In a statement, JKPCC Chief Spokesperson said that the government failed to regularise them and revise their wages despite high inflation of prices of all commodities but on the other hand harassing these field functionaries, by putting

so many harsh service conditions up on them, whose survival is difficult on a meagre Rs 9000/pm, which too is not paid them regularly.

The daily wagers and need based workers are supposed to work in respective beats alloted to them in the field but are being forced to mark bio matric attendance twice daily and have to visit twice to the offices to mark attendance.

The government should do justice to these poor people by engaging them as land donors as per policy prevalent at that time of getting land besides frame regularisation policy for all those who have rendered services of more than 10-15/20 years.

Modi claimed that in the last nine years since his government came to power, the definition of connectivity had been changed bringing the northeast nearer to the rest of the

country. The prime minister also witnessed a mega-Bihu dance performance - which has made it to the Guinness World Records -

where more than 11,000 dancers and drummers performed at the Indira Gandhi Athletic Stadium

"In the last nine years, we have changed the old definition of connectivity. It's now four dimensional -physical, digital, social and cultural connectivity," he said. He said that in the past few years, youth from the region "have left violence and moved on the path to peace."

"The atmosphere of mistrust is disappearing from the North East, the distance between hearts is disappearing We need to move further closer," Modi said. The PM virtually inaugurated the five railway works along with other

projects from the Indira Gandhi Athletic Stadium in Guwahati, where he is on a day-long tour. The new railway projects rolled out by him are Digaru-Lumding and Gauripur-Abhayapuri sections, while doubling of tracks between Bongaigaon and Dhup Dhara was also inaugurated. Electrification of the Raninagar-Jalpaiguri-Guwahati, Senchoa-Silghat and Senchoa-Mairabari sections was also launched by Modi. The total cost of these projects is Rs 7,300

The Prime Minister also laid the foundation stone the Palasbari-Sualkuchi bridge over the Brahmaputra river. It will be constructed at an expenditure of Rs 3.200 crore over the next 3-4 years.

Modi also virtually commissioned a methanol plant at Namrup in Dibrugarh by Assam Petrochemicals Ltd (APL) with 500 tonnes per day (TPD) capacity, constructed at an investment of Rs 1,709

"With commissioning of this methanol plant, now this chemical can be exported to neighbouring countries also, apart from catering to the domestic demand," he said.

### NCERT consulted 25 external experts, 16 CBSE teachers for syllabus rationalisation: Education Ministry changes made as part of the

NEW DELHI: The NCERT consulted 25 external experts and 16 CBSE teachers to carry out its syllabus rationalisation exercise as part of which portions on the Mughals, Mahatma Gandhi, his assassin Nathuram Godse, reference to Hindu extremists and the 2002 Guiarat riots among others were dropped from school textbooks, according to the Education Ministry.

Dropping several topics and portions from the NCERT textbooks has triggered a controversy with the Opposition blaming the Centre of "whitewashing with vengeance".

At the heart of the row is the fact that while the rationalisation exercise were notified, some of these controversial deletions weren't mentioned in them. This has led to allegations about a bid to delete these portions surreptitiously The NCERT has described

the omissions as a possible oversight but refused to undo the deletions, saying they were based on the recommendations of experts. It has also said the textbooks are anyway headed for revision in 2024 when the Curriculum National Framework kicks in.

"Aside from NCERT inhouse experts, NCERT sought the expertise of subject experts from Universities/Organisations and practising teachers in all its activities related to Research, Development, Training and Extension for wider consultation," the ministry had said in response to a written question in Lok Sabha.

Among the most contested deletions are from history and political science textbooks for which the NCERT consulted five and two exter-

nal experts respectively. "One round of consultation each was held with the experts, " the Ministry had said in its response.

For History, the five experts who were consulted are Umesh Kadam, a professor of History at the Jawaharlal Nehru University and a member Council Historical forResearch, Hind College associate professor  $\operatorname{Dr}$ (History) Archana Verma, Delhi Public School (RK Puram) teachers (Head of Department of History) Shruti Mishra, and two Delhi-based Kendriya Vidyalaya teachers Krishna Ranjan and Sunil Kumar. For the political science
