Ladakh: India on Pak's objection to venue Srinagar and Ladakh as

NEW DELHI: India on Thursday dismissed Pakistan's objection to the hosting of G20 meetings in Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh and said these conferences are being organised across the country and it is "natural" to hold them in the two union territories too as they are its "integral and inalienable" part.

India is hosting a meeting of the G20 Tourism Working Group in Srinagar in May while a youth engagement group meeting is scheduled to take place in Leh later this month.

On Tuesday, Pakistan criticised India's decision to hold the G20 working group meeting in Srinagar and also objected to the scheduling of the Youth-20 forum in Leh.

"G20 meetings are being organised across the country. It is natural to hold them (the meetings) in the places are India's integral and inalienable part," External Affairs Ministry spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said at a media briefing.

He was responding to a question on Pakistan's objection.

"I would say that we are holding these meetings in every place. It is our natural response to have them there," Bagchi said.

In its comments, the Pakistan Foreign Ministry had said, "India's irresponsible move is the latest in a series of self-serving measures.'

The ties between India and Pakistan came under severe strain after India's warplanes pounded a Jaish-e-Mohammed terrorist training camp in Balakot in Pakistan in February 2019 in response to the Pulwama terror deteriorated after India in August 2019 announced the withdrawal of special powers of Jammu and Kashmir and the bifurcation of the state into two union territories.

come for justice, he said adding that judgement should be clear, lucid and with good reasoning. He said application of mind is important to make any decision because we are dealing with human sufferings. For a good judgement the facts of the case should be properly marshalled and the law

should be applied with clear reasons

for accepting or rejecting any claim of

Chief Justice emphasised that the judges are like architectural designers while deciding a case. Though in the criminal cases, charge-sheet is the basis for decision but the facts of the case must be taken care of while deciding the case, he added.

Sindhu Sharma, Chairperson, J&K Judicial Academy, in her special address, while quoting a Greek Philosopher said that the qualities of a judge are to hear courteously, to answer wisely, to consider soberly and to decide impartially. She emphasised that while deciding a case and writing a judgment a judge must consider the arguments and claims put forth by the parties. Further quoting Justice H.K. Opposition brought India bad name by speaking abroad against Modi: Union Minister

JAMMU: Union minister Krishan Pal Gurjar on Thursday slammed the Opposition for bringing a "bad name" to India by levelling allegations abroad against the Prime Minister and his government, saying people have full faith in Narendra Modi.
