested, who were identified as Rohit Kumar, son of Rakesh Kumar, resident of Manipur Tehsil Mukerian, Punjab at present Taali Morh R S Pura; Harpal Singh, son of Isher Singh, resident of Simbal Camp; Keemat Ram, son of Kala Ram, resident of Kothey Chorli Tehsil Bishnah; Abhi Kumar, son of Sat Paul, resident of Chohalla and Tilak Singh, son of Sawan Singh, resident of Chal Avtara Tehsil Bishnah. The overall operation was done under the supervision of SP Hqrs Rammish Gupta.

### Two theft cases solved; 3 arrested, stolen mobile phones recovered

JAMMU: Police on Friday solved two different theft cases by arresting three accused and recovered stolen mobile phones from their possession.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Post Greater Kailash by one Arun Kumar, son of Banarsi Lal, resident of Nai Basti, Jammu stating that some unknown thieves entered his shop situated at Lower Jallo Chak and decamped with some mobile phones. On this, FIR No 33/2022 under sections 457/480 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Post Greater Kailash under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gangval Insp Joginder Singh Chib assisted by Incharge Police Post Greater Kailash SI Majid Hussain, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of CCTV footages of area, arrested accused persons from Domana who were identified as Mohd Makeem, son of Late Jameel Din and Kulbir Singh, son of Dulek Ram, both residents of Migrant Colony, Talwara Reasi.

It is pertinent to mention here that accused persons were arrested by Police Station Domana and their custody were transferred to Police Station Gangval by the order of Court. Also on their disclosure 8 mobile phones of different companies, a Laptop, 2 tabs & a power-bank were recovered. 17 stolen mobile phones were recovered by Police Post Pooni Chak (Police Station Domana) and seized under section 102 of CrPC accordingly.

Similarly, another complaint was received at Police Station Janipur regarding theft in the area. On this, FIR No 30/2022/1 under section 457/380 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Janipur under supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kahu led by SHO Janipur Insp Raj Ajaz Haider assisted by ASI Gh. Mohi Din, after putting in strenuous efforts and with the analysis of CDR/ tower location, rounded up a suspect namely Ajay Sharma, son of Kamaldeep Sharma, resident of Durga Nagar, Bantalab. On his disclosure, 15 stolen mobile phones were recovered. Further investigation of the cases is going on.
