In the conversation with the students of IIMC's English Journalism, Hindi Journalism and Digital Media, Jaideep Karnik said that the importance of content will not diminish in any era. Technology keeps changing and in such a situation it is necessary to understand and learn the new technology with time. As a student of mass communication, the hold on the language should be strong. Sharing his experiences, Jaideep said that the language of the trainees is very bad. Only one or two out of ten trainees' copy is error free. We are one of the top media institutes, still the language of the students is very messed up, because the students do not pay attention to the language in their primary classes. Addressing the students online, Jaideep said that there is no need to worry about how much employment will be affected by the spread of Artificial Intelligence (AI). The expert of the subject never has to worry about employment. Those who are doing low or average work, especially clerical types, who do not want to learn

new technology with time, they must worry. When Sam Pitroda brought the computer, it was said that it would take away everyone's job but nothing like this happened. Those who knew typing went ahead. Those who knew proofreading learned editing, but those who stopped learning fell behind and disappeared. Prof. (Dr.) Anil Soumitra, Regional Director, Dr. Dilip

Kumar, Associate Professor and Dr. Vinit Utpal, Assistant Professor along with all the students of the Indian Institute of Mass Communication (IIMC) were present. India set to lead world in diabetes research: Dr Jitendra

INDORE: Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh, who is also a nationally known Diabetologist, on Saturday said that in the times to come, India is all set to lead the world in Diabetes research. Delivering inaugural address at the 3-day World Diabetes Meet organised by the coveted professional organisation "Diabetes India" here, Dr Jitendra Singh, who is also a renowned Diabetologist, said that India has a huge resource pool of patients with different manifestations of diseases at different stages and at the same time there is no dearth of calibre, capacity and acumen on the part of our researchers. It is therefore the right time to generate as much Indian data as possible because the goal should be to develop Indian treatment regimens for Indian patients, Indian solutions for Indian problems. He said this is also important because the Indian phenotype is different from the westerners and the genetic preponderance is also quite different. As a result, the pathogenesis and progress of Type 2 diabetes mellitus and other related metabolic disorders is not the same as in the western populations, he added. Citing research evidence, Dr Jitendra said it has now been proven beyond doubt that Indian origin diaspora living in European countries for several generations still continue to have higher preponderance to develop Type 2 diabetes mellitus even though they were no longer living in India and the environmental conditions they are living in is different. Referring to some of the important risk factors prevalent in Indians, Dr Singh said that our central obesity profile is also different from others. For example, in India, prevalence of central obesity is high and almost equal in both males and females whereas in the western population, the individual may be apparently looking obese but has general visceral fat, he said. Referring to Prime Minister Modi's support to indigenous medical research, Dr Jitendra Singh said that time has come to integrate the traditional Indian knowledge with the modern scientific inferences and also to seek a synergy of different systems of medicine including Ayurveda, Yoga and Naturopathy for optimum and maximum benefits in the control and prevention of diabetes. Dr Jitendra concluded by saying that prevention of diabetes is not only our duty towards healthcare but also our duty towards nation building because this is a country with 70% population below the age of 40 and the youth of today are going to be the prime citizens of India@2047. We cannot afford to let their energy go waste in incapacitating complications occurring as a result of Type 2 diabetes and other related disorders.
